The saga of the Poughley Farm

bridge... closed to all vehicles on 31st May by Oxfordshire County Council. (OCC). They own it, though have only just realised this, hence why they have never done any inspections or maintenance work on it before!

The report provided by the engineers whom we here at HNGI commissioned. advises that the closure is quite unnecessary.

I forwarded their report to East Hanney PC. OCC. our MP. the Vale DC . and our local County Councillor. (Only our MP didn't reply.)

OCC engineers responded by saying they disagreed with the findings and would not be acting upon them. The bridge is to remain closed. (One of the OCC tests stated that the bridge could bear no weight at all! A second indicated 3 tons quite a difference.)

At the time of closure. OCC could offer no dates when repair work would be done, or indeed if the funds were available anyway. Since then, in large part I believe due to the pressure being put on it by various folk. OCC are now getting their act together. An email from

them states that a new temporary vehicle access (via Cow Lane) will be constructed, with work due to be completed by 7th Aug. They also claim that 'the design process for replacement / repair of the bridge is underway and is being treated with high priority. At the current time however, no accurate timescale for completion can be provided.'

I remain to be convinced that the closure is necessary, and is no more than vet another example in these 'Elf and Safety' times in which we live, of a knee-ierk, backside-covering reaction. where common sense and experience are ignored. That said, if as you read this, the new road is nearing completion. then I'm happy to give credit to OCC. I'll keep you posted.



Talking of Ed Vaizev our MP, I do not usually include his pearls, but his latest newsletter contains info on two items that will be of particular interest. Over to you Ed....

'With regards to the proposed closure of Steventon Bridge. I have met with Network Rail numerous times to discuss the potential disruption this will cause. I have examined the alternative options, but at present, Network Rail believe there is no alternative to replacing the bridge.

If the bridge does close, I would want to see disruption kept to a minimum, and the *closure to be as short as possible.* (...don't think you'll find much disagreement there Ed!)

The next great challenge will be the reservoir. I look forward to working with GARD on this, as I did successfully some years ago, when we secured a public enquiry which threw the proposal out.'

East Hanney Parish Council

To update you all on the activities regarding Halls Lane Bridge, the Parish Council has heard from the County Council that alternative access arrangements for Poughley Farm will be put in place, along Cow Lane from the access by St James School. At its August meeting, the Parish Council will be discussing the issue in detail.

Following a meeting with the Parish Council, Dews Meadow developer Bovis Homes has engaged a specialist firm of architects to design any future proposed development. The firm 'Origin3' will design and plan a proposed development more in keeping with the expectations of the Parish and District Councils and fitting the character of the village. The Parish Council has met with this firm to clearly state its expectations and intends to meet with them again in the next few weeks to have sight of the initial plans.

You will have seen the initial plans for the layout of 'Kings Leases', the field to the north of the playing field. Should you have any comments, please send them to the Clerk or contact a member of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council is in the final stages of arranging replacements for the lights on Brookside. The new lights will be shorter (apart from the one by the post box) and cast their light downwards. Similarly, the Council is in the final stages of taking possession of the green space in front of the new homes on Ebbs Lane. Once acquired from the developer, the space will be maintained as a 'green' and the Council will undertake to dedicate it as a 'Centenary Field' to commemorate those from the village that served and fell in the Great War.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

The next meeting dates are 2nd August and 6th September 2017.

Due to the high level of concern amongst few weeks, so the new trucks due in the residents over the latest planning applications for possibly 90 more houses Thank you to the many residents who in our small village a meeting was held in the Church on Tuesday 18th July to discuss the issue. The relevant reference numbers are, P17/V1368/FUL for the 35 Riperian Owners Responsibility. All houses on School Road and P17/V1823/ O for possibly 56 houses at Townsend. You can then click on the orange 'Comment Now' box. Oxfordshire County Council has announced that following a strong

campaign by residents all the existing seven recycling centres in the area will remain open. Surely a common sense and welcome decision!

Remaining with waste, the Vale's contractors. Biffa, are investing £6.5 million pounds in a fleet of new collection vehicles. The current fleet. now over seven years old, and used to collect from 115.000 households across the Vale, is starting to show its age by breaking down, causing missed collections. We have actually experienced this in the Hanneys over the past

Autumn will be most welcome responded to our request to keep their hedging trimmed back from footpaths. The action will have been much appreciated by those less able amongst 115

In a similar vein can we remind all homeowners who have a ditch outside their properties that it is their responsibility to keep this free flowing whether or not it is piped. This is known as rubbish, overgrowing grass and weeds should be removed to ensure that during times of heavy rain water can flow freely through and eventually out of the village. For further information contact any member of the flood group, parish council or look at the Environment Agency's 'Living on the edge' at www.gov.uk

This is especially important on the turn out onto the A338 where sometimes notices have been placed on the sign post blocking driver's views of traffic coming from Wantage.

SUPPORT YOUR VILLAGE PUBS

The Plough at West Hanney is a precious resource worth keeping

Every week over 20 pubs close in Britain. It is particularly difficult when this closure happens to a village pub because it feels like the life is sucked out of the community.

The fixed costs of running a pub and the increasing cost of staff, coupled with a high rate of VAT, means that every day, on average, every pub must take not less than £800 through the till. We have now decided that the priority for The Plough is to find the right tenants. We know from the financial figures that the right couple can make a success of it and have a very nice life in our beautiful community, living above the pub in spacious accommodation.

We also know that an experienced couple, one a chef and the other a sociable front of house, would make the ideal tenants. For any pub to be successful it has to have a strong and regularly changing food offering so that eating there is something to look forward to. Finally, of course, it is essential that we, as Hanney villagers, turn out regularly to support the tenants and our local pub. Some villagers rarely if ever go to the pub but would rue the day that it was no longer there.

Until we find these ideal tenants, we are going to try and run the pub on a community model. That means that with some paid assistance, we are going to use volunteers. So if you want to keep your pub, and remember the effect on house valuations if it ceases to exist, why not volunteer for a few hours a week to help with the various jobs. Yes we need some people to help in the kitchen or behind the bar, but we also need to make sure that everything is clean, neat and tidy too.

We will be embarking on a work programme in September to stabilise the roof and do some essential repairs to the upper storey brickwork. Between now and then, we must all pull together as a community to help keep The Plough at West Hanney open and staying at the social heart of the village.
