Dear Editor

Having noticed the removal of large, mature chestnut trees and sections of hedgerow on the boundary of the Bovis development site in Summertown, I wrote to Adrian Butler, the main contact for this site in the Vale's planning office. I wanted to find out whether Bovis had permission for this work.

This is the reply that quickly came back: "I visited the site on Tuesday and saw the hedge and tree removal in the location of the site access and hedge removal in the south east corner of the site at the Summertown/A338 junction. Removal of the sections of hedge and felling does not constitute development. The trees are not protected by a preservation order and are outside the conservation area. I do not consider a breach of any of the conditions associated with the outline permission has taken place, as development has not commenced on site and there is no approved detailed scheme to commence."

This disappointing but not surprising answer got me wondering how trees acquired a preservation order and who could apply. So, I went to the relevant web site: <u>https://www.gov.uk/</u> guidance/tree-preservation-orders-and-

To quote from this site: "Authorities can either initiate this process themselves or in response to a request made by any other party. When granting planning permission, authorities have a duty to ensure, whenever appropriate, that planning conditions are used to provide for tree preservation and planting. Orders should be made in respect of trees where it appears necessary in connection with the grant of permission.""Orders should be used to protect selected trees and woodlands if their removal would have a significant negative impact on the local environment and its enjoyment by the public. To summarise, it seems as though anvone can ask a Local Authority to consider making a tree preservation order, though the many conditions that apply before give lots of wriggle room to avoid granting one. Obviously, the planning authority considered that the loss of any of the trees in connection with the proposed Boyis development won't have a significant negative impact on our environment or it's enjoyment. I beg to differ on this, having for many vears thoroughly enjoyed the sight of those statuesque trees on my approach to the village. Gill Parry
