

East Hanney Parish Council

As you will no doubt have read already in this edition of Hanney News, the new basket swing has been installed in the playground area behind the War Memorial Hall. This work was part-funded by East Hanney PC and part funded with a grant from the Vale of White Horse district council Capital Grants scheme.

Whilst on the subject of the playground, it was brought to the PC's attention that water was pooling in the slide. The PC sought advice from the supplier that installed the large tower and slide equipment and it appears to be a result of young people climbing up the outside of the tube slide, so deforming the joints. The 7th December 2016 and 4th January Council sought quotations to resolve this by installing a support leg in place so it stops happening. The PC considered this at their meeting in November 2016 and concluded that at over £1000 plus VAT. the cost was prohibitive.

At the November meeting, the PC also discussed issues with dog fouling and the associated rules and regulation for the playing fields. The meeting was well attended and many local residents of both East and West Hanney petitioned the PC to change the rules. The Council considered the rules necessary to lessen the incidents of dog fouling on the playing fields and resolved to work with a small group of villagers to find solutions. One suggestion was an increased number of dog waste bins. This is being pursued by Cllr Paul Aram, should you have a suggestion of where a dog waste bin may be sited so it helps with the disposal of dog waste, please contact him directly, or the Clerk on

the details below.

Last edition, the PC reported that it had asked our Ward Councillor, Matt Barber to investigate the issue of the new strict waste disposal guidelines from the district council and Biffa. It awaits a reply and will publicise it as soon as one is heard.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

The next meeting dates are 2017.

We have been in contact with Scottish & Southern Electricity concerning the new supply pole which has been erected on parish land outside the Church Farm development. We believe the stabilisers to this pole are in a very dangerous position right on the edge of the footpath and we have expressed our concerns over the danger to pedestrians who could trip over these steel cables, especially on dark winter nights, SSE have promised to look at the situation.

Several residents have contacted us about the sign warning of a bend which fell, or was knocked, down on the Green recently. This was reported to Oxfordshire County Council Highways on the 13th October. The response received was 'we will repair this within our normal timescale'. What that timescale is we do not know but at the time of going to press on the 15th November five weeks have passed.

On behalf of the district council Biffa have been cleaning our pavements recently which is very welcome. We are however also concerned at the build up of silt and debris on the road edges around the village. We have pointed out that this build up is blocking drainage gullies which could well lead to road flooding after heavy rain. Matthew Barber will be talking to Oxfordshire County Council, who are the responsible body, on our behalf.





The Hanney Mute Swans

These swans have nested along the stream or on Dandridge's Mill lake for about 20 years. Adult swans mate for life and each year they lay up to seven eggs, but usually only two or three cygnets reach maturity. The adults are very protective of their young (as we all know) but come October they up and go, leaving the cygnets to fend for themselves. Swans are heavy birds, and need a long stretch of water to take off! Our cygnets have difficulties here: Letcombe Brooke is narrow, windy and shallow, with obstacles such as the Iron Bridge. This year the two remaining fully grown cygnets were to be seen wandering down the road, looking for some clear open water so that they could take off and follow their parents. Luckily for them, there is a two-man charity "Swan Life Line" which specialises in rescuing swans in the autumn. These

Tuesday 1st November by Miriam Vivian and duly arrived with all the equipment needed to catch our two cygnets. They were quickly caught, fed with grain and bread, wrapped up and driven to a lake near Eton to join some 20 cygnets already rescued, from whence they will fly to find their own territory. They probably won't return to Hanney, but our two adults will we hope continue to grace Letcombe Brook for many years to come.

It's sad to loose the swans in the autumn, but we'll look forward to welcoming them back in the spring.

In the villages of East and West Hanney, only about 90 residents have taken advantage of the excellent information

systems available from the police. There is the 'Alert' system which sends warnings and information about criminal activities. These can be received by email or phone. Recent incidents include thefts from parked cars, particularly at local 'beauty spots'. Also there has been theft of lead from church roofs, including Hanney church, attempted break-ins, and vehicles and trailers have been stolen. Anti-social behaviour has also been a concern in Hanney, However - many residents don't realise that there is also an additional crime warning system, which sends texts to resident's mobile phones. These text messages usually give information about crime that is suspected to be happening very locally at that time, often hare coursing or poaching, and ask people to keep a look-out and immediately report any sightings. In the past, such response from Hanney residents has resulted in criminals being arrested.

Neighbourhood Watch encourages its members to apply to receive these useful reports from the police. Whilst Neighbourhood Watch is not controlled by the police, and each group independently tailors its activities to the neighbourhood and membership, it has a close working partnership with the police, who appreciate the support that members can give them.

E & W Hanney have 30 Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators (the best coverage of

any village in the Vale), but as Coordinators usually support about 10 neighbouring members, there are still areas without any neighbourhood watch coverage. Nowadays Coordinators don't have so much to do, as they can enrol their members onto the Alert and texting systems, and therefore have no need to pass on the police warning messages. However, it is also important that members look out for each other. particularly the elderly or disadvantaged. and warn neighbours of anything suspicious. There should also be no hesitation to ring the police on 101 about any suspicious activity, or 999 if you think a crime may be being committed.
