

Still in West for June, this is 'Castleacre' at the bottom end of Winter Lane on the northern edge of the village green near the Buttercross.

July's is Church Green, West Hanney,, the church out of frame to the right. August's is Darden House in on Main St, East Hanney, Snuggs lane off to the left out of shot. September is the maypole on East Hanney village green. October...not sure on this one, probably also on Main St, maybe just past and opposite the Chapel. If you know better, please let me know.

November is Eddins Pond at the far end of Church St, West Hanney, and finally December's, which is on Main St West Hanney, on the right hand (north) side if heading towards Denchworth. What was the shop is now a private house.

Bratley and I did not actually take the pictures, but here's a quick summary of their locations.

(Once we're into next year, I'll be doing my usual short piece on the historical background to each pic in a little more detail, which I hope folk find interesting.) January is West Hanney House, February is now La Fontana in East Hanney, this view from the Steventon Rd.

March is East Hanney village green, with April being 'Varlins' at the north end of the same green, with Halls Lane to the left abd Ebbs Lane to the right behind the cart. Back to West Hanney for May, this taken from Church St, looking East toward the

Apologies for any inconvenience caused by the temporary reduction of car parking to the overflow section of the Memorial Hall, but by early November this should be over. 

apparently taken in the mid 1920s. It shows Leonard Barrett, the second son of West Hanney builder John Parker Barrett, out and about in his fine motor car! He sports an equally fine hat - though I'm slightly surprised it didn't blow

off in the wind as he sped along the local highways of our green and pleasant land. Of his two behatted female companions, we know that one - don't know which - was Olive Barnes. The other may have been Nora Barrett, his wife, a lovely lady from London, so I'm assured by a gentleman who knew her.

Their hats seem more firmly fitted to their heads, so were perhaps in less danger of being interfered with by the wind? Leonard's father was also from London ... a bricklayer by trade, he settled in this area and started a building company,



Barretts, which built many properties in West Hanney.

Stand on West Hanney Village Green and face up Winter Lane. On your far left is Rascarrel House, then the Villa, then the Old Forge and then a bungalow on the south west corner of Winter Lane...all were built by Barretts. To finish, a couple of questions...who was Olive Barnes, and, for all you petrol heads, what is the make of Len's car, and would it have been capable of sufficient speed to blow his hat off? No prizes, but I'd love to hear more about these fascinating Hanney folk.

Warm Home Discount rules updated for 2022-23

As winter approaches, many people will be nervously anticipating the cold weather and its inevitable effect on their heating bills. The Warm Home Discount (WHD) was introduced by the government in 2011 to offset some of this burden.

For 2022-2023 there have been a couple of significant changes to it. the number of energy suppliers participating in the scheme will increase, and those on disability benefits who don't have low incomes nor high energy costs will not receive the WHD.

The value of the WHD payment is currently £150. Nobody needs to apply in order to receive it, with the exception of those living in mobile homes on a park home site (see below). The payment is credited automatically to the consumer's electricity supply account (or credit is directly applied to a pre-payment meter), and energy suppliers have to make this payment by 31 March each year at the latest.

Eligibility for the WHD is ascertained by means of data-matching between energy suppliers and government departments. There are three eligible groups of consumers: low-income pensioner households; low -income people on some means-tested benefits; and households with high energy costs. This last criterion is determined by

the type of property you live in, especially its age and its floor area (based on information supplied by the Valuation Office Agency or the Land Registry).

There is an alternative form of WHD for those living in mobile

The Citizens Advice consumer helpline is 0808 223 1133 and our Adviceline is 0808 278 7907 if you have other concerns about energy costs.

The Royal Osteoporosis Society (ROS) is launching their largest-ever National Bone Health Awareness Campaign aimed at high -risk groups with a view to preventing

avoidable fractures and their devastating impact.

The ROS is nudging people to take practical action for their bone health by completing a 'Risk Checker' on-line tool.

It will signpost users to a dedicated Bone Health Hub for information and resources. On completion of the Risk Checker, the user will be offered information to support their bone health or a recommendation to talk to a healthcare professional, supported by a downloadable report detailing their results.

Once again that old chest-

nut of low flying helicopters has come up. Some folk see them as a gross invasion of their privacy,



their right to peace and quiet, a good night's sleep and all that good stuff.

Others maintain that whilst we continue to ask our young servicemen and women to undertake extremely dangerous missions in various theatres of war, we must allow them to be properly trained, and if that means flying low over Hanney, then so be it. (One gent even went so far as to describe the noise of their engines as 'the sound of freedom'! ...a poetic turn of phrase indeed, and doubtless a view shared by a good many folk.) However, if you hold the former view and wish to make a complaint, here's the contact details you need.... the Ministry of Defence Low Flying Complaints and Enquiries team: email: SWKlowflying@mod.gov.uk or tel: 01780 417558 (available from Monday to Friday, 8am to 4pm. Outside these hours there's an answerphone.) The helicopters that fly over us are from Benson, an RAF base approx. 18 miles east of Hanney, and the aircraft that they fly are 'Pumas', the single rotor beastie in the pic above, and 'Chinooks', the big double rotor' jobbies, capable of carrying 55 troops or 22,000lbs of payload!

I once met and chatted with one of the young helicopter pilots who had served in Afghanistan, and his tales of flying into the battlefield to collect wounded soldiers were truly humbling and inspiring ...amazing bravery, skill and determination. PS: I read recently that the two parts of the word helicopter are not 'heli' and 'copter', but 'helico', meaning spiral and 'pter', meaning wings, as in Pterodactyl.

Well, well, well, you learn something every day!

Ever heard of an anthropologist named Margaret Mead?

No, me neither, but I read this about her recently, and it does seem to have a certain relevance today, given the hard times some folk will be going through, and how they maybe could do with a hand.

When giving a lecture, Margaret was asked by a student what she considered to be the first sign of civilization in any culture. The student expected her to talk about fishhooks, clay pots or grinding stones.

But no. Margaret said that the first sign of civilization in an ancient culture was a femur (thighbone) that had broken but had then healed. She explained that in the animal kingdom, if you break your leg, you die. You cannot run from danger, get to the river for a drink or hunt for food. You are lunch for prowling beasts.

No animal survives a broken leg long enough for the bone to heal. A broken femur that has healed is evidence that someone has taken time to stay with the one who fell, has maybe bound up the wound, carried the person to safety and has tended them through recovery. Helping someone else through difficulty is where civilization starts, Mead argued "We are at our best when we serve others."

Can't argue with that and an interesting little story, I hope you agree. If you've a spare few minutes, look up our Margaret on the jolly old Googly Woogly. She was quite a dame!

I remember reading a Superman graphic novel (comic) with a full-page back cover image of Superman in a fight, with these words above it:

'Courage is not the absence of fear'.

That image and these words have stayed with me. But they feel like the first half of a sentence; if courage is not the absence of fear, what actually is it?

In search of answers, I googled it and found these quotes:

"Courage is not the absence of fear, but the triumph over it."- Nelson Mandela "Courage is not the absence of fear but rather the judgment that something else is more important." -Franklin D. Roosevelt

"Courage is fear that has said its prayers." -Dorothy Bernard.

Our fears can be big; the national cost of living crisis, political uncertainty and instability, the global economic crisis and climate change. Or they can be smaller; can I afford this, will this go well, will they like me?

What ever the scale of our fears may be, fear is still fear and it can have a paralysing and destructive impact on our lives.

I regularly find myself anxious and worried about complex or significant things that I need to get sorted, but that I just don't want to do. I get caught between my fears about it going badly and my fears around what happens if I don't do it. Usually I just end up putting it off.

There are times, when I am able to remember what I have done before and what I am capable of doing. It can help, if I think about what it will be like after I get this sorted. Breaking things down into smaller chunks helps, as well as working out what are the things I am concerned about, but can't change, and what are the things that I can influence and affect.

I am no Superman, but there have been times that I have managed to muster the courage and determination to get on and grapple with the things that cause me fear and worry.

For me, courage is not the absence of fear, it is the willingness to face your fear.

You can quote me on that.



Just three days after the magnificent funeral of the Queen, the Hanney Senior Citizens' guest speaker at their regular monthly gathering was none other than a gent named Ian Scott Hunter who had served as a footman of the late Queen.

He had some tales to tell, which were followed by tea and cakes supplied by Dot and her splendid team.

Speaker Ian, aside from his royal connections, runs a charity with his wife called the Alexandra House of Joy, which will be a 'long

term palliative care unit to be built near Bicester. It's an ambitious project...full details are here: **www.alexandrahouseofjoy.co.uk**



Beneath the beautiful autum-

nal colours of the trees here in West Hanney, run the lead athletes who were partaking in the recent annual Sunday morning event that is known as the Hanney Five, organised by Oxford City Athletic Club. It's a five mile run - clue's in the title! - that takes a circular route starting and finishing in Hanney.

Were I to run, it may well drag on into Monday, so big ups to everyone who competed.

I spotted three Hanney folk running, but such was their speed, I failed to get a snap of them. Nonetheless, well done to Richard and David Brooks and David Smiles. And if five miles sounds little more than an after lunch stroll, then you could always follow Ria Lambert's example - she of the Parish of West Hanney and run the London Marathon! You might remember Ria from our September issue,



where she told us of her intention to run the race to raise money for the Downs Syndrome Association. Well, she did it and raised nearly £2,000 in the process, almost four times her target of £500. It's not too late to add to her total via her JustGiving website here:

Following last month's sad tale of

the monkey on the roof of the Plough, I present another, this one of the lion in West Hanney! Actually there were two, and they were lionesses...now read on.

Once upon a time there was a man called Tony Gutteridge, who was a teacher actually the head of Sociology at Newbury Girls Grammar School, no less.

He was a decidedly eccentric gentleman with a background in the circus. (Not sure how that links with Sociology, but no matter.) Amongst his 'big top' skills were knife throwing, fire eating and lion taming! He was well known throughout the circus fraternity both here and abroad, and at one time he was the lion tamer for Chipperfield's Circus at the Hippodrome in Great Yarmouth! For a period he had his own circus under the name of Tony Luke. As well as lions, he worked with geese, bears, dogs, horses, llamas etc.

He also worked in the film industry looking after the animals that they used. In his later years he lived in Southmoor and at some point he harboured an ambition to tour the Cotswolds with his own horse-drawn circus.

To that end, he asked Alan Whitbread, a friend and neighbour of his, to go to a zoo in North Wales to collect two three-month old lioness cubs and a bear. In case of disaster, Tony lent Alan a loaded pistol. The bear turned out to be huge and was wisely left behind in Wales, but the lion cubs - each about the size of a large dog were duly brought back to Hanney, where Tony had prepared a cage made out of an old lorry trailer, in which to keep them. It was situated in what is now Rectory Farm Close, just off Winter Lane, this before the houses in the close were built. When they first arrived, the cubs were playful, and Alan was happy to let his small daughters play with them, but as they grew, they became more boisterous and

sharp of tooth and claw, and hence spent most of their time in the trailer. Tony would feed them large chunks of meat, and George Herman's little dog would try and get into the cage to steal some of it! Locals were unhappy about the two, now quite large, carnivorous creatures in their midst - this probably around 1973/4, when there were no rules apparently regarding the keeping of 'dangerous animals'.

Many folk complained about their roaring which happened every evening. One lady was particularly vocal...the rather aptly named Mrs Slocombe. If you remember the TV comedy, 'Are You Being Served' you'll recall the character Mrs Slocombe who was always discussing problems with her 'pussy' - meaning her pet cat of course, tho' always done with a rather unsubtle element of 'double-entendre'! Here in West Hanney we had our own Mrs Slocombe having problems with a pussy ...well, actually two rather big ones! After only a couple of years, one of the lionesses died. Poisoning by a disgruntled local was suspected, and soon after, the second one also died.

This must have been a huge blow to Tony, who never achieved his horse-drawn circus ambition. He died aged 68 in 2000 and was buried in Longworth Church. Apparently

> the circus fraternity from far and wide, including Europe, came to his funeral to pay their last respects.

The November calendar pic - I'm guessing the photo was taken maybe in the 1920/30s? - is of the Crown pub in East Hanney on the main Oxford Rd. The building, dating back to 1831, became a private house in 1997, though still retains its rather attractive 'Morlands Brewery' ceramic plaque to the right of the front door. An incomplete list of the landlords mentions the following...in 1847 Richard Bettridge was the man. He was also a miller. Still in post in 1851, he had added 'baker' to his list of jobs....busy chap, tho' he was by then assisted by his 24 year old son John, and 20 year old Ann Skinner, a servant. By 1863, son John alone was listed, and he continued as landlord until at least 1877. In June of that year the Hanney Parochial Magazine records "The Hanney Foresters Benefit Club held their annual feast at The Crown on Thursday in Whitsun week. Headed by the Wantage Band the members walked in procession to the Parish Church where prayers were read and a sermon preached".

Sometime before 1887 James Batten Monk had taken over, but by 1899, Archbold Butcher was in charge. ..see pic top right, showing him and his family in 1904. John Inch was the landlord in 1907, with Clarence Vipond calling 'last orders please' in 1920. George Falkenstein was in charge from at least 1924 through to 1931, all these dates as per the 'Kelly's Directories' of the time.

There's a bizarre connection between the Crown and that long running radio show

'The Archers' which started in 1951. My mum - a true Londoner, born and bred loved the programme. (I never knew why, and my brother and I had to sit quietly whilst it was broadcast...no chance to listen to it again on iPlayfix Prime or whatever it's called if you missed an episode or had to deal with unruly children!) The programme is still running apparently. Originally billed as 'An everyday story of country folk', someone, somewhere must have taken offence - happens a lot these days doesn't it? - so the good old Beeb have rebranded it as "a contemporary drama in a rural setting" - yes, really! One of the main characters was Walter Gabriel, a tenant farmer, famous for his catchphrases such as "Oh dear, oh lor" and "Me old pal, me old beauty." all uttered with the most exaggerated of country yokel accents that only a true actor could muster, though rumour has it that he wasn't an actor at all, and somehow bluffed his way onto the show! The 'luvvie' in question was one Chris Gittins, and the story goes that he once visited the Crown here in Hanney to perform a slightly unusual task. The regulars had collected - for charity - a massive pile of coins which sat on the bar, and Chris was invited to come and topple the pile into some kind of container so they could be handed over to the charity. Given that this event must have happened sometime after he became a global superstar, I wonder if this exciting photo-op was ever captured for posterity, or if any of our more mature readers actually witnessed the event? Do let me know if you did!
