Happy New Year! With winter finally here, your Parish Council is continuing to work on behalf of the village of East Hanney. In December the Council heard that the Vale of White Horse District Council Local Plan would undergo its second stage of inspection in February 2016. Along with other interested parties, the Parish Council was invited to request a place for an attendee at the inspection hearing and to present a written submission to the Inspector. This submission was drafted over the festive break and submitted in early January. This and submissions from other interested parties are available to read on the VWHDC website Local Plan Examination pages (http://www.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/services-and-advice/planning-and-building/planning-policy/ new-local-plan-2031/vale-white-horse-local), East Hanney's position will be considered under 'Matter 8 - Strategy for Abingdon- on-Thames and Oxford Fringe Sub Area' on the 4th February at the Beacon in Wantage.

Following the spate of wet weather through the latter part of December, the Berry Lane to iron bridge footpath once again turned very muddy. The Parish Council formed a working party and with the help of some parishioners re-covered the surface with gravel. Thanks to those that helped.

The Council sponsored 'Speedwatch' initiative is now off the ground and the volunteers have been trained in using the equipment, so look out for these groups with the speed-guns as you travel around the village. Organised by Hanney Chapel for more information ring Mark Fisher on 867105 **'The Bathing Place'** By Bob Wilson In 1896 a specially appointed committee resolved to provide a "Bathing Place" between the Iron Bridge and Lower Mill. Access was from Bath Lane (now Snuggs Lane) - the expenses to be split between East and West Hanney Parishes. A sturdy corrugated iron structure about "12 yards square" was built with a west facing veranda and modest changing facilities. The stream was widened with a good level concrete base. The stream depth was controlled when required by the Miller who ensured there was sufficient water for swimming. It was popular with children after school as well as being great for social gatherings. In 1904 complaints were received by the Parish of "indecencies occurring at the Bathing Place". The Council repudiated any responsibility! In the 1920s enthusiasm waned as the stream silted up. The final demise occurred in the late 1940s after a huge storm. It was dismantled and the materials sold to parishioners. If you look carefully you can still see evidence of the site now covered by brambles.

West Hanney Parish Council

Following the application by Neil Walker for 16 houses along School Road a special meeting was held in the church on Tuesday 19th January which gave residents the opportunity to express their concerns and discuss the plans with councillors.

As residents will be aware from earlier Hanney News editions, Sweetcroft Homes had been in discussion with us over the development of 'The Old Orchard' adjoining the Church Farm site. We did not wish to see this field overdeveloped and had agreed that five quality homes would be suitable for that area of the village with its close proximity to the Church. Consequently it had been agreed that Sweetcroft would gift the village 7.5 acres of land adjoining the community woodland which we planned to retain as a wildlife meadow, with access from, and to, the woodland area. Furthermore we had negotiated with Sweetcroft a legal agreement which would effectively have given us control over future use of the adjoining field alongside School Road. This would have safeguarded the field against future development.

All that has now been put at risk by planning officers at the Vale who have made it clear that they will require 40% of the proposed development to be low cost and on site. That was perhaps understandable, but the planning officers have also said they would prefer to see a more in depth and rounded off layout in this area, with some additional houses behind the frontage.

This means that Sweetcroft have withdrawn their application for the 5 detached houses and are looking to resubmit an application for possibly18 units! Yes 18! At the moment it looks as if this will mean a new access and 5 units along the School Road frontage with the development reaching right back to the natural boundary hedge with The Old Orchard.

Including the new Elderberry Close development that means, should these applications be successful, and together with what is being built at the moment, we will have around 60 new properties in our village. In our opinion this is an unacceptable increase in a small rural village with very limited infrastructure, no bus services, and narrow approach roads.

Thames Water tells us that they have solved the problem of fluctuating water pressures in the village. Apparently an automatic supply and demand valve at the eastern end of the villages had failed.

Wantage Leisure Centre now boasts a fully refurbished gym following a £127,000 upgrade. New facilities include the latest state-of-the-art Technogym 'Excite' equipment that comprises treadmills, recline bikes, crossovers and synchro machines offering a full cardiovascular workout. The centre also now has a newly revamped, air conditioned fitness studio. The improvements were funded by Vale of the White Horse District Council and GLL, which operates Better leisure centres, and are part of an ongoing programme to upgrade facilities across the district.
