Oxfordshire has been awarded £12.7million

of government funding to get people out of their cars and back on the buses.

'Blakey' will be pleased. For the benefit of our younger readers, that's him pictured above. He was a star of the ITV sitcom 'On the Buses' which ran from 1969 to 1973...a total of 74 episodes! The funding will support measures over the next three vears, including cheaper fares for under-19s, new rural services - maybe West Hanney will get its bus service back? - and bus priority improvements across the county. Also proposed are traffic filters to reduce journey times and support the

introduction of new zero -

emission electric buses.

East Hanney Parish Council

A new contractor has now been engaged to empty the dog waste bins. Early signs are promising. Less good news regarding the bank of the brook by the iron bridge, which has been damaged by erosion and people/dogs entering the brook. There are water voles in this area, so it is hoped that access to the water can be minimised until a more robust solution can be found. Repairs to this bank cost in excess of £10,000 in 2009 so minimising damage is vital to keep costs down and safeguard the local wildlife.

The twelve-month review of our Neighbourhood Plan was presented to the Annual Parish Meeting and approved at the Parish Council meeting that followed. Please could landowners with hedges that encroach onto pavements, footpaths or roadways, keep them well trimmed back. If you have a ditch running alongside your property boundary, as a 'riparian' owner, please keep the ditch free of vegetation and any other obstruction so that any surface water can flow unimpeded. If you have difficulty doing this work yourself, please contact the Parish Clerk to see if help can be arranged.

Thanks to the contractors working for Hills Homes at Deans Farmhouse for clearing and reprofiling the drainage ditch running from Church Street to Main Street.

To help maintain the visual amenity of our local environment, please could residents only put out their bins after 6pm on the evening before collection and return their bins to within their property boundary as soon as possible after their bins have been emptied. Please also refrain from parking on our grass verges and likewise please politely encourage any visitors to West Hanney not to park on our grass verges.

I'm now on a fitness kick...eat and drink less and take exercise! The latter involves walking - not my favourite activity I

must confess, but two factors make it actually rather agreeable. The first is that I often bump into members of our community who are, without exception, friendly and happy to pass the time of day. (This by the way, is also one of the reasons I enjoy taking a turn in our Community shop.) The other result of my regular wanderings is that I am constantly reminded of what delightful and

picturesque villages we live in.

There is however one thing that can reduce the visual appeal of our environs, and that's wheelie bins. Of course they must be left out for emptying at the appropriate time, but one or two can appear up to a week before they're due to be emptied. Then, after emptying, they may stay out, sad, lonely, and neglected, again for days. Vale District Council have quite strict rules on this. Now, I've never been a great one

for rules, but here's what they say: 'Your bin must not be put out earlier than 6pm on the day before collection or later than 6am on the day of collection.' Bins should be removed from the pavement as soon as possible after collection and must be stored securely within your property boundary between collections.'

Of course, you're not going to face a spell at Her Majesty's pleasure if you break the rules, but if you are able to keep your bins out for the shortest possible time, so much the better. The 'Wheelie Bin Policy' is set by the Vale of White Horse District Council on their website...

Continuing on the strolling theme...on a Sunday afternoon it's often worth wandering down to the recreation ground to tarry a while and witness some cricket courtesy of the 'Golden Sparrows'. "For two full seasons, the very likeable and enthusiastic Golden Sparrows have played cricket on the Hanney cricket pitch on the recreation ground.

They won promotion in the first season and bettered that this year by winning



their division - promotion again - congratulations! The two most successful batsmen (now batters!) were Praveen and Aditya, the most successful bowlers were Ravi and Maruthi. Two other bowlers, Ravi and Surya, also had hat-tricks ALL of the team just love this game -- and

it shows -- come and watch next season."

A sad but true story. Many years ago a gent named Thomas P. Wiles lived in the cottage that is attached to the Plough pub. They had a son who was in the Navy and when he returned from a particular trip, presumably from a place where monkeys were easily found, he brought home with him one such furry creature which became the family pet. His name has been lost in the mists of time, but what is certain is that he lived in a cage, or up a tree in the garden, on a long chain to stop him escaping. He sometimes did however, and, by all accounts was a rather naughty monkey who bit most people he met! Folk were genuinely scared of him. What species he was is not known, but a description suggested he was a grey/ brown colour and approx. three feet tall when stood upright on his furry hind legs! Some experts suggest he may have been a gibbon.



Frank Bunce, now an East Hanney resident, lived at the time very near the Plough and early one evening he witnessed the sad demise of said monkey.

He had been the family pet for maybe two or three years, but one evening he escaped from his garden and climbed onto the roof of the Plough next door. The landlord at the time was Percy Simpson.

The night was drawing in and given his history of biting people - the monkey, not Percy! - it was deemed too risky to allow him to remain free overnight. Word got round, and quite a crowd gathered to see the monkey on the roof. Sadly, he could not be coaxed down, so finally, and with the approval of his owner Mr Wiles, Wally Smart, a local farmer was asked to dispatch him with the aid of Wally's 12 bore. This he duly did, and the poor monkey fell backwards into the garden of the pub. There was no canopy or awning of any sort outside the back door, and he crashed down into the garden.

A sad end I'm sure you'll agree, to our bizarre little tale. Some do say that he was 'pretty ancient' at the time of his demise, and that he was buried in the churchyard in an unmarked grave. Hmm...most of this story is true, but I'm not sure about that last bit.

Our photograph, dug up from the archives, depicts the poor monkey moments before he met his sad end, balanced somewhat precariously on the roof of the Plough. He does indeed look a rather scary fellow. Maybe he'd already spotted Wally and his shotgun? The Wiles family - obviously keen animal lovers - had a pet parrot, also brought home from his travels by young Wiles the sailor. It was called 'Ebsy' and used to fly around the village

What do an Ancient Greek philosopher and Bob Dylan have in common?

They both believed that "the times they are a-changing" or as Heraclitus put's it, change is the only constant in life.

As we journey through autumn into winter, we can see changing of the seasons all around us. Life can feel in a state of flux, with the future being uncertain and daunting, particular with all that is going on in the world at the moment.

Yet, nature also reminds us that there is a cycle and a season to life. The season's change, yet their pattern is known; summer leads to autumn, autumn to winter, winter turns to spring as summer approaches.

The writer of the Ecclesiastes 3:1-3, puts it this way:

There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens: a time for giving birth and a time for dying, a time for planting and a time for uprooting what was planted, a time for killing and a time for healing, a time for tearing down and a time for building up. (CEV)

The cycle of life continues to repeat itself and we gain much from being aware of its rhythms and routines, for as George Santayana warns us "those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it."

We cannot predict the future, but we can learn the patterns of life from the past and these can help us navigate what is ahead. For myself realising, that in life we should "expect the unexpected" (Oscar Wilde) with life being more like a roller-coaster then a pleasure cruise, has help me in facing what ever life throws at us next. Life is messy and it is how we deal with the mess that counts. And sometimes the best way to deal with the uncertainty of life, is to take it, one day at time; as Jesus said, "don't worry about tomorrow, because tomorrow will have its own worries." (Matthew 6:43)

Life can feel uncertain yet recognising its times and seasons can aid us in reflecting on our past to help us look forward, even if we can at times only take it one day at a time.

We have many very cultured folk

here in Hanney and our surrounding villages...I

am of course one myself!... but until recently I was unaware of 'The Arts Society Wantage'. It was formed in 1985 and is a member of an association of societies centrally coordinated by a leading arts charity – 'The Arts Society'.

The Wantage Society meets monthly, except for August and December, for lectures on an eclectic range of topics from English ceramics to Australian aboriginal art via French chateaux.

Their October lecture sounds most intriguing... titled 'Selfies, self-expression, celebrity and the Victorian Carte de Visite', it's happening on Friday 28th Oct and I'm intending to go. The lecturer is a gent called Mark Hill. Here's his little blurb.... 'From the late 1850s to the mid-1870s a new craze gripped the world.

Photography had just begun to be popularised, and suddenly nearly everyone could afford a portrait of themselves to share with others. These small photographic portraits mounted on card were shot profes-



sionally in studios and handed out like business or greetings cards – just like we share 'selfies' on today's

social media. Across nearly two decades, over 400 million cards were estimated to have been printed and shared with friends, family, and fans. We think we invented the 'selfie', but we didn't – welcome to the Victorian 'carte de visite'.

In this highly visual and relevant lecture, we'll look at the rise and fall of the fashion, learn how these cards were used, and find ways of dating cards from clothing and hairstyles. We'll examine in detail the hidden meanings behind the poses, facial expressions, backgrounds, and choice of clothes to reveal the fascinating histories behind these cards that were used by everyone from royalty to the man in the street.'

Talking of culture, did you get to see Look Theatre's recent performances of 'Kinky Boots' the musical? If not, you missed a treat! You will also not have seen two of Hanney's finest...Clive Ward and Janice Fletcher ...on stage, since both were members of the cast. The former - yes really! - even got to wear the kinky red boots...an image not easily forgotten! He has since told me he had to hand the boots back at the end of the production run, so this vision is never to be repeated.





October's photo in our History Calendar is the Black Horse in East Hanney, well known and oft frequented by many of us.

This photo, taken not that long ago I suspect - maybe 1970's? - shows the pub prior to having its exterior painted in 1998. That caused quite a kerfuffle at the time, with the Oxford Mail reporting... 'The new landlord of a popular village pub has angered locals after splashing out on a new coat of paint. German-born Peter Bilecki has been accused of "vandalism" after deciding to change the Black Horse to white within weeks of his arrival in picturesque East Hanney. He shunned the advice of council conservation officers and went ahead with covering up the traditional 'red and blue' brick frontage of the prominent pub in Main Street, parts of which are believed to date from the late 18th century.'





It does seem a shame that the beautiful ornate brickwork was covered with a couple of coats of Dulux, and many folk threatened to withdraw their custom altogether.

Less controversial times are depicted in the black and white pic taken some time in the 1950s I think. I assume the couple standing by the front door were the tenants at the time, and some investigative journalism of the top order has revealed that they were indeed. Lavinia and Arthur Waters, were at the pub for about 40 years! They had four children, boys Alan and Cliff, and two girls, Gwen and Heather, the



latter of whom married Jim Cottrell. Heather and Jim's son Alan, now a fine, upstanding West Hanney man, was born in the pub!

Further back a tenant called Charles Arthurs - maybe you had to have 'Arthur' somewhere in your name to be allowed to run the pub? - was in post according to the 1881 Census, and still in 1891, but by 1901 he was shown as a carpenter, and in 1911 he had moved to West Hanney. He died in 1919 and is buried in St James Churchyard.

Re last month's piece, it's been pointed out that some of the so-called facts regarding Dandridge's Mill may not actually be true. Certainly the claim that French prisoners of the Napoleonic war worked there doesn't fit in with the dates...the war ended in 1815, and the mill wasn't built till 1820, but which time the p-o-ws would have been sent back to France. I'm hoping to put together a brief history of the mill in the near future.




