East Hanney Parish Council

In response to many people asking when Council are currently considering what the skip will be in Hanney. I would like to mention that the dates for the coming vear (to next March) are on the noticeboard by the shop and on the PC's website. The rule of thumb is the skip is here on the 2nd Tuesday of the month. 'odd' months at Snuggs Lane and 'even' months at the Hall. It arrives about 4.30pm and is usually full by 6.30! Residents are reminded though, that the skips are 'level fill' only. Should there be no space in the skip, please do not keep piling your items on top of the rest, they will be taken out by the driver and left next to where the skip was.

The Parish's Neighbourhood Plan is gathering speed. The analysis of the survey done over Christmas has been carried out and the steering group is finalizing its policies. The aim is to have the Plan completed before the Vale's Local Plan is completed in the late autumn.

As I am sure you are aware, the Parish Council is to lease the field to the North of the plaving fields. The exact use of 'Kings Leases', as it will be known, has not vet been finalised but it will include amenity space. The change of use has been applied for and the Council hopes to have all the legal work completed soon. In the meantime, there will be some work undertaken to prepare the field for its change of use, which will include the use of a herbicide to make the preparation of a suitable seedbed more effective.

The bridge at the end of Halls Lane is in a bad state of repair and the County

works can be undertaken to make the crossing safe. This may mean the bridge is closed for a time and the Council will keep you updated via the news page of its website and through this newsletter.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance





Rubbish dumped on private land is the responsibility of the landowner. Some words of wisdom from Paul Holland the Environmental Protection Manager at Vale of White Horse District Council - "Bv law anvone being paid to transport waste must be reaistered to do so and have a record of what the rubbish is and where they've taken it. He continues - and I never realised this hit! - "If you book a waste collection vou also have a legal responsibility for checking that it's taking place legally. so please double check any references. and ask to see documentation. before vou hand any money over."

East Hanney Parish Council arrange a regular skip for the benefit of Hanney villagers - see their article on page 6 but just recently it has been overfilled, resulting in a very unpleasant pile of rubbish being left behind once the skip has been removed. So please, if you turn up with a load of rubbish and the skip is already full, then sorry, but some folk got there before you did, and you'll need to dispose of your rubbish elsewhere.

Some good news to finish...a couple of successful prosecutions for fly-tipping have recently been made, resulting in fines of several thousand pounds.

In view of the fact that we as consumers are expected to check that the waste disposal company are bona fide, it's worth noting that one of the companies fined had disposed of a bath, toilet and sink amongst other things, all for just a £30 charge to the customer. That's stupidly cheap of course...so if it seems too good to be true, it probably is. Caveat emptor and all that! (That's twice I've used a Latin phrase in this one article. What a cultured magazine it is that you your are reading.)

Letter
