'Save Wantage Hospital'

You may recall that included in the July edition of Hanney News was a flier advertising a protest march - we don't get many of them round these 'ere parts - regarding the Wantage Hospital. Well it all went off ok with no lynchings I understand, and I've now received this from the organisers...

"Nearly 1,000 people attended the Save Wantage Hospital Rally in the Market Place. A very peaceful march hiding a depth of feeling. Many of these people were born in the hospital and even more have been treated there in the past. They want to be able to use it again.

It was a very successful event and we now need to take our message to those who run our NHS.

The Hospital is currently owned by Oxford Health NHS Foundation Trust (part of NHS Oxfordshire) and they report to HOSC (Health, Overview & Scrutiny Committee) and OCCG (Oxfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group). We need to tell all of these bodies how we feel.

So that we can get our message across forcefully, we need as many people as possible to write to the Chairmen of these two bodies, and attend the following meetings:

East Hanney Parish Council

At its August meeting, East Haney Parish Council decided to change the schedule of its monthly meetings. The new day will be the second Wednesday of the month rather than the first. Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the second Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop and on the Council's website a week in advance.

If being a Parish Councillor is something you have thought you might like to try, then it will be of interest to you to know that the next elections are in May 2019, when the Parish Council will be expanding to 8 members. If you are interested in the village and its community, and would like to be instrumental in helping to shape its future, please consider standing. If you would like to know more, please contact the Clerk by email or telephone.

In August, the skip by the village hall was

refused collection as it was seriously overloaded. The skips are provided and paid for by the Council on behalf of the residents of East Hanney to help those residents who cannot afford to pay for large items to be disposed of. Recently it was decided to reduce the number of skips as they were being used by non-residents and by people who had the means to transport bulk or trade waste to the tip by their own transport. This service costs the village residents about £2000 per year, paid for via council tax precept. Rather than increase the precept further or stop providing other services, it was decided to reduce the number of skips per year. It's a real shame that the service is being abused, but hopefully this helps to explain the purpose.

The state of August's skip has meant that the Parish Council has had to pay an extra £210 of tax-payer's money to have the excess rubbish removed before it could legally be taken by the driver. This is money that a small council like yours finds hard to afford.

The Parish Council meetings for the remainder of the year are on the second Wednesday of the month, rather than the first (still from 8pm), as follows: 12th September, 10th October, 14th November, 12th December, 2018, and 9th January, 13th February, 13th March and 10th April, 2019.

West Hanney Parish Council

Members of the Parish Council were saddened to learn of the passing of both Lionel Cousins and Dudley Iles, and send our sincerest sympathy to Angela, Penny and their families.

Lionel was a councillor on West Hanney Parish Council for 39 years, from 1972 until 2011, with some of that time as Chairman. He also served as a trustee of the Hanney Parochial Charities for many years, including several as Chairman. He was involved in so many things in the village, the Scout movement, helping with the supply chain to the village shop, and even working as Barman in the Village Hall. That dedication in serving the village he loved is unlikely ever to be repeated.

Dudley was very involved in the Community Woodland even before Nigel Eady's executors agreed to gift it to the Parish Council for the village. With others he was responsible for building and erecting most of the nest boxes throughout the area and also designed, built and erected the wonderful informative signs at the two main entrances to the woodland. We have had several complaints of noise from residents of Church Street over the

past weeks. This is not a situation that the PC can get involved in, but any such disturbances can be reported to the Vale of White Horse Environmental Health Department who will take action if appropriate.

The application to build 35 houses off School Road has now been withdrawn but of course the building of 15 new properties already passed will still go ahead. There is still some debate as to the proposed footpath to the school and whether it should be on the north side of School Road or the south side in which case children will have to cross the road to reach the existing footpath. The plan appears to show the footpath running alongside the road and your parish council have advised the planners that this should not be allowed. The footpath should be constructed within the development itself and the bank and fence should be retained as it is. Autumn is fast approaching so it will soon be time to dig the vegetable plot ready for the spring planting. Haven't got a Veggie Plot? Why not take on an allotment? We have some available. No charge for the first year. Contact our clerk Barbara Martin for details.

recently got together to have a little party, and very jolly it was too, the older folk clearly enjoying contact with the lively youngsters.

tell me that they desperately need more children to keep it going... would certainly be a great shame if it had to cease through lack of support, so if you're in charge of a small person aged 0 to school age, on a Monday morning between 9.30 and 11.30am, pop along to the village hall. Figures recently published by Thames Valley Police show that the speed camera on the A338 in East Hanney caught 1,514 speeding motorists in the year ending June 2018.

In fact, the East Hanney camera, along with some others, appears twice on their list - no idea why? - with another figure of 228 also being given. It matters not

which one is correct, or if they should be added together, the fact remains that this is yet more evidence - if any was required - that a pedestrian

crossing is urgently needed.

Not only is the A338 a busy main road slicing through our village... well done the planners who allowed all the new developments on the east side of the road with no provision for a safe crossing!....the figures prove that many vehicles are exceeding the speed limit. Well I never...who'd have thought it? If you're a fan of irony, then read on.... It's not just the Police who have recognised the problems with speeding on this stretch of road: Oxford County Council (OCC) have too, after conducting a recent traffic survey. They have now

informed East Hanney Parish Council (EHPC) in an email that 'the speeds are too high for a zebra (crossing)'! You couldn't make this up could you? Put simply, 'you can't have a zebra crossing cos the traffic goes too fast.'

Apparently we will need an 'all singing all dancing' crossing, traffic lights, buttons etc. What's wrong with that you

may ask?
Two things - minor
point first...some
folk will object,
claiming it's a
further urbanisation
of our rural
environment.
Major point...it'll

cost much more money. And remember, that's the stuff OCC don't have much of we're told. (A basic zebra by the way, costs approx £20k.)

So what now? Once EHPC have received some 'sketches' and proposals from OCC, they intend to consult the locals and gather views on the whole project. And finally....all this talk of zebras got me wondering how much it costs to buy a real zebra. A quick Google search and hey presto - around \$6,000 will get you one in the USA, didn't find any available here.

What to do with textiles not good enough for the charity shops?

Here's a couple of ideas - from Jane Bowler...'We have an 'Air Ambulance' textile donation point here at Dews Meadow Farm Shop in East Hanney.'

Clare Sparrow informs that the new H&M in Didcot takes textiles and gives a £5 discount voucher per bag. Thanks Clare and Jane.




A while back I mentioned the nuisance of bonfires in our community. Noise can be also be a problem, especially on these hot summer nights when simply closing the windows to shut out the racket isn't really an option.

It's the Vale of White Horse District Council's responsibility to investigate complaints about noise - ring the Environmental Health Out of Hours team on 01235 422420 or contact them online if you wish to complain. Full details are on the Vale's website.... www.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/services-and-advice/environment-and-neighbourhood-issues/report-problem-noise-and-nuisance Word is that any noise after 11pm is considered unreasonable.

If the Vale uphold your complaint they serve an abatement notice, which, if breached, can result in a £5,000 fine. How effective this all actually is I do not know, but if enough people complain then maybe something will be done...it's worth a try. To finish with some good news...back in the 1980's, an American heavy metal band 'Manowar' claimed the title of "loudest band in the world". The muscle-bound

'boys' are still together apparently, and are playing a European tour next year. I have checked the itinerary and can confirm that they have no plans for a gig at the Hanney War Memorial Hall or the Legion, or anywhere else in the UK. You'll need to pop over to Germany or Norway to witness them flex their abs and strum a few tunes!



This long and magnificent old stone

wall has been part of the East Hanney landscape for over 200 years I'm assured, but the Vale Planners have granted permission for an 8.5metre section to be demolished to allow access into the rear garden of the property of which it is a part. Several locals are very upset indeed, one going so far as to put up a banner which was summarily removed by person(s) unknown the next day. During the consultation



period many folk, including the Parish Council, voiced their opposition - you can read them all on the Vale website ...here's the reference number: P18/V0700/HH. However, unless the owners change their minds, we will soon lose this historic part of old Hanney.



Dear Editor

Readers of Hanney News might be a trifle mystified after the item in July's edition about 'William Woodward, eldest son of Thomas Woodward, Citizen and Carpenter of London', who was buried, aged 16, in the churchyard at the rear of St James in April 1725. The grandiose tomb to this young man, unmistakeable in its ostentation, stands on a new plinth, fully refurbished after the Parochial Church Council was obliged to take this action in May of this year.

The reason? The tomb is a listed structure, which means that we were obliged by the Government to act before it degenerated further. The total cost of this work was nearly £16,000 incl. VAT. Although we have received a grant from Oxford Historic Churches Trust for which we are very grateful and a gift totalling £2,000, for which we are equally grateful, towards the work, the parish has had to find the remainder of the money from its own funds. Fortunately we are expecting to receive a substantial VAT rebate.

Nevertheless, this has come at an unfortunate time, as we are trying hard to build up our funds in advance of a major re-organisation project we are shortly to start that is expected to cost us upwards of £150,000.. None of this money will come from central funds in the Church of England. So if anyone feels they can spare the odd £1,000 to help towards the repair of the Woodward tomb we should be extremely grateful.

Even joining the Hanney Lottery (if you do not belong already) would help, as the proceeds of this go entirely towards keeping St James Church standing and in good fettle.

As for the mystery of who this young man was, and his tenuous (if any) links with the Hanneys, hopefully the efforts of Hanney History Group and the archaeology carried out on the site will reveal more in the fullness of time. Stuart Cakebread, Churchwarden, St James the Great, Hanney.

I read an article during the recent very hot weather that talked about how difficult it is for homeless people to get enough to drink in a heat wave. So many public toilets require at least a 20p payment. Shops are reluctant to give out cups of water and water fountains and public taps are a thing of the past. It is often the case that homeless people are moved on from shady parks and so suffer in the direct sunlight.

Reading the article coincided with a training evening that we were having at the Church where we learnt about Safeguarding young people and vulnerable adults in our churches. During the meeting a homeless gentleman interrupted us and asked for prayer. At first we wondered if it was a practical demonstration set up by Pat our trainer! However it wasn't and Sally and I took the gentleman into a side room where we quickly discovered that it was not prayer he required but permission to sleep in the churchyard, a lift to a job interview in the morning and batteries for his radio.

Sally had a sleepless night feeling concerned for the man and worrying that we should have done more to help. As she lay awake, praying, she felt very strongly that God said to her 'feed him'. In the morning I was dispatched with a big plate of breakfast which he enjoyed sitting in the Remembrance garden in the sunshine and later when I gave him a lift to his job interview his back pack bulged with the large, nutritious picnic lunch Sally had provided.

The next night Sally found it hard to sleep again, 'Did God mean feed him physically or spiritually?' she worried.

In fact the man had a well-thumbed bible and quoted a lot of scripture during our conversation. My point in telling you this is that I believe as Christians God calls us to do both Christian practical care, and to be ready to talk to other's in all walks of life about our faith.

Jesus says in John 7 v 37 'If anyone is thirsty let them come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within them.' So lets all be open to receiving from Jesus so that we can flow with living water to others. God has promised to guide and strengthen us for the task. Isaiah 58 v 11 'The Lord will guide you always, he will satisfy your needs in a sun scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail.' A beautiful promise and challenge for us all.

Obituary Dudley Iles 1st February 1934 - 30th July 2018

Dudley was born in Guisley, Yorkshire on 1.2.34 - always very convenient! Although he spent most of his life in Hanney, he remained a true Yorkshireman.

He became interested in birds at a very young age and kept his bird diaries from the age of 13 until his last year. He studied Biology at Leeds University, and in 1960 he became Head of Biology at King Alfred's School, Wantage, and taught many of Hanney's villagers and their children. Apart from two years in Geneva, teaching at the International School, he remained at King A's all his teaching life. Many will remember his field trips to Norway, France, Spain, Greece and Iceland amongst others. During the school holidays he led Natural History trips for a more mature clientele- notably for 'Town and Gown', in Oxford, and 'Questers', an American firm. He also did a lot of lecturing, always on aspects of Natural Historythe Hanney Gardening Club, History Group and the W.I. all benefitted from his enthusiastic and knowledgeable discourses.

In 1986 he took early retirement, so enabling him to concentrate on work in the village as well as travelling. This culminated in two years in Zanzibar with VSO in 1993, where he trained young Zanzibaris to be environmental officersnot a common concept in Africa. He was known to all as 'Baba Ndege'- Grandfather Bird. Many long holidays, to Africa, India, South America among others meant lots of new birds to add to his lists. He and Penny organised ornitho-

logical tours to Texas which were a great success, then in 2004 he started giving lectures on cruises which again took him to amazing places round the world. He was part of the BTO's Bird Atlas project, counting birds regularly, as he also did at Chimney Meadows, a BBOWT reserve.

His welcome at St James' School gave him great pleasure- he helped establish the after- school Environmental Club, and acted as an unpaid odd-job man! He was instrumental in establishing the Community Woodland through his friendship with Nigel Eady, the pair of them would spend hours putting up nesting boxes and checking on the progress of the saplings (now mature trees). He kept records of the numbers of blue tits which fledged every year, and knew where to find the orchids and other rare wild flowers.

He and Paul Sayers wrote the Millennium Walk round Hanney, still on sale in the Village Shop, which tells of the wildlife which can be seen as you follow the trail.

Throughout his life he enjoyed painting the birds and other wildlife seen on his travels, especially in Africa. Many in the village possess one of his pictures, either as a present or won at a raffle! Dudley was above all a man with many talents and gifts who had the ability to share them freely with whomsoever he came into contact. He will be greatly missed by all his family and friends.




