

East Hanney Parish Council

At its August meeting, East Haney Parish Council decided to change the schedule of its monthly meetings. The new day will be the second Wednesday of the

month rather than the first. Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the second Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop and on the Council's website a week in advance.

In August, the skip by the village hall was refused collection as it was seriously overloaded. At its September meeting, the Council decided to change the provision so the skip will be in the village for half an hour only, with the driver waiting to take it away. Skips will, from October on, only be at the Hall as there is limited space at Snuggs Lane. They will also now be provided on Saturdays. So, starting on the 13th October, at 11am (leaving at 11.30am), the skip will be in the overflow car park of the Hall. The future dates will be 8th December and 16th February. At its October meeting, the Parish Council will be discussing the possibility of installing 'gates' at the entrances to the village, similar to the picture. Should



you want to attend the meeting to give your views, please do come along. The Parish Council meetings for the remainder of the year are on the second Wednesday of the month, starting at 8pm, as follows: **10th October, 14th November, 12th December, 9th**

January, 13th February, 13th March and 10th April.

If being a Parish Councillor is something you have thought you might like to try, then it will be of interest to you to know that the next elections are in May 2019, when the Parish Council will be expanding to 8 members. If you are interested in the village and its community, and would like to be instrumental in helping to shape its future, please consider standing. West Hanney Parish Council

Your Parish Council is delighted to report that we have finally been successful in being granted Land Registry title to the land on the southern side of School Road. Many residents have helped over the past 8 months or so in providing 'Statements of Truth' to

support our claim. Thank you to all. Your written evidence in supporting our claim was crucial. Excepting one small area which the Registry omitted, due probably to the deviation of a thick line on the original County Map, we now

have title from our existing holdings around and across The Green to Cow Lane. This success should now enable us to block any attempt to gain access for future developments in the field between the two villages.

An application has been submitted to the Vale Planners for the conversion of Deans Farmhouse in Church Street, into two houses together with the building of a further seven new properties on the site.

Also of interest is that Lidl have applied to build a new supermarket with

associated car parking in the field adjacent to the existing small Business Park, and in front of the bungalow visible from the road. Grove and Wantage residents are concerned that, together with the new nursing home to be built past the allotments, the gap



between the two communities will soon be eroded. We in the Hanneys should probably be more concerned as to the extra traffic that will use the A338 when all the planned houses are built and occupied; some-

where in the region of 4,500/5,000 new properties in total. County Highways are looking at improvements to the East Hanney/Steventon Road junction, but it could be argued that it is the southernmost junction that will be worse affected, as most commuters driving through West Hanney use this route to the main road. The danger for East Hanney is that if traffic lights are installed at the Steventon Road junction then through traffic will use Main Street to get a quicker exit to the A338.

Very disappointing news re the proposed car park extension

....You'll recall that a great deal of time, effort and persuasion was put into trying to get a much needed additional car park at the Village Hall, since on regular occasions, lack of space has meant potentially dangerous situations have arisen. Thanks to Graham Garner's massive input, planning permission was granted and applications for grants were made. However, it now appears that it's going to be very difficult to get one. A total of £43k is needed - vikes! - and though efforts are continuing to try and source funding from elsewhere, it's currently not looking very promising. Maybe a massive fund-raising campaign within the community is needed?

And more bad news on the A338 pedestrian crossing -

another essential and urgently needed addition to our local infrastructure. It was discussed at the Sept meeting of the East Hanney Parish Council (EHPC) and the news, bluntly, is that whilst all recognise that it should have been constructed a long time ago, there is now simply no money available. Whilst I would hesitate to disagree with the learned Councillors, another way of phrasing that would be to say that **there are no specific funds allotted to it.** In other words, funds would need to be diverted from other projects in the County.

In an email I received from Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Highways back in Feb when I started to chase this whole issue, they said, and I quote...'I am investigating whether funds could be reallocated away from other projects and onto this one, as I believe the scheme has many

benefits'

Even given that this was some 7 months ago, it still gives me cause for a scintilla of optimism.

Clearly, we now need to start collectively 'making a fuss' over this. I have already recently emailed the gent whom I quoted above, asking for the latest news and whether he shared EHPC's pessimistic view. He acknowledged receipt of my email and will be responding soon he promises. We now need to start emailing the following 'public servants.' I should say that they are not necessarily in a position to actively influence the way OCC allocate their funds, but they need to be made aware of the depth of feeling. and encouraged to try and excerpt pressure on OCC.

Matt Barber is our local District Councillor, and his contact details are on page 4. (He and the Vale District Council have no control over OCC.) Mrs Anda Fitzgerald-O'Conner is our County Councillor, and has already promised to try and influence the bean counters at OCC to allocate some funds...no success thus far. A quick email to her would reinforce the message. anda.fitzgerald@oxfordshire.gov.uk Finally, there's our MP Ed Vaizey....his contact details are also on page 4. What else can we do? Well, in it's own way, volunteering to be part of the Speedwatch team helps. I've covered their splendid efforts several times in the past. Let's try and encourage folk who drive through our community to do so within the speed limit. Hanney Cricket Club has been in the news recently as it struggles to

keep going. It would be a great shame if it folded...it's been around a while. See this from the Hanney Parish magazine of July 1879, over 139 years ago!

'The Members of the Hanney Cricket Club commenced playing a match with a Wallingford team on Whit Monday, but, owing to the wet weather, they were compelled to give up after the Hanney side had been in once and the others not at all'.

Also effected by bad weather was the third Annual Horticultural Show in 1877...

'which was held in the Schoolroom. Unfortunately, the day turned out very wet and, consequently, the attendance was small. The Show itself was a complete success. The articles exhibited, especially the vegetables, being pronounced superior to those of former years.'

Finally, from Dec 1879, was this the first advert ever to appear in Hanney News?' 'Mr T Stroud, West Hanney, begs to inform the inhabitants of Hanney and the neighbourhood that he is prepared to undertake all kinds of painting, glazing, and paper-hanging etc on the most moderate terms for cash'.

THE CHURCH OF FNGLAND

Dear Friends,

I will come back to that email later. It's not the best time to make that phone call. That job can be done tomorrow. I just don't want to do it!

My guess is that at some point, you have said one of these phrases. I know I have! There are times when we just put things off; we procrastinate.

Recent research has shown that due to the size of our amygdala, the part of our brains that deals with our emotions and motivations, impacts our levels of procrastination. Those with a larger amygdala are more likely to procrastinate because they are more effected by their emotions and are anxious about the things that they do and their consequences.

What has also been shown is that we can change the way we emotionally respond to situations and improve our ability to get things done.

Jesus spoke to his disciples about worry and anxiety and said: "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?"

Having a relationship with God means that we can trust that he will be with us, wants the best for us and will be active in our lives. There are certain things that we can change in our lives and certain things that we can't. I have found it helpful to work out which things, that I am worrying about are out of my control and which things, no matter how big or intimating they are, I can do something about, no matter how small that might be. Jesus' advises that we should "not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

We can build resilience and strengthen our ability to get things done by remembering who and what is on our side, focusing on what we can change (rather than what we can't) and taking it one day at a time. With God's help we can take small steps to tackle the big things in our lives.

Obituary Lionel Cousins 13th September 1934 - 5th August 2018

Lionel grew up in Surrey, qualifying in 1954 as a chemical engineer. Throughout his professional life he worked at But perhaps the two roles Lionel will most be remembered for were the periods he served as a Parish Councillor,

AERE Harwell. Radioactive contamination and early computers were two of the areas he specialized in. Following a major reorganization of the site, Lionel was pleased to take early retirement in 1993. With his wife Angela and three young children -Roger, Adam and Jenny - he moved to Hanney in 1970, and soon set about getting involved in village life.



and as a Trustee of the Hanney Parochial Charity. Lionel was invited to join West Hanney Parish Council soon after arriving in the village. He served for a total of 39 years, including three as Chair. As a Charity Trustee, Lionel served for over 30 years, 15 of them as Chairman. Both roles could be demanding at times, but Lionel's

dedication was an inspiration to others. As a young man, Lionel was a very keen and able sportsman; cricket, football and badminton were three favourites. More recently he could be found on the golf course at Frilford.

He also enjoyed gardening - soft fruit and veg a specialty of his - and loved his home, the village and the community in which he and his family lived, and to which he gave such outstanding service. Finally of course, Lionel was a family man and was never happier than when spending time with them, including his nine grandchildren.

I only got to know Lionel in his later years, when the very cruel condition Parkinson's had taken hold, but he was invariably great company, always positive and keen to know what was happening in the community. Lionel will be greatly missed by all who knew him, and we send our sincere condolences to Angela and his family. *Jim Stagg*

He recognised a demand for local scouting, so in 1972 he helped set up the '1st Hanneys Scout Group'. Much time and effort was needed to organise it, recruit leaders, get equipment and raise funds. Lionel's garage became the equipment store and after 18 months, the group expanded to include cubs. At it's peak in the 1990s the Group had around 120 young people enjoying Scouting, Lionel was group Chairman for 8 years, before becoming Chair of the District, responsible for 12 local groups. He then moved on to the County where he was Treasurer for 14 years. Other roles in the village included working in the bar at the Village Hall...hard work, and usually on a Saturday night...serving noisy partygoers, and having to clear up afterwards! For some years Lionel was part of the team that made regular trips to the 'cash and carry' in Oxford to keep the village Community Shop stocked.


