There's more to running a small shop than meets the eye, and when this is done by volunteers, we are always reliant on the good will and availability of everyone.

The Covid 19 lockdown has been difficult for everyone to a greater or lesser degree and sadly some businesses have not survived. Fortunately that has not been the case for Hanney Community Shop which came into its own as a valuable community resource. If you are a shop user you will know that we have greatly increased the



type and amount of stock we hold and now it's possible to buy a whole range of things and, in the main, at a very comparable price to the supermarkets. Some things may be a few pence more than Tesco or Sainsburys but at least it's local and you don't have to spend the fuel cost to

get there. The shop will never be the place where people do their weekly shop but hopefully it is the place to pop in and buy those items that you have run out of or forgotten. As long as custom continues at the current level we will be able to maintain the variety we have - so keep shopping.
