

East Hanney Parish Council

You will have spotted the hi-vis clad volunteers with Speedwatch cameras over the last few months at prominent sites in the village, on the A338 and outside the school. This initiative is supported by Thames Valley Police and repeat offenders contacted directly by TVP. The Council is pleased to hear the proportion of speeding vehicles declined recently and it is hoped that the Speedwatch Initiative is having a positive affect on drivers' behavior. Staving with traffic, residents have reported that drivers leaving the side roads off Alfred's Place are not always checking that their path is clear by looking both ways, the Council reminds all drivers in East Hanney that with few footpaths it is essential that drivers are vigilant to avoid accidents.

Over recent years, alongside the increase in housing and population, there has been a marked rise in activities that the Council is required to be involved with. In response, the Vale's democratic services department is reviewing the number of councillors that the village may elect. This is welcome, as with the anticipated further devolution of services from both District and County Councils it is a very interesting time for the village. More help is welcome and the Council acknowledges that there has been greater involvement from the community in matters recently. The Council welcomes attendance at its scheduled meetings and community involvement in projects, particularly if people are able to help support villagewide initiatives, such as public art installation, the Neighbourhood Plan, Speedwatch, and the expansion of amenity spaces and associated regula-

tions. The Council would be interested to hear from anyone who would like to become more involved, for a specific matter that may be of concern or for a wider project.

Following the latest visit by travelers to the playing fields, the Council contracted specialists to clean up the field at a cost of £1689.00, representing over 10% of precept income for 2016-17. The Council cannot sustain this level of spending and it is hoped that the security measures in place will ensure that unwanted incursions are a thing of the past. The measures were reviewed at the Council's last meeting and it will be reviewing the regulations for playing field use at its November meeting.

On the subject of waste, Biffa and the District Council have implemented stricter rules about what can be put in each bin and will suspend collections if they consider a household to be 'repeat offenders'. When asked what they could do about others putting the 'wrong' waste in a household's bins, the District Council advised that bin locks could be purchased and the bin left unlocked on collection day. These locks are c£20 each and can be purchased online. The Parish Council has asked that the local ward Councillor investigate this issue.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

Now that Autumn has really arrived can we echo the request of the Hanneys Flood Group and ask all residents with ditches at their frontages, whether open or piped, to ensure that they are free of any accumulations of leaves, debris or any items that may impact on the flow of water should we get a lengthy spell of wet weather. The ditch along Winter Lane is especially important as that handles most of the water draining from the village into the Childrey Brook and eventually of course to the River Ock.

Unfortunately the never ending saga of dog poo is rearing its ugly head again with residents complaining about owners who do not clean up after their dogs. The Community Woodland is a particular worry as it is used by school children. It has been noted that 'commercial' dog walkers coming from outside the Hanneys are prone to ignoring their dog's 'left behinds'. If you see such disregard for our village's wonderful woodland please remind them to clean up after their charges.

Motorcycles have also been accessing the woodland causing damage to the rides, apparently through the 'kissing' gates by lifting their bike vertically onto its back wheel to manoeuvre through. Your parish council will be putting up 'Pedestrians Only' signs, so if you do come across a rider please ask them to leave the area immediately or the police will be called.

More daffodil bulbs have been purchased and are being planted around the village to hopefully bring some joyful colour in the spring.

Substantial money has been spent in an attempt to stop unauthorised vehicles parking on the sports field but unbelievably drivers are deciding to risk damaging their cars by manoeuvring between the new wooden posts rather than walk a few metres! More posts will now have to be bought and fitted to narrow the gaps even further.

Volunteers are still desperately needed to help with the Speedwatch initiative. If you have an hour or two to spare just once a month or even less then please help us control speeding in the villages. Retired residents are ideal due to the daytime operation. Dear Friends

At the breakfast table, I was reading out to my family the "wisdom" of a cereal packet. It was telling us about **inner strength**, which helps us face challenges, and gives us the courage to keep going. It was implying that if you ate their particular brand of cereal you would gain inner strength — which, if you read the small print, the nutrients contributed to reduction in tiredness and the maintenance of normal bones.

All this prompted a lot of comment and discussion, which is unusual for so early in the morning in our household. Not least that inner strength was considered by the advertisers a topic that people would be interested in but mainly that there was a glaring omission. If you are seriously writing about inner strength then I believe you do need to mention God.

It reminded me of when I was training recruits, and part of my role as a Chaplain was to help the soldiers explore strength. For not only did they need to become physically strong, they also required an inner resource which involved their mind and emotion and, we would add as Christian Chaplains, the spiritual nature of their lives. So we tried to explain that there is a quality that builds resolve, courage and resilience but that is not reliant on our own resources rather comes from elsewhere. The best way I found to describe this spiritual strength was "more than". More than we have, more than we can produce, more than we are; and for me that "more than" is the LORD.

The fact that some military personnel are being taken to court for alleged misconduct and mistreatment of civilians in the chaos of conflict and are receiving little or no support from the authorities means that they will still need to find a great deal of inner strength to cope with such injustice.

At this time of Remembrance it is important we remember those who gave up their lives but also those who gave up their limbs and are living with seriously damaged bodies, as well as those who are affected by conflict emotionally, mentally and through injustice. Such vulnerable men and women need inner strength and it is vital that such organisations as the Royal British Legion use their funds for welfare purposes. It is also good that more charities are forming to give this much-needed assistance.

The wonderful thing about the LORD God is that he offers help and strength to everyone who calls on Him. As the vulnerable disabled once called out *Jesus Master have mercy on us* because they recognised he offered a strength more than they could manage themselves, so we can all *Look to the Lord and his strength*, as Psalm 105 v 4 says.

If you pause to remember our fallen sailors, soldiers and airmen also remember that

God offers us inner strength. God bless.
