East Hanney Parish Council

The Council has had to repair a couple of with key line markings)". It would have pieces of playground equipment recently, hopefully you will find the 'dizzy-disc' (aka turnstile), the red spinning pillar has had the footplate welded back on and the basket swing has been serviced and re-attached. To help us identify this type of damage even sooner, the Council will be making regular visual inspections but we welcome reports of any damage from playground users to the Clerk at the email address below. The Council is also looking at installing a 'MUGA" with funds accrued from developments locally. A MUGA is a 'Multi Use Games Area' - usually a steel anti-vandal outdoor fenced area with built in goal post units for various types of sports games, such as football, basketball or tennis. The fencing makes it easier to keep the ball in play. They are often installed at schools and can be supplied in half court (open one end with one combination goal unit), full court (fully enclosed with two end goal units) and key area (open single goal end

to be on the playing field and best placed near the playground. If you have any ideas about what would be best in terms of design and potential uses (which sports should be included as markings or equipment) then please email the Clerk.

Finally, the ageing blue 'bandstand' on the field near the playground has been marked with graffiti, very little of any artistic merit. The Council is investigating how this piece can be repaired or cleaned.

If being a Parish Councillor is something you have thought you might like to try, then you will be interested to know that the next elections are in May 2019, when the Parish Council will be expanding to 8 councillors. West Hanney Parish Council

At long last we have a new Parish Clerk. Barbara Martin has agreed to take on the role. Thank you and welcome Barbara. We look forward to working with you.

The new bench has now been fixed in the Community Woodland thanks to the grant from the Michaelmas Fayre Committee. Thanks again to them. We hope villagers will enjoy having an extra place to 'sit awhile'.

Oxfordshire County Council have finally agreed to re run the speed check on the bend at the top of Winter Lane. If this has not yet taken place then it should shortly. The check cables will be in place for 7 days. Although your Parish Council strongly objected to the last check when coincidently the adjoining field at the proposed new entrance to the development was ploughed and 'Slow - Mud on Road' signs were put out, most of the credit must go to the sustained efforts of one of our residents who wrote strong letters of complaint to the authorities. The letters were initially answered giving various reasons as to why the results would be allowed to stand. Unwilling to accept this, our intrepid villager continued to demand a review of procedures within the complaints process and eventually the Highways Department agreed to his reasoned arguments. Well done and thank you for vour support.

Can we ask residents to keep their hedges trimmed back from the footpaths so that pedestrians don't suffer scratches and cuts whilst using the walkways. Please remember that wheelchair users, mobility scooters and mothers with buggies need the full width of the path. If your hedge has grown out over the footpath please cut it back drastically if necessary. It will recover!

Last month East Hanney Parish Council advised that at the elections in May next year there would be the opportunity to stand as a Parish Councillor. Can we repeat that information as West Hanney Parish Council will also have vacancies at that time. Please consider serving your village and community by applying. If you would like to know what being a Councillor involves then why not come along to one of our meetings, see what goes on, and maybe talk to us about the role.

THE CHURCH OF FNGLAND

Dear Friends,

Sally and I were enjoying a beautiful walk in Wales recently, the sun was shining in a blue sky, there were bluebells and red campions and little pink flowers we didn't know the name of bordering the path. We had to stop every so often to enjoy the sight of the lambs gamboling in the fields. We felt very uplifted by the beautiful world around us. Distressingly, as we walked on, we came upon the body of a dead sheep lying in the middle of the path; it had obviously come to a very unpleasant end. Sally was too upset to look and I only had a quick glance before we found a route past the torn and bloodied body. I thought it looked as though the sheep had escaped from the field and been attacked and killed by a predator. It certainly took the shine out of our walk.

It reminded me of a story I had read once in some bible notes. The story was about a man who was out walking when he heard a dog barking, it was an abrasive sound in a tranquil setting. Suddenly a small deer broke through the edge of the woods, the dog in hot pursuit. The man stood motionless not wanting to add to the animal's fright. As it leapt the fence near him he could see that the chase had taken its toll on the frightened, confused, panting deer. Eyes wide with fright the deer suddenly became aware of the man standing quietly nearby, she turned weakly and approached him without fear and buried her head in his tummy. Compassion flooded his heart. He had authority over the dog and she recognised that she had found her protector.

I have always thought that little story was a wonderful picture of how our life can be. We don't need to be fearful and running away from the difficult things in our life and in ourselves, we just need to turn to God who loves us and has great compassion for us. He is always near. As it says in *Proverbs 18 v 10 'The name of the Lord is a strong tower, the righteous run to it and are safe.'*

Too often I feel like a silly sheep or a frightened deer and if you can empathise with that I encourage you to always turn to God so that you can learn to fully 'trust in the name of the Lord and rely on your God' Isaiah 50 v 10. God bless.

Criminals setting up fake Wi-Fi hot spots Citizens Advice warning

It ought to be a time of the pleasantest relaxation, that moment when you slump down comfortably into a cosy chair in your favourite coffee bar, get out your mobile and connect to the free Wi-Fi. But Citizens Advice has warned that just this simple leisurely action can be targeted by criminals, who are setting up their own Wi-Fi hot spots to try to get you to connect to them. citizens advice

Typically, the fraudsters broadcast a Wi-Fi connection with a vague name like "free_wifi" or "coffee_shop_wifi". If you connect your phone to this, any data you are sending can be captured.

Even if you log into emails using an "app", without typing in the password, the phone will still send your password over the Wi-Fi and it could be intercepted. If you use automated passwords and do not enter your user name and password manually, these details can still be intercepted.

To avoid being becoming a victim of this scam, do one of the following: Make sure you are connecting to a trusted Wi-Fi hot spot, operated by the venue you are in - ask staff if you are in doubt.

Do not use public Wi-Fi for online banking or anything else sensitive, but use your 3G, 4G or 5G connection instead (date sent over these connections is always encrypted).

Use a VPN (virtual private network) when connecting to public Wi-Fi.
