Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) have re-opened their waste recycling centres for 'essential disposal of waste'.

It seems extraordinary


that just 10 weeks ago (as I write) the Hanney Covid-19 Community Response team was set up to support any members



commemorates World War One with, in my humble opinion, a very attractive design. The benches are on the field near the playground. A rather clever design feature is that on one side, the seat has been cut away to allow wheelchairs or buggies to be brought close to the table.

Citizens Advice can offer all sorts of help and advice. If you have problems paying your bills, they have many helpful suggestions. They've also produced a very useful piece on scam emails, which, with their permission, I have summarized here...

Use new fast-track reporting for suspicious emails...

Scam emails are becoming ever more smooth and sophisticated. If you are ever suspicious of an email, you can use a new, dedicated reporting service which is very quick and convenient.

Simply forward the email straightaway to <u>report@phishing.gov.uk</u> and the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) will investigate it. They act on every message received, analyse it and any dubious websites it links to. Government specialists can then block the criminal's email address and instruct hosting companies to remove the websites from the Internet.

Remember, if you are in any doubt, don't open the email and don't click on any of its links.

Final quick point...Always check the sender's email address because this is the only part of an email which scammers can't

> fake. There will be often be something peculiar about it...maybe an extremely long and complicated address with lots of numbers and letters, or the country code might be unfamiliar.

OK history and petrol heads, here's a little question for you...

When was this lovely photo taken and what's the make of the car?

You'll probably recognize the magnificent building - the Mill House next to Dandridge's Mill in East Hanney, but the car's not so easy.

In fact it's a make I'd never heard of before...a Star, probably a 1924 Mercury 6 cylinder tourer to be precise. Star were car makers based in Wolverhampton, who ceased trading in about 1932. They produced high end, luxury, fast cars. Did this one belong to the owner of the Mill? The number plate gives a clue...it looks like 'WB 129' and the 'WB' indicates that the car was registered in Sheffield, so maybe the owner was a visitor to the Mill from Yorkshire. There's a few examples of these rare cars still around today. One was recently advertised on the Car and Classics website for $\pounds 36,000!$

And the answer to my question regarding the date of the snap? Well, I reckon the late 1920's. Maybe you know better, and have an idea who the owner of the Mill House was at that time. That may give us a clue as to who owned the car. You can read more about the Mill House in the magnificent brochure that the Hanney History Group have produced...see page 3.

This pic and the ones I published in March were kindly donated to our History Group by Bernard Panton, who lived in the Mill House for many years, but of course not back when this photo was taken! Thanks for allowing me to use the pics.

By the way, I've been advised by Andy Robertson's lawyers that I should cease with immediate effect to suggest that he may have taken any of these photos!

Proposed merger of Hanney Pre-school and St James CE Primary School

The Vale Academy Trust (VAT) is proposing to merge Hanney Pre-school with St James CE Primary School.


The Pre-school shares a site with the school and most of the children who attend the Pre-school move on to St James' School. The two separate organisations have had a very positive relationship, and now feel the time is right to join together. The school will extend its age range to take children from two years old, and the Pre-school charity will close and transfer all its assets to the VAT as part of St James School. The Pre-school building will become the school's Nursery. There are three main reasons for making this proposal:

- To be able to offer better continuity for children who transfer to the Reception class, and offer more opportunities for joint activities between the nursery children and the main school.
- To give pre-school staff more opportunities to work with school staff and share their skills and expertise.

It will mean that the running of the provision for the youngest children will no longer rely on the goodwill of those who volunteer to be on the Preschool committee. The Pre-school has been very fortunate to have a good committee in recent times, but it can be time consuming and carries a large responsibility for the employment of the staff and managing of the accounts. By coming under the management for the school, provision for pre-school children will be managed by the permanent staff of the school, with the central team of the VAT to call on when needed.

The Trust proposes to make this change from 1st September 2020 or as soon as possible after that.

The Trust, supported by the Oxfordshire County Council, undertook a formal consultation, and submitted an application to the Regional Schools Commissioner, who will be the decision-maker on this proposed merger.

The Plough at West Hanney - our community-owned pub

Every day in these troubled times we have to deal with uncertainties. When will the lockdown end fully and when will we get back to normal? What will normal look

like? Will we be able to go to the cinema, theatre, restaurant, sports fixture and pub before a reliable vaccine is found and used? How long will this be?

In the UK there are about 130 community owned

pubs and ours in West Hanney is one of them. When we villagers joined together in 2015 and purchased our pub we did it because we didn't want our pub to close.

What a very good decision that has proved to be, because every pub in the UK that is not community-owned is now under threat and may not open again. The reason for this seems to be that in recent weeks a very large volume of parcels and packets had built up nationally and that this was a means of clearing the backlog.

So, as I understand it, all the letterboxes in the land will be devoid of Saturday letter deliveries until 6th June.

If, like me, you find this situation a trifle bizarre then a very helpful mole not a million miles from Wantage Post Office confirmed a suggestion of mine that I should write to our MP, David Johnston, asking him about the apparent necessary involvement of Parliament should the Royal Mail have any thoughts of extending this six week period.
