
Editorial Juncker has in mind for our green and pleasant land.

Once a few puzzles have been collected in the 'library' you'll be able to swap them. Other things are also planned for the coffee mornings - I'll keep you posted, so do come on down, meet some friends and make some new ones. This photograph, of the St James Church restoration in

1959, was taken by Trevor Herman. His wife Mavis has passed it to me along with the following note...

"The bells were re-hung by Whites of Appleton in the Spring of 1960 and were actually rung for the first time at our wedding by bell ringers from Wantage. The bells were not dedicated until June 1960. The Hanney ringers were then formed, led by Mr Dolan and Mr Bob Breakspeare. Trevor rang Number 5 Bell for



many years. Sadly we think that Trevor is the only one 'still standing' from that time. It would be interesting to know if anyone else has memories from that time in the Belfry." Many thanks Mavis for loan of the pic, and if anyone does have any bell ringing memories, do get in touch.

Of course, bell ringing's been happening for a long time...here's a article from the Hanney Parish Magazine of Dec 1876.

"We hear that a society of handbell ringers has been formed in our parish and a set of 12 bells purchased, the pleasing tones of which it is hoped, will from time to time help to enliven the long winter evenings."

And something that you may have thought is a relatively modern concept, the inspecting of our schools, turns out to be nothing new. This from Aug 1879...

"The School was examined by the Rev C D Du Port, Her Majesty's Inspector of Schools, on Wednesday and Thursday July 2nd and 3rd. There were 113 children present on the first day and 111 on the next. The report on the school was:... "The general working and results of this school are successful and creditable to the Master's energy."

This final excerpt from July 1875 shows that even 144 years ago, a dim view was taken of those who didn't send their children to school regularly....

"A meeting was held at the school to pass the yearly accounts and sign necessary papers in readiness for HM Inspector who will examine school on 12th. A resolution was passed that those parents whose children attend school irregularly shall be required to pay double fees."

You will have noticed when walking near the Iron Bridge and the allotments that the Berry Lane footpath and the one along the edge of the allotments have been resurfaced, with most work done on the parts that get really muddy. On the topic of paths, the PC has, in association with the County Council and local groups, offered to provide the funding to replace the stile at the end of Snuggs Lane with a kissing gate and the PC hopes that this access will be improved soon.

As winter is with us, the PC has invested in a road salt bin and a separate stock of road salt. The bin is by the overflow car park at the Hall. This should help keep the paths around the Hall and fields clear of ice. Villagers are welcome to take a small amount to allow them to clear the footpaths outside their own properties. As reported last month, the main routes through the village have been swept and the gullies emptied and jetted. Following positive feedback from residents, your



PC decided to continue this service twice a year, starting in April 2019 and it is hoped this will help in maintaining the appearance of our village. This will come at a cost though, and reluctantly the PC has decided that it will no longer be

providing skips for villagers to use after the one that is arranged for February 2019. To ensure that contributions from developers are used, the PC will be holding a special meeting on the 3rd January. Discussions will be centred on how your Council can best spend the funds accrued for specific

amenities such as improving the play area, sports facilities and public art projects. Members of West Hanney PC will be invited so projects can be agreed across the wider community. Talking of which, East Hanney, West Hanney and Garford Parish Councils will be meeting in January to discuss ways in which we can help each other with things that affect all our communities.

West Hanney Parish Council

The church authorities have asked that we make a request to all attendees to please park their cars facing the church and not parallel to the road. This allows far more vehicles to get close to the entrance which is especially important to the elderly and less abled. Drivers should also refrain from parking on other grass areas as there are drains beneath and spring bulbs starting to come through. The surfaces are also being damaged especially during wet weather.

Local Elections for Parish Councillors will be held next May, and there are likely to be vacancies in West Hanney. If you would like to give something back to the village and become a Councillor, then please contact any current member of the PC for information.

Plans are well advanced to purchase a Speed Monitoring device that will give a visual '30mph - SLOW DOWN' message and record the speed and number of vehicles for periodic analysis. The unit being considered will be portable so it can be moved to various locations within the village.

As villagers go home happy after the final curtain call.



Dear Friends,

I want to begin this year by saying a BIG THANK YOU.

There are so many of you who contribute to the beauty of our church and churchyard, to the running of our various activities and Acts of Worship. Thank you.

A few years ago Hanney church finances had become sorely stretched. In 2014 the general fund ended up with a significant shortfall, although we did manage to pay all our bills; the reserves were essentially exhausted. In 2015, we set out to increase our income under the banner of "Please help secure the future of St James Hanney".

Since 2015 through the generosity of many in Hanney and beyond we secured the future of St James. Many of you give by standing order; this means that we have funds this year and beyond. Others give one off donations. Then, of course, the Chancellor of the Exchequer made his contribution of Gift Aid (gave us back the tax) on what you give. The overall church finances year on year are now broadly in balance.

Your Churchwardens, the PCC, Alec and I are immensely grateful for your generosity. THANK YOU.

Please never forget that all the costs of keeping St James a living and active church have to be met by your generosity. Nothing comes from the Church of England centrally. There is a Fabric Fund set up by the past generosity of parishioners but this is restricted to use for the maintenance of the church fabric.

I don't need to tell you that St James is the parish church of both East and West Hanney. It is YOUR church. Thank you for continuing to give generously.

Your generosity has been a great encouragement to us who are involved in the day-to-day running of the church so that it is available to all.

2019 will be an exciting year for St James. We plan to make improvements so that the Church building will be more useable not just for worship but also for the community as a whole. We plan to install a lavatory, kitchenette and a few other enhancements. The plans for these are on display in the church. In 2019 we seek to raise the finance and carry out the improvements. I hope to inform you more about this exciting and necessary project later this year.

As I try to express my sincere thanks to you, two quotes from St Paul come to mind; in his letter to the Philippian Christians he says "I thank my God every time I remember you ... the gifts you sent are a fragrant offering." And I do thank God for you, because to the Christians at the small city of Colossae he wrote "whatever you do whether in word or deed do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ giving thanks to God the Father through Him"

Thank you; may 2019 be a year for which you can be thankful too.




