The 'Twenty's Plenty' campaign in East Hanney is

well under way, and big ups to the Parish Council who are leading it. Now there be them as say that's all well and good young fella, but who's going to stick to this 'ere 20mph



the new 20mph speed limit by 75% will hopefully make you slow down somewhat... maybe to the mid-twenties? Still too much, but every little helps.

I recently carried out a highly unscientific experiment. I got my

chauffeur Stig to drive me from Hanney News Global HQ here in Winter Lane, West Hanney, to the main junction on the A338 in East Hanney.

limit? My answer is that whilst not a perfect solution, it's a step in the right direction. In the past you may have been comfortable driving at 35mph through our villages. Now, knowing that you're exceeding

We then turned left onto the A338 (the 20mph limit will not be applied to it) opposite La Fontana, then left again into Ashfields Lane. Left again, past East Hanney Village Green and down to the junction with the A338. Right turn this time, back through East. and on into West and my palatial offices at HO! We made the trip twice. On the first. The Stig drove as fast as possible, within the current 30mph limit of course, obviously slowing to less than that where conditions demanded.

We then repeated the drive, only this time never exceeding 20 mph, other than that short part on the A338, and again slowing to less than that where

conditions demanded. The first trip took us 7 minutes and 54 seconds, whilst the second just 1 minute and 18 seconds longer at 9 minutes and 12 seconds.

Though I was very proud of my experiment it shows little we couldn't already have guessed... 'A 20mph trip though our 'people, dog, cat, and other living creature-populated community' really doesn't take much longer than a 30mph one.'

Still not convinced and want something a bit more scientific? Try this from **Tim Bearder, Oxfordshire County Councillor and Cabinet Member for Highways Management,** (just checked online and was mightily relieved to see that Tim does indeed sport a fine beard!) *"There is a huge appetite for this 20mph policy and new approach as towns, villages and parishes look to make their roads more pleasant and safer for pedestrians and cyclists. I believe it will become socially unacceptable to exceed 20mph in a built-up area,*

just as it is to smoke on a bus." He added "You are seven times more likely to survive *if you are hit by a car driving at 20mph than if you are hit at 30mph".* Wise words fellow beardy! (Clean-shaven David Corps repeats this in his West Hanney Parish Council piece on page 7.) More have chipped in...Jean Conway, campaign leader for '20's Plenty for Oxfordshire', said: "We need to create a new habit, a bit like wearing seatbelts. If everyone changes their behaviour, then 20mph will become accepted as the new normal." And from our very own Matthew Barber. **Police and Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley**... "Speeding is a concern raised by many communities across Oxfordshire, and indeed across Thames Valley. The setting of speed limits is a matter for local authorities and Thames Valley Police will continue to enforce in line with the speed limits that are in force." I rest my case. PS: Have fired the Stig.

bring built on the north side of the Steventon Rd - but from the time of requesting the money to actually receiving it, the estimate had risen to £80,000.

Now, given the shortages of materials and lorry driver issues, the costs have spiraled to over double the original estimate, and continue to increase.

OCC are requesting extra money from other sources, but might not be successful this

solution as soon as possible."

(Dickon devotes much of his spare time he also has a full-time job - to these efforts on our behalf, and, along with his fellow councillors, he deserves our immense gratitude.)

In the meantime, the cynic in me wonders whether the longer the project is delayed, the more its cost will increase and we may never get our crossing? Come on OCC, prove me wrong!

West Hanney Parish Council

Oxfordshire County Council's Cabinet recently endorsed the 20's Plenty Campaign which aims to make 20mph the new 30mph across Oxfordshire in most urban areas and in villages where it is both suitable and supported by residents. There is a clear link between the speed of the traffic and the likelihood of accidents happening in in which people are killed or injured. You are seven times more likely to survive if you are hit by a car driving at 20mph than if you are hit at 30mph.

West Hanney Parish Council will be discussing whether we wish to adopt this 20mph limit for West Hanney at our next meeting. Please let councillors or our Parish Clerk know whether you support this proposal.

Dear Friends

I like celebrating Christmas.

One Christmas, while I was Chaplain to the Royal Gloucestershire, Berkshire and Wiltshire Regiment based in Hounslow, I was invited by the large Fijian contingent to share their Christmas meal, along with the Commanding Officer and the Borough Mayoress. The main food was fish cooked in a milky sauce. I think all of us three guests, though privileged to be invited, secretly wanted to be home with our families.

After last year's restrictions at Christmas, many of us will be trying very hard to find time to spend with our loved ones. Though you may, like me, find that due to commitments and the fact that our family live away from us, it's impossible.

Christmas should be a time of love since we celebrate God's love in sending his Son to become a human being so he might save us from all that is not loving. How we express that love varies – it may be among our family or with strangers.

During that meal with the Fijians the Mayoress was asking me about having no weapon whilst there is fighting going on and said, "*If there was a war where would you be*?" Quick as a flash before I could answer the CO, who overheard, said "*He would be with me*!". His response implied that since the CO thought God was with me and would protect me, if I was with the CO he would be protected too.

Another reason to celebrate the birth of Christ is that he is Emmanuel –God with us. God came to be with us to rescue us from the scares, disruption, pain and evil of this world.

I like celebrating Christmas because even if life sometimes throws up more difficulties and challenges than are pleasant, we can rejoice that the Lord has promised to be with us as we trust him. As P. Brooks wrote in his carol *O come to us abide with us our Lord Emmanuel.*

So whether you are with loved ones or not, whether you are helping others less fortunate than yourselves or coping by yourself with the uncertainty of what could happen over winter, I do hope you experience the love of God as you celebrate the birth of our Saviour and know his presence with you.

We want to keep everyone safe by being able to spread out a bit more and be in a large airy and well-ventilated space and are very grateful to the Hodgson Family for their invitation.

The Fair is open from 10am – 12noon and



is an excellent way to do your Christmas shopping – or treat yourself to a little something special and at the same time support many of our local artisans and craft makers.

And while you shop we will

have an Activity Area for children to keep them entertained!

We are very aware that this is a busy time of the year and we all need to keep each other safe, so would ask you respect safe spacing, wear a mask if you are able and of course stay at home if you are unwell. I have been gently but rightly taken to task for my piece last month about the Community Woodland, in which I referred to it as the 'Millennium Wood'. The gent who contacted me pointed out that it ... "pre-dates the Millennium by several years. Nigel Eady planted it in the early 1990s for the community under an EU funded scheme



called 'Set-Aside', to take land out of farming in response to a perceived surplus in production. Remember the 'Grain Mountain' or the 'Butter Mountain' or the 'Wine Lake'?" I do indeed remember the lakes and mountains, and, apart from being happy to 'fess up' - as they say in the modern idiot - to my error, this gives me an excuse to publish the above snap I took the other day in the aforementioned wood when my wife dragged me out for a walk!
