East Hanney Parish Council

Parishioners, to bring you up to date on the inspection of the Vale of White Horse Local Plan (2031) phase 1, on the 4th February. The Parish Council was represented at a round table discussion lead by the Inspector and including all interested parties. In the opinion of the representatives of the PC, the Inspector appears to be even-handed and fair and gives the impression that he is working towards the 'right' plan for the district, rather than 'any' plan. It was clear he had picked up on a number of deficiencies in the Vale's Local Plan and brought this to their attention. The Inspector also considered the 'size' of the village as defined by the Vale. The Inspector planned to visit the village to inspect the sites that formed part of the discussion, the sites to the south and the east of the village.

Following the wet weather, Cow Lane to the northern end of the village near Ploughlev Farm has become very muddy. The Clerk has brought this to the attention of the relevant department at the County Council. the countryside Access Team.

The Council sponsored 'Speedwatch' initiative is now off the ground and the volunteers have been trained in using the equipment. The results of the first sessions have been submitted to the local policing team in Faringdon. Should you wish to volunteer, it is not too late. Please contact the Clerk to express your desire to be involved

The Parish Council has started to gather evidence for its Neighbourhood Plan, that allows communities like ours to shape development in the parish. This plan and the policies contained within would, once adopted, become part of the Local Plan and be used in the determination of planning applications. As an essential part of the process, the Parish Council is planning to hold a number of community engagement and information events. The first of these is planned to be in mid to late April and will be in the Hanney War Memorial Hall - the exact date to be confirmed.
