West Hanney Parish Council

The application to build up to 56 houses in the field at the western end of the village at Townsend was refused by the planners on 13th October. Thank you to all those who supported us in taking the time to object to this unwanted development in a totally unsuitable location in our small village. Over the past month or two, members of the PC have applied weed killer on pavements and road edges in parts of the village, and cleared up the resulting debris. In the case of Main Street 6 barrow loads of spoil were removed. We were subsequently delighted to be advised by the Waste, Leisure Parks and Environmental Department of the Vale that they would be carrying out a deep clean of our village in November. However we were then disappointed to learn that they will not spray weeds, cut grass or remove vegetation, and will only be litter picking, sweeping and removing weeds and moss on pavements. They will not be cleaning roads or road edges. Village deep clean? On Saturday 7th October 35 Kgs of Daffodil bulbs were planted around the village by councillors Chris Surman and Trevor Brettell and two volunteers, who very kindly responded to our request for help. A big thank you to Paul Sayers and Chris Jay. We still have around 10kgs to plant.

The next Community Woodland working party has been arranged for Saturday 4th November so if you would like to help please come along at 9am. Meet at the Kissing Gate entry by the Church. We would like to thank Iason Kent for the donation of logs for use by the Forest School, and also the large pile of wood chippings. These will be spread on to the muddy areas in the woodland on the 4th. The new footpath along Winter Lane is progressing well although comments are already being made as to the dangers of falling into the ditch which is very close alongside. We will be pointing out the dangers of this to the relevant authorities.

After several delays, work to strengthen the road edges along Botney Lane started at last on October 2nd, with the road being totally closed. It is amazing how many drivers ignored the signs and squeezed through the barriers only to have to turn around in driveways a few metres along the road. It was very tempting to erect a notice saying 'What part of 'Road Closed' do you not understand!'



George Thomas Burnett

is one of two Second World War casualties buried in St James the Great Churchyard. At the time of his death, George was serving with the 4th Battalion, Oxfordshire & Buckinghamshire Light Infantry Regiment. George had been with the 4th Bn. in France in 1940, where the Regiment were used as a 'rear-guard' to protect the soldiers retreating to Dunkirk. The Battalion was decimated during a battle to hold a small hill-top town called Cassel. The majority of the men were either captured or killed, and very few escaped. Those who did were left to their own devices to find their way to Dunkirk. This is what apparently happened to George, who according to his family, was separated from his unit, and while he



made it to Dunkirk, he had been forced to drink from puddles to survive. This caused him to fall ill during the evacuation, and while he returned home he never fully recovered and died aged 31 on the 10th November 1941, presumably in the Military Hospital at Newton Abbott in Devon where his death was recorded. George was born in Sutton in Surrey in 1910. His mother was Alice Mary Dix of West Hanney, his father was Luke Burnett from near Croydon. In 1915, George's father was killed in Belgium, fighting with the East Surrey Regiment. His name is recorded on the Menin Gate at Ypres. Alice returned to West Hanney where she married Percy Cyril Belcher in 1919, and this is where George grew up, later becoming solo chorister at the church in which he is now commemorated.

Dear Friends

I have been reading the book '*I married a soldier*' by Brenda Hale, which was published this summer by LION.

It tells us of Brenda's experiences, both as an army wife and then as an army widow after her husband Captain Mark Hale died in Afghanistan. It ends with her re-election last year to Stormont in Northern Ireland, where she lives. They are selected experiences but include how both of them became Christians, how the family dealt with the disruption of separation and how subsequently they were coping with the devastation of bereavement.

The book brought back lots of memories for me, for I first met Mark when he was Company Sergeant Major of "A" company of the 1st Battalion Devon and Dorset Regiment when I joined the Army as a chaplain in 2000. I remember reading the Bible and praying with Mark in Crossmaglen, refereeing him in rugby matches; visiting the family in hospital after their second daughter was born and conducting her service of Blessing and Thanksgiving and Dedication at the little corrugated chapel in Cavalry Barracks, Hounslow where they attended.

Mark had a great care and sense of responsibility for his men, and it was while he was trying to save one of them that he was killed.

What this book makes clear, far better than I could is that it is not only the service personnel who make sacrifices, but also their families. It conveys the anger, frustration and despair at the horror and waste of life that war causes. Brenda took those strong feelings and channelled them to make a positive difference.

Our national act of remembrance this month gives us an opportunity to show gratitude for the sacrifices made by sailors, soldiers and airmen, as well as their families; but it should also help us positively focus on striving to maintain freedom, security and peace.

As a Christian minister, I find myself returning to the phrase Jesus said —" ...no one has greater love than this that they lay down their life for their friends"; and finding hope in the belief that his sacrifice has begun the process to bring about the end of all war and conflict.

By the way if you are interested in reading this book you can buy a copy of it at Cornerstone bookshop in Grove.

We will remember them.

Obituary - Frank Poller 6th November 1925 - 3rd October 2017

Frank was born in Birmingham and enjoyed a long career as a teacher, starting in a boys secondary modern school, teaching English literature. He finished his career as the head of a village primary school in Finchampstead, Berkshire. Frank then became a primary schools adviser in Oxfordshire.

In 1989, after his retirement, Frank and his wife Edwina moved from Abingdon to Hanney seeking a more rural lifestyle. He quickly became involved in village life, and was particularly active in the History Group for which he wrote a book about James Holmes, a well known historical figure who was a resident of Hanney. He illustrated another book that the group produced. Ann Fewins, a longtime member, told me that Frank would always be remembered for his ability to discover, research and record a good story, and his gentleness of manner. Frank was very active and helped a great deal in the village shop, mainly fetching the produce from shops in Grove and Oxford He also delivered 'Meals on

Wheels' in the area which, in those days, were collected, already cooked, from the Wantage Hospital.

Frank was very creative - he wrote poetry - and, following his retirement, took up painting water-colours. He wrote diaries and was often to be seen with a pen and notebook in hand. He also was involved in the publishing of an anthology of stories and poems about the Vale of White Horse.

Frank was a very keen and able table tennis player and a badminton net was always well used in the summer months in their garden. Frank and Edwina often took part in local 'open garden' events in the village, opening their garden for the enjoyment of the community. Frank passed on his love of nature to his children which they in turn have passed on to their kids.

Frank and Edwina were married for 63 years and have four daughters and several grand and great-grandchildren Our thoughts are with them all at this time. Hanney has lost a true gentleman. He will be deeply missed. *Jim Stagg*


