



## The sound of church bells

is deeply rooted in British culture, the regular ringing of bells in churches having happened for at least 1,500 years. So common a practice was it that even back in 750 AD, the Archbishop of York ordered all priests to toll their bells at certain times. Ringing has heralded good news and bad ever since, but there is now, sadly, an ever more serious shortage of bell ringers. Hence the launch of a very worthy

nationwide campaign **'Ringing Remem-bers'**. Its aim is to recruit new ringers to

prepare for Sunday 11th November - 100 years after 'Armistice' - when bells will ring out in unison from churches and cathedrals in villages, towns and cities across the country. To mark the final year of the First World War centenary commemorations, 1,400 new bell ringers will be recruited in honour of the 1,400 that lost their lives during that war. The ringing of church bells across the UK remained restricted throughout the war. Bells only rang freely once Armistice was declared, when

## **East Hanney Parish Council**

The Parish Council has received further amendments to the applications for development on the land behind Dews Meadow. Please search for them on the VWHDC planning pages if you want to read them. The Council hopes to meet (separately) with Matt Barber and the Vale's planners about the proposals and will be considering its response to these amendments at its February meeting.

The Council hopes that the replacement benches on the green opposite La Fontana will be finished by the summer. In the meantime, it is seeking volunteers to help remove the existing benches so they can be considered for refurbishment and placed in a new location.

Throughout the year, the Council will be finishing the preparatory work on Kings Leases, a large number of hedgerow 'whips' have been planted to thicken the hedge out, new gates will be installed and the amenity space will start to take shape. The design and installation of the 'trim trail' will be discussed at the February meeting.

The Council is also hoping to plant a garden area near the allotments for all to enjoy, an accessible peace garden. If you can volunteer any help to design, plan or maintain this garden area, then please get in touch with the Clerk.

On a different note, villagers may be interested to know that the Council has heard from GARD (The Group Against Reservoir Development) that Thames Water's draft plans for Water Resource Management 2019-2024 is likely to be published in late January or early February. From briefings, GARD believes that the Reservoir will feature somewhere in the draft plans. For more, please see GARD's own website (http://www.abingdonreservoir.org.uk/index.html).

## West Hanney Parish Council

The latest news on the attempt to increase the number of houses planned from 15 to 35 off School Road is that new information has now been submitted to the Vale planners by the agent and the application is now open for re-consultation. The new proposal outlines reasons why the proposed extra site entry and exit off the bend at the top of Winter Lane should be allowed. Photographs have been submitted to the planners with views both ways from the proposed entrance which do not show any evidence of a bend! One has even been taken from the opposite side of the road! Very crafty! We have therefore taken our own photos to submit and have also asked for a site meeting with the relevant representative from OCC Highways.

Meanwhile, all residents opposed to this enlarged development need to go online, or write in, and register their opposition again, especially to an entrance on this dangerous bend. The relevant planning number is P17/V1823/FUL.

Your Councillors are still looking for someone willing to become Clerk to the Council. If you would like to help your community then please consider applying. This is an interesting and vital role in village life. For an informal chat please talk to any councillor or give Chris Surman or Kay Sayers a ring.

The daffodils will hopefully soon be brightening up our village and heralding the coming of Spring. Litter, however, seems to be a problem again, either dropped by individuals or thrown from car windows. All we can do is take some action ourselves. Please help by picking up and binning any litter close to your own property. If we all do this it will really help to make a difference and keep our village clean and tidy.

With regard to the collection bags often put through doors by the National Children's Air Ambulance Charity, we have been asked by volunteer collectors for our own local Thames Valley Air Ambulance to point out that they also collect old shoes/clothes etc. to raise much needed funds for the valuable Air Ambulance Service which operates in this area. Collection bins are located at Dews Meadow Farm and at Frosts Garden Centre.



You may recall that last month Queen Victoria no less, enquired about Joseph Fisher, who had sadly 'passed' due to 'tubercles on the brain'. Well, Louise Green, a loval subject of this Parish, has done some research into Joseph and discovered that he was baptised at West Hanney on December 28th 1834. He was the son of John Fisher and Sarah Bettridge, who were married in 1833 also at West Hanney. The Fishers were an established yeoman farming family. (A Yeoman farmer cultivated land that he owned.) They lived at Fishers Farm, a property that still exists - now called 'Poundcroft' on the east side of the A338, just north of La Fontana. He died, aged just 42, on the 19th December 1876 and was buried 4 days later. His widow Mary emigrated to Chicago. Many thanks to Louise for her splendid research.

Here are three more excerpts from the Hanney Parish Magazines of the Victorian era. These appeared in the Feb 1877 and Feb 1878 issues.

'A concert was given in the School-room by Mr C Bryant and friends. The room was fairly well filled and the audience appeared to be well satisfied with the entertainment, which consisted of Vocal (Comic and Sentimental) and Instrumental music'

Inquest held on the body of Sarah Dormer, who died in a fit on Sunday Dec 16. Her clothes caught fire, but were extinguished by her daughter. Verdict returned was that she died suddenly by the visitation of God'

'Mrs Gibbs has been fined, by the Wantage Magistrates, for refusing to send her children to school.'

This kind of stuff really floats my boat. If it does yours, I urge you to join the History Group. They're a friendly and welcoming bunch!



#### The Snuggs Lane Stile.... Part 2.

Sadly, the Oxfordshire County Council inspector who checked the stile following the report to the 'Fixmystreet' website by East Hanney Parish Council's Clerk, Sir Guy of Langton, had this to say... "Thank you for your enquiry. I have visited the site and assessed the problem that you have identified. Unfortunately it doesn't meet our current intervention criteria so I cannot arrange a repair. We will continue to monitor this during our routine inspections."

It contains a wonderful example of that dreadful modern corporate speak - 'current intervention criteria'. (I wonder if they go on courses to learn this stuff?) His/her decision is disappointing, driven I'm sure by budgetary considerations, but optimistic me sees this as a set-back rather than the end of the matter. Recent comments made by some older members of our community suggest that they are unable to use the stile at all. #### Dear Editor

Having read your article about the poor state of the stile at the end of Snuggs Lane your readers may be interested to learn that stiles are not there for the benefit of the public, walkers or otherwise, but solely for that of the land owner. He is legally permitted to install them across public footpaths etc., which would otherwise have to remain open, in order to prevent livestock from straying or getting into arable fields. As such he has to ensure that they are well maintained and is, therefore, also legally responsible for any injury or damage to clothing resulting from an accident that could be shown to have been caused by neglected maintenance or poor construction. 


