A reminder that Oxfordshire County Council are planning to carry out road stability works on Botney Lane (Denchworth Road) in September. The purpose of the works is to build retaining walls to stop the road collapsing into the Childrey Brook. The eagle eved amongst you have already noticed where the banks have eroded on the edge of the highway. The original idea was to carry out the work at the same time as the road was resurfaced last year, but it was found that European protected Water Voles are back in the brook and Natural England had to be advised and have since carried out ecological surveys and mitigation action plans.

The exact date of the works is yet to be decided but September 18th has been pencilled in as a possible start date. The construction programme will be split in two sections. Section 1 will consist of site clearance and water vole mitigation which will be carried out under temporary two way signals for an approximate duration of two weeks. Section 2 will consist of the construction of the retaining walls which will be carried out under a road closure order for around four weeks. The diversion for way we could fund a bus service to the closure will be Winter Lane. Southmoor, Charney Bassett, Northmead the A1 service previous provided is Lane and vice versa.

The Vale's refuse contractors have advised that it is no longer necessary to use special compostable bags in our food waste containers. Any plastic bag, or newspaper wrapping or none at all is now acceptable.

A big thank you and well done to both East and West Hanney residents who have responded in numbers against the

two speculative and unwanted development applications in the village. At the time of going to print there were over 60 objections to each application. As many of you pointed out, there were so many inaccuracies and distortions of the truth in each proposal that it is difficult to see how they could possibly succeed.

Due to funding cuts Oxfordshire County Council now rarely attend to roadside verges or pavements, so many parts of the village are looking untidy and overgrown with weeds. Some residents have taken matters into their own hands and for this we are grateful. Your PC has recently tried to eradicate them with an application of weed killer. Hopefully the results will become obvious. A very big thank you to Chris Green and Jackie Whyte who actually mowed a long length of the School Road bank themselves. What a wonderful service to our village. We will also be carrying out our annual daffodil planting session in the next month or so. Any volunteer planters would be most welcome. Please contact any councillor or our clerk if you can help.

We are currently looking again at any Grove and Wantage as we realise that sorely missed. We will keep residents informed.

Apart from the hideous appearance of the road **block** at the Halls Lane Bridge, something else struck me. Why hadn't Oxfordshire County



Council used posts like these above? (All are in East Hanney and blend in nicely vou'll probably recognise some of them.) I emailed OCC, asking that very question and enquiring as to what the cost had been of the huge blocks they did use. including of course, the expense of a large lorry with heavy lifting gear needed to install them. Here's their response:

'The concrete blocks used for the closure are items we keep in stock for such purposes and are consistently reused. They were installed by our in-house team, so in terms of efficiency they are a very cost-effective solution. In order to install pillars as you suggest would have involved around works and external sourcing, not to mention being single-use, so would have been much more expensive. Furthermore, my experience of these is that they do not stand up well to vandalism or abuse. I appreciate that the blocks are not as kind on the eve, but are necessary to prevent illegal use of the bridge and to prevent the very real implications for surrounding properties should the bridge fail.

I must say I saw no evidence of vandalism or abuse on any of the posts I photographed - some of which have been in place for quite a while - and to say that the blocks are 'not as kind on the eve' is something of an understatement, but it looks as if we're stuck with them, so fingers crossed for that Turner Prize in 2018! Just as an aside, the poor chap at OCC tasked with defending these monstrosities is one James Blockley, an appropriate name methinks when one sees the method chosen to block the bridge. Somewhat less appropriate perhaps is young James' job title - 'Countryside Access Team Leader', Er, ves, maybe, (My italics)
