THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



Dear Friends

Before becoming Vicar in the Vale Benefice, I was an army chaplain for twelve years. The army has 6 core values which Chaplains were responsible for teaching – one of which was "discipline".

Most soldiers understood this to mean either punishment or more positively the ability to control yourself.

I relished demolishing the first of those misconceptions and teaching the fact that discipline comes from the Latin word *disco* meaning *I learn-not* I hasten to add, I dance! In other words, true discipline is about learning and developing; and certainly, a soldier's career is a constant round of training and getting prepared for their duties.

In this period of Lent many Christians would associate the 40 days approaching Easter as a time of discipline – developing our faith as we look forward to celebrating the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our churches will be thinking about being a disciple of Jesus in our Lent Groups. We are also encouraging folk to join in the

personal Discipleship plan which is a friendly and flexible way to encourage being a follower of Jesus.

I think there are 2 other reasons for studying discipleship - 1. It fits into the modern trend of personal development; 2. It is a positive gospel word.

There are only 6 of the 66 books of the bible that mention disciple: 2 in Isaiah; 23 in the Acts of the Apostles and the rest in the 4 gospels - over 450. Jesus has 2 requirements of being his disciple. He says, "hold onto my teaching" *John 8:31* and "love one another" *John 13:35* both of which take determination and trust to carry out.

So, as we enjoy the new growth of spring and journey through Lent may I encourage you to seek some activity or practice that helps you develop, especially in your knowledge and love of the Lord Jesus. God bless.

Why accept Thames Water's assertation that the reservoir is a necessary evil? GARD's recommendations are backed by professionally assisted studies and show there are better alternatives. If you responded before, do you need to respond online again? Yes! A lack of response now will be interpreted as a softening of opinion locally. A loud and clear rejection is needed for the Thames Water plan. The deadline is MARCH 21st. This is your chance to tell Thames Water, the Regulator Ofwat, your MP, your Councillors, your Parish councillors. Please go online and object.

#transferwater. Modelling has shown water transfer is robust to climate change impact and can be implemented sooner, at less cost, protecting our chalk streams and providing drought resilience years earlier. Unlike the reservoir, prioritising water transfer can be part of a properly adaptive, minimally destructive solution.

#fixtheleaks. Thames Water lose a stag-



gering 138 million gallons of water a day, that's 200% more than proposed reservoir supplies, not just a dripping tap! Halving this by 2050 (the current target) is inadequate (TW will still have the worst leakage rate of all UK water companies) More can be done to at least meet the industry average, to provide proper stewardship of this valuable resource, and our rivers. Put money from water bills into overdue improvements, technology to detect leaks and into sewage management not an unnecessary reservoir.

Dear Editor.

What an amazing show! I went to the Saturday evening performance of the revitalised Hanney Drama Group's *Who framed the Easter Bunny* and was utterly captivated from beginning to end. Everything was great – from continuity to costumes to casting, And the music and chorus work were stunning.

There were eight new faces – half of them from Hanney – and at least six unforgettable performances.

Hanney Drama Group has been through hard times since Covid and – after nearly

50 years – closure was on the horizon last year. Not so now!

Yet more on the poor monkey... remember my story back last year in the October issue about the monkey? (I updated it in the Dec 22 issue.)
Well, the tale has reached Alberta, Canada no less, and I got a phone call the other day from a lovely lady called Cecilia nee Simson Delaney who lives there. As a small girl, she grew up in the Plough with her parents Percy and Phylis Simson, who ran the

pub.

Originally her grandparents Rose and Reg had been the tenants but Reg died in 1937. Their son Percy and Phylis ran it until the 1950s, when Percy got fed up with the brewery, Halls, who would not grant him a liquor licence...all he was allowed to sell was beer!

The sad demise of the monkey happened in 1946/7. He was a spider monkey named, not Bunbury, according to Cecilia, but 'Bumstead'. Now, Bumstead was an American cartoon character - Dagwood Bumstead to give him his full name - and he featured in the long running comic strip 'Blondie' which first appeared in 1930. Dagwood looks quite tall and skinny in the cartoon doesn't he?...quite spider monkeylike with long skinny legs.

Bumstead had indeed been bought to England by Mr Wild's son Tom in 1943, when he was tiny, with a body the size of a kitten. He lived in the house, but as he grew

bigger, Mr Wild made a huge cage for him in the garden, from which he often escaped. As a little girl Cecilia would run round when this happened, warning the locals!

As to his final demise, Cecilia told me he was actually on the back section of the roof, not the thatched part, when he was shot, and that he fell into the neighbour's garden. She thinks he may well have been buried there, more or less where he fell, since by then he was quite big and heavy, and also a bit of a mess, having been shot by a 12-bore! Given she was only a small

girl at the time, Cecilia was made to go indoors when Bumstead met his maker, thanks to farmer Wally Smart's shotgun. Though Bumstead was an aggressive chap when older, as a youngster he would perch on Mr Wild's shoulder and accompany him into the Plough for a pint.

Whilst I'm on updates, I've had a bit of info on the building that is now La Fontana ...page 20 of the Feb issue. Sonny 's real name was Harry Small and with his wife Ada, they ran the pub from 1969. Prior to that it was a tea room for a while, only open at weekends, and run by a couple from Windsor. They left it in a real state, meaning that Harry and Ada, helped by family and friends, had a lot of cleaning and tidying to do before they could open. They employed a chef named Clifford Gray.

More history, and my usual look at this month's Hanneys Historical Calendar photo. It's of the Green at East Hanney, one of the most picturesque parts of the village and these cottages are seriously old. For a time they were owned by James Holmes and housed five families.

The cottages overlooked a sawpit (a pit over which timber is laid to be sawed with a long two-handled saw operated by two peo-

ple of whom one stands above the timber and the other below it) and a village swing erected by the Parish Council. There was also an enormous spreading elm tree, so big it had a seat within it. Every year a fair came and Hanney Feast was a special day which re-united families from near and far.


Many characters have lived in the cottages over the years, and singling out one for no particular reason other than there are pals and long term residents of Hanney with whom I





have coffee every Tuesday morning, who remember him. He was a gent named Charlie Froude, who lived in the far left hand end cottage with his wife. Charlie was a carpenter, able to turn his hand to most things. He had been gassed in World War One and suffered with bronchial problems. Next door to his cottage was his workshop. He's buried in the St James graveyard.

The photos of the children were taken in about 1908.



The upcoming local elections are on Thursday 4th May

...and a big change from previously...

You will need photo ID to vote at the local elections

...this a Government requirement that will apply for the first time. Accepted forms of photo ID will include, but are not limited to, passport, full or provisional driving licence, disabled parking blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards and proof of age cards with a PASS mark. If you don't have an accepted photo ID you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

Here follows a few brief details on 'local government' round these 'ere parts. At 'County' level we are, unsurprisingly, part of Oxfordshire County Council. This body, often abbreviated to OCC, is responsible for many aspects of our local life, including Highways, Healthcare, Schools, Council tax, Libraries etc. There are currently about 62 County Councillors of which 24 are Lib Dems, 18 are Conservative, 12 are Labour, 5 are Green. and 3 are Independents. Each councillor is responsible for an area of the County, and ours is a Conservative. Iuliette Ash. There are four **District Councils** in Oxfordshire - West Oxfordshire, South Oxfordshire, Cherwell and the Vale of White Horse. That last one is ours... a bit of a mouthful, so it's usually shortened to simply 'The Vale'. It too holds sway over many aspects of local life, not least planning. If vou want to build 2,000 new homes or just put a bedroom above your garage, you will need to consult with the Vale planners, and if you go ahead without their permission. they will be very cross indeed! Our representative on our District Council

is Sally Povolosky. 'District Councillor' is also a political position, and Sally is a Lib Dem. They are now very much in the majority at the Vale, having 31 of the 38 seats, with just 6 Tories and 1 Green. Last, but by no means least, we get to the most local tier of government, the **Parish Councils**.

East Hanney and West Hanney are two separate Parishes, hence two Parish Councils, often abbreviated to 'PCs', each with some Councillors and a Clerk.

West Hanney has 5 Councillors and East Hanney currently has 8. Note that parish councillors are non-political appointments. That's not to say they don't hold political views of course, but they do not represent any particular political party on the PC. There will only be elections for parish councillors if there are more candidates than positions.

Currently West Hanney PC have their full complement, and East have 7 of their 8. (I do not yet know which councillors intend to continue, or if there will be a need to hold an election.)

PCs charge the parishioners - us! - a 'precept', a sum that is added to our Council tax bills each year to generate income to allow them to carry out their duties, which include - amongst many other things - allotments, footpaths, litter and the recreation ground.

Our PCs also consult with the District and County Councils on 'Highways' matters, including traffic calming, tree planting, verge maintenance, and planning. The PCs hold regular public meetings at which all are welcome. You do not have to live in the Parish to attend.

Each month we publish details of when and where these meetings are held, as well as updates from the PCs. We also list the contact details of the current Councillors - see pages 6 and 7.






