A great deal of litter and other rubbish was collected and duly removed by Biffa. However, the litter pickers reported that many dog-poo bags were collected around the playing field. It is great that dog-owners and walkers pick the poo up and bag it but unfortunately the bags are then discarded along the field edges rather than being put in the bins provided around the field. More amazingly, used dog-poo bags were found in the hedgerow and ditch along Summertown, these must have been flung from a vehicle window! Please could all dog-owners and walkers use the provided dog waste bins and not hedgerows and field edges. These bins are explicitly provided for the purpose of discarding dog waste. Any other public waste bin can also be used to deposit bagged dog waste. Otherwise this waste should be taken home and placed in the domestic waste bins that are provided to you by the Vale.



West Hanney Parish Council

The Parish Council was devastated to learn of the tragic death of 9 year old Bonnie Armitage from North Green, and we offer our most sincere condolences to her family. We know that this tragedy has affected the whole village and left us all in shock and sadness.

Subsequent to our meeting with Matthew Barber. The Vale Planning Officers and Sweetcroft Homes, two revised applications have now been submitted for new houses on 'The Old Orchard' adjoining Church Farm, One is for 8 properties, the other for 11. The proposed developments do not now extend beyond the existing natural boundary of the Orchard into the field fronting School Road, and have been reduced from the previous plans for 18 properties. Full details can be found on the Vale website under Application Nos: P16/V0635/FUL and P16/V0637/FUL.

A revised application was also submitted for 15 houses off School Road, a reduction of 1 from the original application.. We hope as many people wrote and emailed objections to these amended plans as they did for the original submission. Details under P15A/ V2887/FUL

We also hope that villagers found time to support our friends in East Hanney by objecting to the two appeals that were submitted for over 400 houses in total.

We are currently exploring the pros and cons of taking over some of the responsibilities currently held by Oxfordshire County Council, such as grass cutting etc. Grants are available but we need to calculate whether these offer a viable proposition. We will report on our findings soon.

The Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 3rd May at 7pm at St. James the Great, followed at 7.30pm by our normal scheduled meeting. All residents are welcome.

Dear Friends

I looked down at my feet and there on the stone floor a couple of inches away was a very still butterfly. Its wings were folded up and it may well have been dead. I was in church on Good Friday just after the passage about Jesus being laid in the tomb had been read when I noticed this little insect.

I mentioned the butterfly in the following meditative prayer contrasting this dead looking creature that might suddenly rise and fly, with the burial of Christ and the hope of His resurrection.

We then stood to sing the hymn "Were you there when they crucified my Lord? - were you there when they laid him in the tomb?" and suddenly a red admiral butterfly started fluttering and flying in front of the stained glass windows which included scenes of Jesus' death and resurrection.

It has been my experience to discover butterflies (particularly red admirals) in every church I have ministered in - especially during the summer months but even during one December wedding a butterfly appeared. I think they may be attracted by the church flowers but there could be a deeper reason.

I don't know why the *Vanessa Atalanta* (to give it its scientific name) is called **red admiral** unless it is because it's distinctive red stripe on a black background is similar to the golden braid on admiral's uniform - perhaps some of our readers might let me know? - but I do know that despite not being mentioned in the Bible the butterfly has strong spiritual symbolism.

Some people link butterflies with angels, others like to use the stages of metamorphosis from Caterpillar, Chrysalis and then fully grown butterfly to teach about the burial and resurrection of Christ.

Many pop songs link butterflies with love - Dolly Parton wrote — "Love is like a butterfly as soft and gentle as a sigh". Johnny Mathis sang about "the bright elusive butterfly of love". I gave my wife Sally, a butterfly brooch on our honeymoon with a poem about my love for her.

The beauty and gentle fluttering of butterflies is very peaceful. So may I suggest the next time you see a beautiful butterfly you take time to pray or be grateful or even to reflect on the transforming power of God's love.



Hanney lost one of its true characters when Michael Lamble passed away on 23rd March, aged 81.
