East Hanney Parish Council

East Hanney Parish Council has arranged for a road closure to allow the Remembrance Day parade to pass as smoothly as possible on Sunday 10th November 2019. The roads closed for the parade will be in both East and West Hanney. The parade will run from the Hanney Royal British Legion in East Hanney to St James the Great in West Hanney. The full list of road closures is:

Mill Orchard – Brookside – The Causeway – School Road – The Green – Church Street.

The roads will be closed for the duration of the parade to and from the Church but will be open in between, with closures being from 10:30am to 11:30am and 12:15pm to 13:15pm (approximately). Should you want to help marshal the route, please contact the RBL Hanney or East Hanney's Clerk.

With road safety in mind, and following the example set by our friends and neighbours in West Hanney, East Hanney PC has decided to install a number of poles on which to site vehicle activated sped indicator devices (SIDs). The plan is to install 5 poles at sites agreed with Oxfordshire County Council and informed by the data the PC and OCC have gathered over recent months. The PC will purchase one SID initially, and apply for grants to enable it to purchase another 2 over the coming year. It is with pleasure that the PC can announce that a new cricket club will be making the village its home next season. This club will enter the Oxfordshire league and the PC hopes that we will be able to hear the thwack of leather on willow on a regular basis once more. The Council resolved at its October meeting to replace the bollard lights on Brookside. A wooden bollard will be purchased to replace each. It is hoped that wood will be less affected by canine scent marking and weakening from games of leapfrog, and will be a more attractive feature.

The Council has resolved to alter its meeting dates for the remainder of the Council's year. The dates are as follows: 13th November 2019; 4th December 2019; 15th January 2020; 12th February 2020; 4th March 2020 and 8th April 2020.

All meetings are on Wednesdays and start at 7.30pm.

Neighbourhood Plan Consultation Launch – November 1st

I am very pleased to announce that the Parish Council is launching the Public Consultation stage of our Neighbourhood Plan on Friday November 1st. We have completed the development stage working with our consultants, Community First Oxfordshire, and the Vale of White Horse District Council. It is now time to share our Plan with the community and statutory bodies over a

six week period, and for you to give your comments on it. We will publish the Plan and associated documents on the West Hanney PC website:

All West Hanney residents are invited to download and read the Neighbourhood Plan documents and if you wish to make any comments, please fill in the Consultation Feedback form and return it to npwhpc@gmail.com by 5pm on December 13th 2019. Paper copies of the Plan and the consultation response form will also be available in the Hanney Community Shop. Feedback forms can be returned to the Shop, Please contact your Parish Councillors if you have any questions about the Plan or the consultation process.

The Plan will also be sent to the statutory consultees such as the Vale of White Horse District Council and all responses will be considered for inclusion in the final version. We will hold a Public meeting in the Hanney War Memorial Hall at 8pm on Monday 11th November so that your Councillors can present the Plan to the residents of West Hanney and answer any questions you may have. We hope you will be able to attend.

Serious Pothole Hazard

Several residents have reported multiple potholes on the section of road to the south of the Green that links School Road to Church Street. They have been informed that Oxfordshire County Council does not own or maintain that section of road and not only will not fix the potholes, but will not pay any compensation for any vehicular damage or personal injury caused by the potholes. The Parish Council do not own that section of road and are not responsible for the repair. We are currently disputing the ownership with OCC and until that is resolved, we advise everyone using that section of road to be aware of the damaged surface and try to use an alternative route.



Dear Friends

Both the memorials in St James church that commemorate the 1st World War end in 1919 which is 100 years ago. It is also 80 years since the start of the 2nd World War and I hope you have taken the opportunity to look at the excellent exhibition which the Hanney History Group have displayed about Hanney in 1939 in St James Chancel.

As we recall the great sacrifices of both military and civilian personnel during those conflicts and subsequently, we are reminded of how much the peoples of the United Kingdom have contributed to the security, freedom and peace, particularly in Europe as well as the rest of the world.

I am writing this whilst there is still uncertainty about "Brexit" and it is quite likely that, as you read my letter, such uncertainty continues though perhaps in a different form. On top of the divisions which this seems to be causing in the United Kingdom we are facing a variety of other challenges and concerns. Social Media seems to have the effect of highlighting our different view points, attitudes and responses to life, so more than ever we still require peace. We need a peace that cares for neighbours, encourages prosperity, produces respect for all and allows us to live in harmony even though we are different. May I invite you to read the statement from the House of Bishops which is on the Church of England website and calls us to listen and speak respectfully to everyone, since the teachings of Jesus, challenging us to be generous and humble servants, apply to all, especially our leaders.

Or perhaps you would like to read the Bishop of Oxford's letter (see Oxford Diocesan website) which includes 12 ways to love your neighbour – a Brexit checklist. His last suggestion is to pray for peace so in your Remembrance why not include a prayer for the wellbeing of our community and country so that the selfless sacrifice of previous generations was not given in vain. Simpler still, read the beatitude (Matthew 5 : 9)

Blessed are the peacemakers for they will be called children of God.
