We have many vibrant and active groups, clubs and societies here in Hanney. They cater for a wide range of interests, and it may be helpful, especially to the newer members of our community, if I give them a space each month to tell us a little about themselves. First up is the **History Group**...here's their piece:

We were founded over 30 years ago and welcome anyone with an interest in local history and archaeology. We have around 50 members from the Hanneys and the wider Vale. We meet at 8.00 p.m. in the War Memorial Hall on the 4th Monday of each month from September to May for a varied programme of talks. Most are focused on the Vale. Berkshire and Oxfordshire. Subjects include local history and archaeology, industrial archaeology, geology, town development, transport and military history. Speakers are topic specialists, often from the local area. Our subscription is £12, for which in 2021-2 we offered a programme of 8 talks, an exhibition and 5 walks/visits. During May to August, we organise 3-4 local visits to sites such as Buckland House, Radley's halftimbered houses, Avebury Stone Circle and Oxford's Jewish Quarter. Visits and walks can incur small extra costs for items such as entrance fees and guide charges. We hold exhibitions, including the 'Hanney at War 1939-45' and 'Jubilee' events. We research local topics and publish occasional papers in booklet form, such as the two recent Hanney Character Studies. See our website at *hanneyhistory.org.uk* for examples of talks and publications. Some members also research local genealogy and often help family historians. We occasionally hold social evenings, sometimes linked to a visit. We aim to make local history accessible and enjoyable.





THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



Some of you may know that I have been using crutches to help me recuperate after a knee operation - I have, like the stationary bus says, been "out of service". I have been learning to walk with crutches and my family have taken to ducking because I use my crutch to enthusiastically point at things.

Hopefully by the time you read this I will not be needing the crutches so much. The word crutch comes from the Latin "crux" meaning cross. Nowadays the device is made of light metal with plastic rings, a bit like my new knee, but it was originally a wooden cross shaped structure that supported the lame, injured or disabled.

By our garden gate we have a very impressive Holly tree luxuriant with red berries and climbing up around it clinging on for support is, of course, some ivy. It's almost as good as the holly you can get at our Holly Fair!

In the carol **the holly and the ivy** there is no other mention of the ivy; it is all about the holly the parts of which are to remind us of the saving and supportive power of the Lord Jesus which rescues us from our own failings and faults. From this picture we are the ivy and Jesus is the holly.

A lot of people feel that requiring something to support them through life is a weakness and you may not wish to think of yourself as ivy but as we go into the Advent season towards Christmas, Christians are reminded of the prophecies bringing hope, light and encouragement to people going through depressing and gloomy times. The supporting hope is that a Saviour would be born and that his eventual crucifixion would save us. Whilst the media is constantly bombarding us with depressing opinions and predictions of disaster, I freely acknowledge that the cross of Jesus is my crutch. I need that hope to spur me on, support and strengthen me through the dismal information of rising prices and chaotic government.

The joy and peace of Christmas comes not so much from lovely presents and delicious food – delightful though they are – but from trusting what Jesus has done.

As you sing or listen to the Christmas carols consider how many refer to the Lord Jesus as our Saviour.



Once again I must fess up to

'fake news!' in this humble mag that you're reading now!

We'll start with last month's tale of the two lionesses cubs...you may remember the story. Well, it turns out that they were never resident here in Hanney, but a three year old male lion named Taffy certainly was, and sadly, he too headed up to pussy heaven after the RSPCA were called to check on him. They told his owner Tony Gutteridge that Taffy should be sold. At that time, no one wanted a full grown lion, so poor Taffy was put down.

In the same article, and now I'm being a bit pedantic, I should add that Tony, the big cats' owner, was not the head of Sociology as stated, but a maths teacher. During the 1970s he was employed at 'Shaw House', a girls school near Newbury. An 'old girl' of the school who's a good friend, has many tales of Mr Gutteridge!

Meantime I have an update on the story of the monkey in the October issue. Thanks to Mr Ian Vickers, a fine, long time resident of this parish, I now know the poor creature's name...it was 'Bunbury'. And whilst we're on inaccuracies, I know the picture I used for that article was not actually a monkey, but an ape... King Kong,

the Hollywood film star gorilla no less, who appeared in the 1933 film of the same name. Why KK? Simple, I couldn't find a suitable snap of a real monkey.



The December photo in our 2022 calendar is a

view along Main St. East Hanney - see top photo. Below it is a snap I took from roughly the same place on 31st Oct 2022. Changes, yes - not least the loss of that magnificent tree - but still some similarities. The calendar photo, taken I would guess at least 100 years ago, has been 'coloured', tho' not by me I hasten to add! On the far left edge of the photo can be seen a small blue sign advertising 'Reckitts Blue'. At the time of the pic, that end of Chapel Cottage nearer to the camera was a separate shop it's now part of the cottage which stocked the product I assume. I confess to not knowing what Reckitts Blue was, but thanks to the jolly old 'T'internet', I can reveal to any equally ignorant readers surely there are none Mr Edi-

tor? – that it was a small block of detergent that was added to the laundry wash in an attempt to get rid of yellow staining (!) and make the whites 'whiter than white!' Back in the day, and still today of course, a good way for a company to promote its products was to tell folk that the Royal Family were patrons.

Reckitt's, a company based in Hull, was one such. They carried a recommendation in their ads from a lady called Eliza Elder, the Prince of Wales' laundress, no less! She stated, on April 12th, 1873, that... "*I* have been laundress to the Prince of Wales for several years, and I consider Reckitt's Paris blue is the best I ever used and is undoubtedly greatly superior to the oldfashioned thumb or dark blue." Good to



know, I'm sure you'll agree.

It wasn't all good news however! Another Victorian lady, one Mary Mason, who was described – not sure by whom - as 'The Young Housewife's Counsellor and Friend', had something else to say. Ok, she may not have had the punchiest of job titles, but no matter, she had a serious warning aimed at all those who employed staff.

She informed her readers in 1875 that... "Servants have generally little idea of proportion, and in bluing clothes they seem to have a propensity to colour too highly. This should be restricted, as it deprives the clothes of that snowy appearance, which is their greatest beauty".

Oh dear, these pesky servants...they're a mixed blessing aren't they?


