COVID 19.... This from Steve McKechnie, Chair of East Hanney Parish Council....

"I am sure that not many people knew that within our villages there is a Community Response Team, set up to assist the Emergency Services. We have all seen on TV community centres being taken over for stranded travellers in bad weather, or being used for flood victims and may have wondered how that happened - it only happened as a result of planning.

David Stubbington is the Chair of the team that includes representatives of both Parish Councils and The Hanneys Flood Group, amongst others.

Responding to the unprecedented situation we find ourselves in, the Hanney Covid-19 Community Response Team set up a phone line and email address, and printed and delivered a leaflet to every household in the Hanneys. Within days, villagers were volunteering to assist the vulnerable or those self-isolating. The potential issues had been identified, protocols established and tasks allotted, and within hours of the local emergency number being issued, prescriptions were being collected, delivered and shopping trips undertaken. In addition,

our Community Shop has made incredible efforts to stay stocked and quickly had a protective screen installed for everyone's safety.

Funding to support the Hanney Covid-19 Community Response Team was agreed between East and West Hanney Parish Councils as funding was required immediately.

To date the team has over 100 volunteers and is assisting over 40 people in need within our villages. This response has shown what an amazing community we are, and we would like to thank everyone who has volunteered to help. It is much appreciated!

East Hanney Parish Council

With the Covid-19 restrictions in place, in common with all other small authorities, East Hanney Parish Council has had to respond to and comply with the Coronavirus Act 2020 and conceive a way of meeting remotely whilst still enabling members of the public to attend. It has been decided across the country to use the videoconferencing platform 'Zoom', who will be offering paid for packages at a discount to small authorities.

At its remote meeting on the 4th April 2020, EHPC resolved to try a new meeting pattern. Rather than a monthly meeting that tries to cover all aspects of our busy Parish Council's work, a new pattern, with a meeting every 3 weeks has been drawn up. Not all meetings will look at the same aspects, with dedicated Planning & **Development Meetings, and meetings** combining Planning & Development with either Council business, or with Recreation & Leisure. Terms of reference will be drawn up to be considered at EHPC's annual meeting on 6th May 2020. The pattern will start on the 20th May 2020 with a full Council business meeting, dates for the year are below and will be on the Council's website and Facebook Page in due course. It is hoped the new pattern will allow a more timely response to Planning applications and give more time for the other important business of our small Council. The Annual Meeting of Parish

Electors, unless cancelled on advice of Government, will go ahead in late May.

As you will read elsewhere, EHPC, in conjunction with WHPC, is supporting the community response to Covid-19. Part of our support has been to apply for grants and funding, providing for example the screen in the village shop, and the Community Response team's phone line.

Finally, delegated powers were agreed at the meeting, enabling the Council to make time-critical decisions without recourse to a council meeting whilst we are working under restrictions.

Drainage issues in West Hanney

The Parish Council has been contacted by the Oxfordshire County Council Highways Department and informed that despite the lockdown, essential repair work is continuing, and they are planning to complete the repair to the drainage pipes in the vicinity of St James Way.

All residents of the Church Farm and The Orchard developments will be contacted by the Highways Department to inform them of the date of the work and the access arrangements whilst the work is taking place.

The next "virtual" Parish Council meeting is the Annual Council Meeting on Tuesday May 19th at 7.30pm using Zoom video conferencing software. We have decided to defer the Annual Parish Meeting to a later date.

It can be fun going through a top ten, finding out what is voted number one and seeing if you agree.

Human beings have an in-built ability to compare and contrast. To assess and analyse, to come up with our own opinions about what is the best and which is better. In Luke Chapter 22, Jesus' friends are arguing about who is the greatest; I wonder what arguments were they making, what examples were they giving. Jesus breaks this up, saying that they should be like children and servants. Then he gives a strange example. He asks who is greater, a master who sits at the table or the servant that waits on them? The master. This seems to go against his first point. But Jesus goes on to say that he came to serve others.

What makes us great, is not the role we have, our position, or job, or reputation, or abilities. It's how we live out that role. What is our attitude to the things we do and the people around us?

Jesus knew who he was, the son of God, God's chosen one. That was his role. But his attitude in doing this, was that of a servant. He came to help others. Jesus encourages us to be childlike not childish; to be a team player, even if we are the team leader.

Being great is not just about what we do, it's about how we do it. We can be successful but alienate others. We can be incredibly talented but outrageously selfish. We can use other people, just to fulfil our own desires. How we treat others is an indication of the type of person that we are.

Jesus' challenge to us is not to have a low opinion of ourselves, but to have such a high opinion of others that we are motivated to care for them, support them, love them and serve them. The disciples were worried about how great they were. Jesus was motivated by how great he thought everyone else was.

She did her SRN training at The Old Radcliffe Infirmary in Oxford and loved her job as a Staff Nurse and made many good, lifelong friends who she kept in touch with socially and through the Radcliffe Guild of Nurses where she attended their annual reunion.

I'm sure everyone who knew Di will remember her lovely stories about her times as a nurse.

While she was a nurse, she met her husband , Malcolm , who had moved from Yorkshire to work in the Civil Service in Oxford .

In Oct 1961, they bought Sunrise Cottage in St Ebbes Lane for \pounds 3,750 with sitting tenants in situ.

Eddie Tarry and his son Cyril both kept their garden beautifully and after his father passed away, Cyril lived in the renovated flat, keeping his own shed, for the rest of his life, and helped to keep the garden tidy.

Di married Malcolm and had three daughters, Jacqueline, Judith and Joanne who all attended Hanney C of E Primary School.

Di was involved with many clubs and groups in the villages including W.I., Art Group, Embroidery, Senior Citizens, October Club and the Drama Group.

Her support and hard work in many of the groups resulted in her being awarded 35 years' service to The W.R.V.S.

Di's artistic flair was brought to the different groups with makeup and stage painting and many floral displays for various occasions at West Hanney Church.

Also her talents for designing and making embroidered kneelers for the church , together with other keen embroiderers, helped raise much needed funds .

When Malcolm passed away in 1992, she dedicated herself to helping others in the village, using her experience as a nurse and kindness to help with medical support and even helped one friend to speak again after suffering a stroke.

Di loved to drive everywhere and was proud of achieving her advanced driving certificate.

She was an avid supporter of community life and worked in the village shop for many years.

She supported the local shops from Bet's Shop in West Hanney back in the day, to Dews Meadow Farm Shop in present times, and of course kept Waitrose and her favourite John Lewis in business too!

Di took a big interest in the developments appearing in the village and latterly her favourite phrase would be " have you seen how many houses they are building ... " and then walk with her stick to check on their progress .

Di was very proud of the fifty seven years she was a resident of what became Ebbs Lane, and counted herself lucky to have had the pleasure of living there.


