September sees the launch of East Hanney PC's "20's Plenty for Hanney" campaign, where we have joined the national campaign to call for the reduction of speed limits on all town and village roads where people and vehicles mix.

So in East Hanney this would be all the roads that are currently 30mph, excluding the A338, as this is exempt. Road safety and the speed of

traffic through our villages has

long been a concern of residents, and our speed indicators have, over the last year, shown a drop in peoples average speeds in the village. EHPC wishes to build on this



success and has purchased two "20's Plenty" bin stickers for every property in East Hanney. These should be coming through your letter box over the next month. What is this Neighbourhood Plan all about?

West Hanney Parish Council has been working on creating a Neighbourhood Plan for our community since 2016, to influence the way our village grows and develops into the future.

A public consultation meeting was held on 17 April 2016 to launch the Neighbourhood Plans for both East and West Hanney. A community survey was sent to every household in the villages in December 2016, and the results were made available and discussed at public meetings in March and May 2017.

The West Hanney Neighbourhood Plan, based on the results of the community survey, has been in development since then, overseen by the steering committee of Cllr's Graham Garner and Eddie Wilkinson. The Pre-Submission Version of our Plan was published for our community and other stakeholders to examine and comment on during a seven-week consultation period which closed on 20 December 2019. Amendments were made to the Plan in response to the comments received. The Submission Version of it was submitted to the Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) in February 2021. The plan was publicised and comments were invited from the public and stakeholders. The publicity period closed on 15 April 2021, and further amendments were made to the plan. VWHDC then appointed an independent examiner to evaluate it. The independent examiner raised some issues for clarification and modifications were made, as recommended in his report. VWHDC confirmed on 22 July 2021 that the West Hanney Neighbourhood Plan, as modified, should proceed to referendum. The Referendum Version of the Plan and supporting documents have been published on our parish council website: www.westhanneypc.org.uk and on the VWHDC website:

The Referendum will be held on Thursday 2 September 2021 from 7am to 10pm in the Hanney War Memorial Hall.

"It has been a tremendous cork collecting season at Bothy Vineyard. In the first half of this year, we have collected enough used natural corks to fill no less than 8 large sacks which are now on their way to be being sorted and re-cycled or reused under the social enterprise scheme Recorked UK.

Our network of collection points include the independent **Community Shop in Hanney,** and we are very grateful to everyone who donates there. We want to make sure that natural corks are not simply sent to landfill or incinerated, but re-used in some way. Cork re-use by Recorked UK also generates income – and

their profits are ploughed back into good causes as diverse as water sanitation projects in India, to wildlife networks in Oxfordshire (Wild Oxfordshire). To cap it all, the use of natural corks in wineries supports the long term future of biodiverse corks forests. Thank you Hanney for making the difference."

So keep drinking folks...responsibly of course!!..and taking your corks to the shop.

THE SILENCE OF THE BELLS

- The Bells of St. James Church in West Hanney are in danger of falling silent.

How sad that would be. For hundreds of years, they have called villagers to worship, rung out to celebrate Weddings, Christmas, Easter, and even on occasions Christen-

ings, and as a tribute at Funerals.

The Bells however cannot ring themselves. They need people, and Ringers are now sadly lacking. There are 6 Bells but quite often only 3 Ringers available.

Why not consider learning the skill re-



quired? It can be so much fun, and you would be well trained and supported by a friendly, mixed group. It is excellent exercise, especially if you suffer with back problems and also ensures mental stimulation. Why not go along to the Tower and sit in on a ringing

Let me tell you a story.

Once upon a time, in the 1960's. West Hanney had a grocery and off-licence shop, and a typical village shop with a post office run by the Trebble family.

East Hanney also had a typical village shop with a post office run by the Sheppherd family, and a bakery run by Ted Carter. By the early 1980's these had all closed and there was nowhere in

the village to buy food and other goods.

In the mid 1980's a group of community minded villagers put forward the idea of the village running

its own shop with volunteers serving in the shop and collecting all the stock. The shop would be run by a committee.

Thus started a whole gamut of work to raise the money and gain the necessary support from local people, all of which resulted in a portacabin being purchased to house the shop and post office. This was situated on what is now the car park by the allotments. The shop opened for business in December 1986.

By the mid 1990's the portacabin was no longer big enough for the shop's needs,



so, along with the Memorial Hall and Hanney Football club, efforts began to raise monev to fund alterations to the hall so that the shop could have space, as well as the football club having new changing rooms. Lottery money plus other grants were secured which allowed this to happen. In 1996 the shop moved, lock, stock and wheelbarrow-full into the

new premises. Since then the shop has had further alterations to increase the floor space and is the shop you now know.

Not many places can boast a shop that has been conceived, fundraised for, built and run entirely by volunteers from the village. Many of the original volunteers worked in the shop for more than 30 years and other volunteers have come along over the years. It's something we should all be proud of and continue to support, to ensure that the legacy of those first innovative people lives on for another 35 years. Dear Residents, We have a growing dog fouling issue across our district. Although there are many benefits that come with owning a dog, there are also responsibilities which include cleaning up after your dog.

Please be aware that it is an offence not to do so, or to leave used dog waste bags anywhere

other than in an appropriate bin. Under the 'Dog Fouling of Land Act 1996', allowing your dog to foul can result in an onthe-spot fixed penalty notice of £50, and incorrect disposal of dog waste bags e.g. not putting them in the bin, can result in an £80 fixed penalty notice. If fines are not paid, cases can be escalated to court resulting in fines of up to £1,000.



There are some councilowned litter hins in Hanney. These can be used for both litter and dog waste bags – vou do not need to find a specialist dog waste bin. You can also put dog waste bags in your black general waste wheelie bin, so if you cannot find a bin or they're full, please take vour baa home. We know that most residents take a lot of pride in their local area and we encourage everybody to take extra steps in keeping your parish clean and
