



East Hanney Parish Council

The Remembrance Day parade was well attended as usual and the Councils and members of the parade thank all road users for their understanding during the closures.

Next year is the 75th anniversary of VE Day and East Hanney Parish Council is beginning to plan how it can best support local people who wish to mark the occasion.

The Parish Council has resolved to undertake a full review of the play and sports facilities in the village. It is seeking advice from the Oxfordshire Playing Field Association to make the best use of its land, and is hoping to provide a larger play area, two full sized football/rugby type pitches and the cricket pitch. The pavilion will be replaced with a purpose built structure and more benches will be provided for people to watch the games or to sit and

relax whilst their children play.

The Council understands that this work could take many years to complete and it will be looking to fund it from developer contributions and its own reserves, making up shortfall with other grants, and could seek a loan from the Public Works Loan Board.

It is hoped that the village gates and poles for Speed Indicator Devices will be installed early in 2020. The Council will be purchasing one device initially, of the same type as West Hanney have installed. This will be mounted on each the poles for a period of two weeks and further devices will be added in the future.

The Council would like to thank the team behind Hanney News for again waiving the fees for the monthly article in 2020-21.

The Council has resolved to alter its meeting dates for the remainder of the Council's year. The dates are as follows:

4th December 2019; 15th January 2020; 12th February 2020; 4th March 2020 and 8th April 2020.

All meetings are on Wednesdays and start at 7.30pm.

West Hanney Parish Council

Neighbourhood Plan Consultation – Have your say.

The Parish Council launched the Public Consultation stage of our Neighbourhood Plan on Friday November 1st, despite a last-minute hitch caused by the announcement of the General Election. During the run-up to the Election, District and County Councils enter a 'Purdah' period which prevents them from responding to our consultation. We therefore decided to extend the consultation period to seven weeks. It will now finish at 5pm on Friday December 20th.

A public meeting was held on Monday November 11th, in the Village Hall, attended by a small but engaged audience, to look at the Plan and it's policies. We were very pleased that it was positively received by the attendees who took the opportunity to question the councillors about the Plan. I hope you have taken the opportunity to visit our website,

www.westhanneypc.org.uk, to download the Plan and associated documents by clicking on Parish Council – Neighbourhood Plan – Plans. Please take the time to download and return the feedback form to npwhpc@gmail.com by the consultation deadline on December 20th as we need to know all your views. A paper copy of the Plan documents is available to view in the Hanney Community Shop for residents who do not have access to the internet together

with paper copies of the Feedback form which can be returned to the Shop. Please contact your Parish Councillors if you have any questions about the Neighbourhood Plan or the consultation process.

Highway issues in West Hanney

The flooding problem in Church Street has still not been resolved and almost led to route problems for the annual Remembrance Day parade. We are very grateful to Nikki and Peter Kauert who came to the rescue on that morning by pumping up the flood water into a tanker to clear access to the Church. Oxfordshire County Council are now fully engaged in resolving the problem and drain clearance is now planned.

Serious Pothole Hazard

I reported last month on the ownership issues of the section of road to the south of the Green that links School Road to Church Street. We are now in discussion with Oxfordshire County Council officers about the adoption of that road and we have erected signs to warn drivers, cyclists and pedestrians about the condition of the road which has many potholes. We advise everyone using that section of road to be aware of the damaged surface and try to use an alternative route.



Last month I published this photograph

in connection with an exhibition of portraits of WW2 veterans that's currently on at the Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum, Woodstock, until 5th Jan, 2020.

I said I had no idea who the splendid old gent was.

Now I have...his name is Reg Charles and he's aged 96. Reg was a Corporal in the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry. He helped to secure two key bridges in Normandy, just hours before the Allied beach assault on June 6, 1944. Reg is the last surviving member of the regiment. Reckon we owe him our thanks.





Young and old alike gathered for our usual Remembrance Day Parade, followed by a service in St James Church. Well done to all involved, especially the Wantage Silver Band, our own Royal British Legion and all the different organisations who attended this rather special annual occasion.

Also a big thank you to A Plant Lux Hire of Kingston Bagpuize who supplied, free of charge, the road blocks used during the parade to keep everyone safe.



We're getting a new set of bollards! Our original pair - outside the Community Shop - have now sadly both succumbed to the weather and the habit of doggies to use them as a toilet.

We've been down to one for some time, but just the other day, this sole survivor sadly gave up the fight and collapsed onto the grass...still shining a light, but exposing lots of wires and other dangerous looking bits. Rightly considered to be a hazard, it was swiftly removed. East Hanney Parish Council are on the case and a new pair - hopefully a bit more wee wee proof! - has been ordered. They'll be installed soon. Well done Councillors say I!

I'm a big fan of our Flood Group who send me regular updates on their monthly working parties, as they endeavour to ensure we never again experience the dreadful floods of 2007, and a few since. Their latest missive mentions the following...

Still on flooding, big thanks must go to Nicky and Pete Kauert for pumping 6,000 gallons of floodwater from in front of St James Church in West Hanney on the morning of the Remembrance Day parade to allow it to take place without everyone needing to wear their wellies or waders.

I am sure that we all lose it, at least once a day.

I didn't used to lose it that often when I was younger.

We aim to keep hold of it wherever we go.

But now everyone loses it once in a while.

Usually down the back of the sofa!

Many of us carry our mobile phones with us all the time. They allow us to connect with people wherever we are. Also, our phones allow us to play music, use apps, update our social media and play a quick game, whenever we want to.

Over the summer, I did a talk comparing prayer to a mobile phone. We can take it wherever we go, we can use it to connect with God and it allows us to do different things.

Prayer can give us an opportunity to focus on God and to switch off from other distractions; prayer can help us to give time to reflect on our life, be open to God and to just be still and quiet. Sometimes we need to turn on flight-mode and switch off from the world around us.

There are lots of different ways that we can pray; quietly, out loud, through singing, by writing and drawing, while walking, on our own or with others. We can pray about our own lives, the lives of others, thank God, say sorry to God, yell at God, be still before God and ask for God's guidance. Whatever we need to do in life, there is an app for that; in whatever way we might want to express ourselves to God, there is a prayer for that too.

If you want to think a bit more about prayer, I would recommend the book "How to pray: a simple guide for normal people" by Pete Greig. It is available online or down at the Cornerstone book shop, in Grovelands Shopping Centre, Savile Way, Grove. This is a good read and a very easy book to dip in and out of; it is very insightful, down-to-earth and practical.

Even if prayer is not your thing, as a culture we are realising the benefits that prayer, reflection, or mindfulness, can have for us as human beings. Maybe you could give yourself sometime and space just to be, to reflect on what's going on in your life, to be thankful for what is good, to consider what lays ahead for your and to work out what you want your priorities to be.

I find that prayer helps me to do these things; however you choose to do it, it is always worthwhile tuning out what's going around you, to consider what's going on inside you.




Dear Editor




