

Sunday 8th Nov. Royal British Legion: Remem-


brance Sunday Service: A small remembrance service




Clive Fewins has written a book...



East Hanney Parish Council are developing an exciting plan to improve facilities across the parish and we want your views. These facilities may be partly funded from recent housing developments, section 106 funds, which have to be spent within strict time-lines and on specific projects. The projects are often defined by the agreement between the Vale of White Horse District Council and the developer, and are very precisely worded. So specific in fact that they leave little scope for change; however there are some which can be influenced, and this is where we invite East Hanney residents to get involved. You are encouraged to join the virtual Full Council meeting on 4th November (on Zoom.us) to hear the proposed projects which include sports and leisure, art and other infrastructure. West Hanney Parish Council

Everyone was grateful that Storm Alex did not cause any significant flooding in West Hanney. Rainwater falling on and around Church Street drained via the surface drains to the ditch in Winter Lane and then flowed away to the north.

Thanks are due to Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Highways for their considerable work on these surface drains that was completed over the summer, and to the residents who have cleared vegetation from the ditches running alongside their property.

Thanks are also due to the resident who has worked to shore up the bank on Main Street and those residents who have cleared vegetation from footpaths and renewed fencing.

The road to Denchworth did flood and a

number of cars were stranded. OCC Highways have now surveyed the road level and that of the Childrey Brook and together with Land Drainage are going to see if any improvements are possible to reduce the risk of flooding on this section of road.

Thank you to those residents and councillors who helped with the flood warning and road closure signs and advised motorists of the flooded roads to Denchworth and in East Hanney.

It is good to see that contractors have now started to clear the untidy land south of School Road.

since that naughty one who could talk - yes really! - persuaded Eve to have a bite of his Cox's Orange Pippin - or maybe it was a Granny Smith?






'Shadowlands'

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

There is a card game called Flux.

When it's your turn, you draw a card and then you play a card. If you are able to lay down "keeper" cards that match the objective card, you win!

But...in this game, the rules change.

During your turn you can lay cards that alter the basic rules, change what the objective card is and even play a card that lets you steal cards from other players.

It's called Flux for a reason!

The great thing about it is that you don't know what will happen next.

The frustrating thing about this game is that it changes as you are playing it.

Some people love or hate Flux, for the same reasons.

How well do you cope with change?

Does it inspire you or frustrate you? Excite you or scare you?

Currently, our church services are looking at parables that Jesus told, which underline the point that Jesus changed the religious rules. People were used to a relationship with God, where they do this (worship and give sacrifices), and God does that (bless them and look after them).

Jesus changed those rules. A friendship with God was no longer about just being good. It is about having a relationship with God that is based on love and forgiveness, because of Jesus' life, not conditional on how well we follow religious rules. Following Jesus means living a life that puts God first and the needs of others before our own. Jesus has dealt with our mistakes and errors. God wants to be part of our lives, helping us to be all that he made us to be.

Jesus was a game changer. Then and now.

Michaelmas Fayre

Thank you to everyone who sent such kind and greatly appreciated messages of support when it was decided that it would not be possible to hold the Michaelmas Fayre this year.

A few activities previously arranged did take place – including (suitably managed!)

the weigh-in for the Grand Potato Challenge – won by Sue Tyack with a new record weight of potatoes of 5lb 13oz!

The Hanney Marvellous Face Mask competition was won by 9-year old Miley with her design of an island – and our Judge, Jacynth Bassett couldn't resist making a Special Award to Laura for her design of the Hanney Snake. (See photo!)

Both masks are available in S, M and L sizes – these can be ordered via info@hanneymichaelmasfayre.co.uk or are available in the Community Shop or The Plough.

Handmade in London to order, they are made from soft stretchy jersey, 3ply quilted fabric, and are designed for a comfortable, snug wear that won't irritate your skin. The high-quality fabric is breathable, and the stretchy elastic straps ensure your mask will stay in place over your nose, chin and mouth. Using eco-inks, the face coverings are created using dye-sublimation, a deep infusion printing technique, which results in a long-lasting & intense colouration that is fade-resistant. (Ooh er! Editor) Each mask is easy to care for: washable at up to 60 degrees, it lasts up to 100 washes. They are £10 each – or 4 for £35 – with



every penny of profit going to the Michaelmas Fayre Grants. And talking of the Snake – as Hanney News goes to press voting continues for the snake's name from the long list of suggestions made!

held in St James Church for the last several years, and always a great community occasion, is another victim of Covid 19.

The decision has been taken in view of clear evidence that restrictions will tighten as the pandemic worsens.

We are all being encouraged to make any purchase in retail or hospitality by card payment only, and with the scientific evidence, confirmed earlier this week, that bank notes can carry the virus for up to 28 days it would not be wise to encourage cash handling.

Very many hours of research went into consideration of both the Michaelmas and Holly and Gift Fayres, but with the overwhelming need being to protect our community, it has regrettably been decided not to proceed with this splendid event this year.

Just to add that, without exception, the announcement of the cancellation of the Michaelmas Fayre was met with great disappointment but also 100% support that the right and responsible decision had been taken.






