

Here are a couple more excerpts from the Hanney Parish magazines of the 19th century. The first, from 1878 is brief and rather blunt.

'Unusual sickness and mortality and sickness amongst children. One died within 24 hours.'

The second from 1879 ends with a rather unusual proposal...

'Two more fires at Hanney during the past month. One at the wheelwright's shop occupied by Mr A Booker, which was completely burnt down to the ground. The other at Mr Bosley's which fortunately was discovered in time to prevent much damage. Two more fires occurred in the neighbourhood in the same night that the wheelwright's shop was burnt, one at Steventon and the other at Drayton and they are supposed to have been caused by an incendiary. It is proposed to purchase a number of buckets to be kept by the Policemen, who is collecting subscriptions.'

Hanney Swans update...This from Sir Steve of McKechnie, Lord of the Swans...

'I am sure everyone is pleased to read that the Hanney Swans are preparing to nest which is a relief after last year's devastation.

I was brought up putting stale and even mouldy bread to one side "for the birds." Then every Sunday we would venture off to the river and feed the birds. I had never questioned this until my induction days at Swan Lifeline in Windsor, where I helped bringing in the sick and injured swans from the Thames. It was explained that all of us who thought we were doing right, were in fact doing wrong. The tongue of a swan cannot move from side to side, only in and out, so when one feeds on mouldy bread offered by well-meaning folk, the bacteria can remain in their beaks. When the swans preen, the bacteria are transmitted to their feathers, causing severe damage to them. The bacteria also enter the quills via the digestive system. If you feed the Swans please do not give them bread that is mouldy. Only use seeded brown bread; white bread contains very little goodness anyway,



and only has the effect of bloating the birds. After eating white bread they do not feel the need to eat the natural foods that offer all their requirements for a healthy diet.

Remember also that once the eggs hatch, the swans become incredibly territorial and protective. We should give them a very wide berth, ensuring that both children and dogs are kept well away. This common sense approach will ensure that "our" swans are encouraged to make Hanney their home and bring us the sight of cygnets.

East Hanney Parish Council

The Parish Council has received further amendments to the applications for development on the land behind Dews Meadow, please search out one of the applications on the VWHDC planning pages if you want to read these. The Council has met (separately) with Matt Barber and the Vale's planners about the proposals and was satisfied with the outcome of both meetings. A revised response has been submitted to the Vale.

The Council hopes that the replacement benches on the green opposite La Fontana will be finished by the summer. In the meantime, the designer, Julie Grose (http://juliegrosemetaldesign.co.uk/home/) is fabricating the benches to be installed and will be showing them at her studio during Art Weeks in May – a date for our diaries!

Following a meeting with Matt Barber, the Council has again been given a named contact at the Vale for the progress of its Neighbourhood Plan. The Council hopes that this will re-start the process and that adoption of the plan can happen with reasonable speed.

The Council has had to reduce the skip provision for the village. From April 2018 there will be a skip once every two months rather than monthly, though it will alternate as in previous years between the Hall and Snuggs Lane. This has had to happen because the Council wishes to keep the precept charged to a minimum and the Neighbourhood Plan survey indicated that remarkably few villagers avail themselves of this service.

The next meeting dates are 7th March and 4th April 2018.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

West Hanney Parish Council

A big thank you to the Michaelmas Fayre committee for the grant money awarded for the purchase of a wooden bench for the Community Woodland. The PC will by now have ordered the new bench, and the volunteer group, under the guidance of Paul Sayers, will be siting and fixing it shortly. Eventually we would like to see several such seats in the woodland or meadow.

The new kissing gate kindly donated by Hanney News has now been fixed in the south west corner of the woodland and is already being well used.

Another thank you is due to Paul Sayers who has been getting down on hands and knees and cleaning out various drainage gullies around the village, another service no longer carried out regularly enough by the council. Not a very nice or easy job, yet essential to prevent our roads flooding.

Many walkers have noticed the purple lines sprayed on the grass at one side of the community meadow. This is because the Vale planners sensibly insisted Sweetcroft planted new trees to replace those removed by their development of the Orchard. This is part of the land gifted to the village by Sweetcroft and Chris Surman and Paul Sayers have been discussing the siting of these new trees with them.

The decision on the application to increase the number of houses to 35 off School Road should by now have been made public, and hopefully sense has prevailed and permission has been refused.

www.fixmystreet.com is the site to go to. Perhaps the highway authority could give some responsibility to their repair operatives to use their discretion and common sense in filling in potholes that have opened up close to the one they have been delegated to repair. As we understand it they are not allowed to do that until a surveyor has travelled out with a can of spray paint and marked the hole which is after all obvious to all! Surely the present system is a waste of time and resources?

A newspaper recently reported that most motorists no longer take driving advice to look well ahead on the roads to see problems because they are too busy looking a few metres in front of their own vehicles in an attempt to miss the ever increasing number of potholes to avoid damaging their vehicles. Worrying! You can of course claim for damage caused to your wheels/tyres if you hit a pothole but don't forget most councils will only consider a claim if the damaged road has already been reported to them. We are still looking for a new Parish Clerk. If you are at all interested please contact any councillor for an informal chat.

I rest my case...rides can be fun without shouting and swearing!

So to our shouty sweary cyclist friends, whoever you are, I say please be more like Marmaduke and Lavinia when you're cycling through our villages. Thank You!



Yes, Lavvy, I'm having a super time thank you, and I'm not being at all shouty and sweary am I?

Snuggs Lane stile update...not good news I'm afraid. Although he has not contacted me directly, I understand that the owner has been approached by a member of East Hanney Parish Council, and is adamant that there is nothing at all wrong with his stile and that he certainly would not entertain replacing it with a kissing gate. The latter would of course mean that access to the public right of way would be much easier. Although we're all very ready to shout 'But it's my right!!' these days, apparently that does not apply to older or disabled folk in this case. Not much of a consolation, but this is clearly a common problem. Three stiles

clearly a common problem. Three stiles are mentioned in the current Kingston Bagpuss News that, were they changed to kissing gates, would allow much better access to various parts of the area. Just a couple more interesting points...were a land owner to request replacing an existing gate with a stile, he

would not be allowed to. It is clear that stiles - even well maintained ones - are recognised these days as not being very 'user-friendly'. By the way, Oxfordshire County Council offer a 25% donation towards the cost of a replacement. The snap below is of the stile in West Hanney that gives access to the north east corner of the Church Farm Meadow. A wide, solid, level step covered with a wire mesh ensuring good grip whatever the weather. That's more like it!





Hello darlings, me again, Jaunty Jilly, only this month, I've gone for a more demure look, after someone said last month it was all getting rather saucy, and this is a family mag after all!

Now, I want to tell you about the kissing gate in West Hanney that we have just purchased. Here's a snap...it's on the south



west corner of the Church Farm Meadow twixt East and West Hanney and I gather is already being well used. We here at H.N. Global Int. are jolly proud that we have been able to fund it. When you use it darlings, be sure to blow me a big air kiss!

As our community expands eastwards,

crossing the A338 to and from the newer housing developments on the eastern side of it becomes a



dangerous necessity for more and more folk.

Traffic from the north often ignores the warning sign on entering the village, and though the speed camera slows traffic approaching from the south, much of it soon speeds up again as it passes the house that used to be the Crown pub on the left and the industrial units on the right.

Factor in that whenever there are problems on the A34, traffic from it diverts onto this road, and I reckon a pedestrian crossing is long overdue. Apparently requests have been made, but surprise surprise, nothing has happened and it's time to start pestering the Oxfordshire County Council (OCC).

I contacted them on 8th Feb, gave them the basic story and they promised to get me a response. I'm pleased to say that the very next day I did hear back, but oh dear, it's not good news. Yes, they're aware of the problem but guess what?....there's no money! They also suggested that the delay is partially due to a lack of response to their queries from East Hanney Parish Council. (EHPC)

I have forwarded their email to EHPC and will be pestering both them and OCC on a regular basis. EHPC have said they will try to include this on the agenda for their March meeting - see page 6 for details. Perhaps you'd like to come along and hear the latest. Like the Winter Lane footpath, this story has legs!






