In the past some people have managed the plots very successfully in small groups. There is an annual fee of $\pounds 5$ for a full plot, $\pounds 2.50$ a half plot. There is water on tap (so to speak!) with plenty of water points on site.

"Hello everybody! That big road the A338 is due to be shut from Mon 23rd-Fri 27th May for them to make our lovely new puffin crossing. My very clever friend Tessie Bear tells me that BT may also be working on that

road earlier in May, so be prepared for hold-ups and delays throughout the not so merry month!

She also said that there may be roadworks on School Rd, West Hanney at the end of April, so Big Ears and I will have to drive extra jolly carefully and slowly over the next few months, or PC Plod will be after us! He often gets quite angry and shouts at me in my little car ... 'Stop in the name of Plod!"

Thanks Noddy, hoping to have more



details on the May closures next month. Remember too dear motorist that from 4th April, district council car parks across the Vale of White Horse will now have only one hour free parking instead of two.

Finally, a heads-up on the Steventon Road, which, from just east of Tinkerbush Farm, will be closed from 28th April to the 29th. Times stated are between 22.00 and 06.00, **The Reservoir...**Hopefully all Hanney folk have now had a flyer through their door, stating **GARD's (Group Against Reservoir Development)** case, and it's probably fair to say that most, but not all, of us share their view, given what we currently know anyway.

I found a mention of the reservoir in a document from 1993, so it's hardly a new issue, and GARD have, since 1996 I believe, been presenting sometimes highly technical arguments assuring us all that it will be a disaster if it goes ahead, for a variety of reasons. You can read them on their website - **www.gard-oxon.org.uk**.

Thames Water (TW) is one of the water companies who want to build the reservoir. They are of course responsible for supplying our water and taking away our sewage. In contrast to GARD, they have presented very few 'facts', technical or otherwise. At a recent 'Drop-In' session in Steventon they didn't hold one in Hanney - I popped along to pose a few questions.

I started on leisure opportunities once the reservoir is built, this being one of the few potential benefits to our local communities after we would have endured many years of disruption, massively increased heavy traffic, road closures etc!

All the TW reps at the drop-in were casually dressed...no hard-nosed businessmen in sharp suits and silk ties here thank you very much; this is the warm and fluffy face of big business and massively wealthy foreign investors!

Some even in jeans, they were universally polite and patient. And boy, did they need to be!

Here's the informal Q & A session I had with one of them.....

Me: Once completed will we be able to swim in it? TW: Under consideration. Me: Fish and sail? TW: Almost certainly to both. Me: Water-ski and other watersports? TW: Motorised sports unlikely.

Not specifically on leisure...Me: What % of the surface will be covered by floating solar panels? TW: Don't know.

Me: Will sunrise be delayed by 30 minutes west of the reservoir due to the height of the wall, as claimed by GARD?

TW: We haven't done the calculations. Me: Security guards on site 24/7? TW: Don't know, but anyway cannot discuss security arrangements. Me: How steep will the banks actually be? TW: As shallow as makes sense.

If you're familiar with GARD's take on the above questions, you'll spot the odd difference!

Speaking to fellow visitors, I realised that polite but frankly not very well informed, and often vague answers were all that they also got from TW.

GARD had their display in the foyer of the hall and were out in full force, verbally sparring with the TW folk.

A young lady with a large TV camera was there, interviewing many of the worthy souls attending. There were plenty. Modesty prevented me from revealing myself to her as the local press baron. Sadly lacking were supplies of tea, coffee and custard creams.

To summarise...this whole 'reservoir' affair is a big deal and the full facts are not that easy to establish. It really is important we take it seriously.

If you object to the reservoir, the one thing you can do, short of Extinction Rebellion type tactics with a tube of superglue - not recommended - is write to our MP, and our County and District Councillors. Their contact details are on page 3, and have a look at the OFWAT, (the water regulator) website: www.ofwat.gov.uk/








Thanks to some dynamic community projects, 'Sustainable Wantage' has been named as one of Oxfordshire's eighteen 'Climate Action Heroes'.

Dear Friends

I was reminded of the phrase **Repairer of broken walls** recently because our garden wall collapsed last month (*the photos below may not be up to our esteemed editor's high standard but you get the picture*).

Repairer of broken walls is given as a title to those who are bombarded and besieged in the verse in Isaiah 58:20, implying that they have the hope that good things will be restored.

Whilst writing, the media is full of images of destroyed buildings with their broken walls as the Ukrainians try to defend their country from invading Russians.

By the time you read this, things may be much worse but they certainly need hope and a repairer of broken walls.

Easter holds out hope in repairing our brokenness because Jesus broke through the barrier of death.

It was three days between the death and resurrection of Jesus.

It was just under 4 weeks that our wall was repaired *(indeed looks a lot better)*; but people *(as in the days of Isaiah)* usually have a lot longer to wait before things improve.

Yet with the distress and terror going on, it feels more fitting to stay reflecting on the horror and brokenness of Calvary where Jesus suffered and died rather than rush on to the celebration of Resurrection.

As we contemplate such suffering we might ask ourselves if and how we can help? Christians can own contribute several ways.

Pray

Donate to the various charities helping Ukrainians.

Remind the world that there is more to life; that walls will be repaired - giving hope to the oppressed.

May you know the resurrection and restorative hope of Jesus this Easter.

This from the Vale District Council...

£150 'rebate' to help with energy bills. Many council taxpayers in the Vale of White Horse will soon receive a £150 council tax 'rebate' to help with rising energy bills.

Most households in council tax bands A-D will be eligible for the rebate. However, contrary to some reports, the 'rebate' will not be taken off people's council tax bills when they are issued.

The Vale is putting arrangements in place to make a separate payment to households as soon as possible. Here's how the payments will be made:

If a household pays their council tax by direct debit – they should be able to receive the ± 150 directly into their bank account. Vale is hoping to start making these payments by the end of April.

If a household is not on direct debit – it will take longer to make these payments as the council will need to write to them to confirm their bank details.

To ensure the Vale can carry out this work as quickly as possible, they are asking people not to contact them to chase the 'rebate' payment.

Residents can still sign up to pay their bill by direct debit – for more information on how to do this, visit: whitehorsedc.gov.uk/counciltax.

Limited funding will also be made available for households in need who would not otherwise be eligible for this energy rebate. This will be a local discretionary scheme and details will be made available on the council's website in due course.

Hanney Historical Calendar.

This month's photo is of the Causeway in West Hanney, looking towards the village green, with the church behind you. The raised footpaths are clearly visible, more so on the left, though they are both of equal height. Care is needed when they are walked upon, especially in high heels. (No, I've never tried, I'm



just guessing!) They are Grade II listed structures and are several hundred years old, as is the magnificent wall on the left, and were originally built to allow folk to get to church without getting their feet wet. Yes, our villages flooded hundreds of years ago long before global warming. Clue's in the title...Hanney, Charney, Goosey, village names that end 'ey' meaning 'island', i.e. it might get a bit wet!

In the wall on the left, behind which lies the magnificent West Hanney House, built in about 1720, is a blocked up opening, just visible in the pic, and if you believe in ghosties and ghoulies, hang around there at midnight, and you may see the ghost who allegedly comes out once in a while and heads off down to the church!

Behind the right-hand wall is the original Vicarage, built in the early 1800s, and sold by the Church some years ago...1980s maybe? It has been a private house ever since. At the end of the road in our photo stand some people...either posed by the photo-grapher, or merely curious passers-by. I suspect the former, to add a bit of human interest to his snap. If the latter, they were obviously rather timid folk!

The building facing the camera at the far end of the road was the blacksmith's forge, and at the time, he was almost certainly a Mr William Cox, who had been in the village for around forty years. His family had been blacksmiths in East and West Hanney since before records were first kept in 1540. Behind the forge was a walnut orchard, offering a rather gentle contrast I assume, to the noise, heat and sweat of the smithy. The Forge burnt down - or may have been demolished - in the 1920s, so probably not

long after this photo was taken, and a private house - which is still there and appropriately named 'The Old Forge' was built on the site.

This lower photo depicts the view from where those small figures in the original pic stood, looking back at the church. Taken sometime in the early 1940s, it appeared in Country Life magazine which published a feature on West Hanney in their Jan 1943 issue, describing it as "A village of which the beauty lies in the balanced variety of the buildings of many materials and times"

That's nice...glad they liked it! So do I.


