### Someone asked me recently

whether I have an unhealthy interest in bridges. I denied it, but forgive me for two more bridge-related stories this month. The first concerns the Halls Lane bridge to Poughley Farm, I had a minor rant last month about the grotesque blocks that Oxfordshire County Council have used to stop vehicular access to the bridge. I hinted that the expense was also something I was concerned about and I printed OCC's response to my query. They have since expanded their response, and in a spirit of fairness. I would like to tell you that lames Blockley, the OCC gent, offered a fully detailed account of why the method used was the cheapest and best available to the OCC. I'll not bore you with the details and I'm no expert on local authority finance, but I'm prepared to take his word for it. I still maintain it's a hideous eve-sore and I will be nominating it for a Turner prize next year.

Though not in our village, the Steventon road bridge is regularly used by many of us. Journeys to Milton Park. Didcot. including the station, and the A34 south would be a good deal less easy were Network Rail allowed to knock it down. Sadly that is their intention, as they need to build a new one just an teensy weensy bit taller in order to be able to run electricity cables through it. The bridge - a listed structure - is currently high enough to accommodate the trains and their pantographs - that's the bit on the roof of the train that picks up the electricity from the overhead cables - but not the cables themselves. The bridge does need some maintenance work, but demolition and the construction of a new one would close the road



for a long time...estimates vary from 6 months up to one year. Network Rail have just announced that they will not now demolish the bridge until at least 2019. This is not an altruistic gesture on their part: more I suspect, that they've broken open the piggy bank and found that they are in debt to the tune of  $\pounds 46.3$ billion, ves... billion(!) (figure according to Private Eve. issue 1451) so there's not much spare dosh slopping round to spend on projects such as this. Perhaps between now and 2019, some bright spark (geddit?) will come up with a way of solving the problem. That said, I should add that there are wise folk in our community who argue that if the job ultimately needs to be done, the sooner we get on with it the better, since with an ever increasing population in this area, the longer it's delayed, the more disruptive it will eventually be. 'Bring back Thomas' we say here at Hanney News Global International.



# **East Hanney Parish Council**

You will have noticed that the lights on Brookside have been replaced. The Parish Council has invested in new low energy LED lamps to help people see along the path by the Hall. Rather than the two tall lamps that are obscured by the trees, two bollard style lamps have been installed to ensure the best light spread. Whilst on the subject of the path along Brookside to the iron bridge, the County Council has done a temporary repair where tree roots have broken through. The path remains uneven but the County hopes that it will be able to relay the path in the future without damaging the trees, which are protected. The Parish Council has met with Origin3. the architects engaged by Bovis to prepare the proposed development for Dews Meadow (known to the Vale as 'the is proving to be a unique way to *land north of Summertown*<sup>7</sup>. The Council will be discussing the outcomes from this at its October meeting and expects an application to be submitted to the Vale in due course.

The Parish is in the final stages of planning the layout of the field it has leased to the north of the playing field – 'Kings Leases', Feedback from the Neighbourhood Plan survey, and in response to notices in recent editions of this august newsletter have been considered and the final plans will be presented to a Council meeting in the near future.

The Parish Council has now taken the title for the green space with the large walnut tree on Ebbs Lane by the new houses. It has submitted an application to designate the space as a 'Centenary Field', recognizing the part played by erstwhile East Hanney resident. George Ingle Finch. The Council hopes this application will be successful. Delivered in partnership with The Royal British Legion, the Centenary Fields programme commemorate the World War I centenary, and to remember those who lost their lives during the conflict, by protecting outdoor recreational space in perpetuity for the benefit of future generations.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

### The next meeting dates are 4<sup>th</sup> October and 1<sup>st</sup> November 2017.

### Jim Cottrell 9th June 1928 - 15 Aug 2017

Jim or 'Jammy' as he was commonly known, was born on the 9th June 1928, one of nine children, to Alice and Albert Cottrell at Wick Green Farm in Grove. He attended Grove Church of England School until he was 13 years old, he then left to work full time on the family farm, having worked on it part-time from a very early age as was the norm in those days. His father's philosophy was 'if you can walk you can work'.

Jammy loved his football and played for Grove Rangers for many years. After the games he and his team mates would often go to the Black Horse pub at East Hanney where he met Heather Walters, the daughter of the Landlord Arthur Walters, who he went on to marry. They settled into married life in Grove where they raised their four children.

He was a hardworking man having continued to work well into his eighties on the family farms in West Hanney and Lyford with his two sons and Grandsons. The subject of speeding through our villages has always been of great concern to me. I mentioned it briefly last month and it appears that I am not alone. Whilst the legal limit is 30mph. on some stretches through our villages a limit much nearer 20mph is a safe speed, in my view. Various statistical studies show that if a pedestrian is hit by a vehicle travelling at 20mph they have a 90+% chance of survival. At 30mph it's about 55%, but a 40mph it's just 5%. Why am I quoting the stats for 40mph? Well, a survey of traffic on Winter Lane carried out in 2012 revealed that of approx 1.000 journeys a day - up or down Winter Lane - over 350 were travelling at more than 30mph. Of those, 100 were driving in excess of 35mph, and of those, 20 were exceeding 40mph. That's every day. One option is a 20mph speed limit. It would not of course solve the problem, and may not be universally popular much local consultation has to happen before it can be introduced - but in my view it would certainly help. In practical terms it would mean that a journey from one end of West to the far end of East Hanney would take less than a minute longer...a minor inconvenience. I contacted Oxfordshire County Council about the possibility of introducing such a limit. It's not good news I'm afraid - no surprise there. They tell me that between 1999 - 2003 they reviewed speed limits within villages, assuring me that it 'involved verv extensive local *consultation.* (It resulted in the introduction of a 30mph limit on the A338 through East Hanney.) Funding is not currently available for any further reviews or speed calming measures, and anyway, my view is that

OCC have a reactive rather than proactive policy, i.e. they won't do anything until something serious happens. The zebra crossing outside the Co-op in Steventon and the traffic lights at the junction on the A415/B4449 south of Witney were only installed following road traffic fatalities. A very wise gent in our village who knows the machinations of OCC, told me that they seek to always avoid change, especially if that change may face opposition. Put simply, they want to keep the status quo. Some Parish Councils - e.g. Islip, Brightwell cum Sotwell and Shiplake have gone ahead and self-funded the introduction of a 20mph limit, but it's stupidly expensive - bewildering legal fees alone cost £2.600! The overall figure can reach well over £10.000. Many - I suspect most - Parish Councils have very little money, and whilst OCC are suggesting that PCs could self-fund, they are at the same time asking PCs to take over various tasks, e.g. maintaining the verges, from the County, thereby incurring vet more expense. I'm not sure where we go from here. Wearing my optimists hat. I hope that, in the longer term, speeding will become as socially unacceptable as drink driving already is, but in the meantime, let's all



be cool and cruise nice and slowly

through our lovely villages.


# Harvest Teatime Fun at St James Church Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October 3.30 – 5.00pm
