Wantage Who, What, Where of Reuse and Repair!

Folk will now find it easier to do their bit to help the planet thanks to a new mapping project that launched in May. The **'Who, What, Where of Reuse and Re-**

pair' is an online and print map that provides a wealth

of information on where belongings can be repaired or passed on to be reused. Community action group 'Sustainable Wantage', have created the map to help people to cut down waste, save money and support local businesses and charities by repairing or reusing a whole range of items - duvets, shoes, jewellery, electronics, furniture etc.

Jo Harvey, manager of Sustainable Wantage's community space 'The Mix', explains: "Everyone is aware that we need to conserve the Earth's fragile resources, and one of the best ways we can do this is by keeping things in the system buying second-hand, fixing things where we can and disposing of unwanted possessions in a way that extends their life by being upcycled, repaired and reused. The map gives people access to the information they need to do this easily. Stickers will be displayed in the windows of participating shops and businesses.

Playing Field Proposals -

Thank you for all the feedback; we have changed some of the original proposals to reflect concerns put forward.

The MUGA will no longer be floodlight, after listening to residents who live immediately opposite, and their concerns over the potential for disturbance in the evenings.

The specification we have laid down is that the fencing surrounding it will be the latest low-noise style, unlike many of the cheaper chain linked fence systems that are more common.

The MUGA will also be moved further west, away from the allotments, and will be less obtrusive to residents opposite.

There will be extensive landscaping between the allotments and the MUGA, and we also propose to extend this to surround the car park extension.

Much has be said about providing public toilets. We have looked into this but the costs and ongoing maintenance would be prohibitive and would mean that most of the amenities would have to be shelved to pay for them. It was proposed that the new pavilion would have toilets which would be available to all for all planned sporting events.

Regarding King Leases, we planted a wildflower meadow some four years ago and some 400 trees have been planted by the village since. When we originally entered into the lease it was agreed that we would be providing several benches but we needed the landscaping to take hold before we chose their locations.

A bowling green was suggested. We looked into this and, according to Sport England, the cost purely for the green, without any of the supporting infrastructure, would be £150,000.

East Hanney also has insufficient space to accommodate a bowling green; not many are aware that the playing fields to the west of the avenue of trees that run from the tennis courts to Kings Leases, belongs to West Hanney and is therefore outside of our jurisdiction.

We will of course, keep you updated as our plans progress.

Here's a beautiful old photo from about 1904, possibly taken in the garden of what was then the Crown Pub in East Hanney ...now a private house. The couple on the left and their children are the Butcher family who were landlord and landlady at the Crown from 1899 to 1907.

The family pictured are mum Grace, nee Harris, seated on the left, who was born in 1869. Standing next to her is her hubbie, Alfred Archbold Butcher, born in 1857. They produced two boys in quick succession, Thomas Archbold in 1889 and Frank Harris in 1890 and I assume the boy in the middle standing in a rather odd, grown up pose, holding the chain of a sleepy dog - the family pet perhaps? - in his left hand, is one of them. He would have been 14 or 15 years old. Sat on a bench together are two girls who look like twins, but I suspect they are in fact just sisters... Dorothy Gertrude, born in 1893, and Ethel May born 1895, making them aged about 11 and 9 at the time. Finally, stood next to her mum, is Margaret Victoria, who was born on 2nd January 1901, making her three years old.

They all seem to be dressed in their 'Sunday best'.

Thanks to information supplied by Paul Sayers, I can confirm that the gent with the shotgun over his left shoulder, is a gamekeeper, though I have no name for him. Perhaps he was a pub regular? He is wearing a 'billycock hat', invented around 1849 by William Coke (Billy Coke), and widely adopted by members of the profession throughout the country. They later became known as bowler hats, named after 'Bowler Brothers' who manufactured them. He is accompanied by two flat-coated retrievers, the traditional gamekeeper's dog. Note too his very smart 'spats' round his lower legs.

This is a very typical picture of its time, formal and stiff, with no smiles. The little girl rests her hand on her mother's leg, who appears to have her right hand on the child's back. Other than that there is no familiarity displayed. If you know anything more about this photo, please get in touch. I love old photos like this...you probably gathered that already.


This from Hilary, organiser...

Following the recent announcement by Boris about further easing of Covid restrictions starting on May 17th, all regular users of the Hall have been asked when they intend to return to their regular bookings.
