# **East Hanney Parish Council**

Hopefully with the weather on our side as you read this, work should start on the extension to the Memorial Hall car park. This will benefit hall users, the 'school run' and neighbouring residents, as the roads should be clear of parked cars. The new MUGA is also part of this build and we're using the same contractor, so be prepared for considerable short term disruption during the construction phase. Holmes' Garden has now been cleared and landscaped, to be followed by the installation of a new 'talking' bench - more on that later as it's an idea inspired by our editor. (See my article on front cover - Editor) Thank you to both Garth and Dickon for leading this. It was also agreed that in memory of James Holmes - who was born and died on 17th March. in 1859 and 1938

respectively - we are naming the playground area in the new development off the Steventon Road, formerly Rosie B's, as 'Holmes' Park'.

After both a Parish Council consultation with directly affected residents, and a wider Highways consultation, the new parking restrictions outside the school have been agreed. Once the road has been resurfaced the new restrictions will be in place; this should roughly coincide with the completion of the car park expansion that will provide more than adequate parking for the school run.

# West Hanney Parish Council

We are supporting a number of initiatives to help improve road safety. These include the introduction of a 20mph speed limit throughout West Hanney and we await the outcome of the survey conducted by Highways.

We are also supporting the proposed parking restrictions on School Road between Meadow Way and St James Primary School, with double yellow lines on both sides of the road but with 3 gaps allowing six cars to park on the south side of the road.

When these proposals are finalised there will be a public consultation before they are implemented.

We are also looking forward to improvements being made to the road surface of School Road, Main Street and Winter Lane in May and June.

#### The upcoming local elections are on Thursday 4th May, and for the first time you will need photo ID to vote.

This a Government requirement....ooh err!

Accepted forms of photo ID will include... but are not limited to... a passport, full or provisional driving licence, disabled parking blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards and proof of age cards with a PASS mark.

If you don't have an accepted photo ID, you can apply for a **Voter Authority** 

**Certificate,** but you will have to be registered to vote before you can get it.

This all sounds a bit complicated, so best to head to the **Electoral Commission web**site here:

#### www.electoralcommission.org.uk/ or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

**Please note that** though the deadline for getting your Voter Authority Certificate is Tues 25th April, **the deadline to register** 

to vote is Monday 17th April, so if you're a first time voter, don't delay!

Parish and District Councillors are elected every 4 years. If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor take a look at your Parish Council website to see what it does.

Also talk to one of the current Councillors to find out what's involved.

Nominations have to be submitted by 4th April. All the information you need is on the Vale of White Horse Council website. West Hanney has five Parish Councillors, East Hanney has eight and Charney Bassett also has five. Elections will need to be held if nominations exceed these figures.

# If you intend to vote by post, you must apply to do so by 18th April.

All the information you need on voting can be found on the Vale website.

# THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

Veganuary, Movember, Lent and Red Nose day; are all times when people choose to do or not to do certain things for certain reasons. We cut things out or add things into our lives, to make real life situations better for ourselves or for others.

When celebrating Easter, Christians remember Jesus' death and rising again. Because of what Jesus did during Easter, we are able to cut out from our lives all the things that we have thought, said and done that hurt and harm ourselves, others and God. While adding into our lives God's power, presence and peace, so that we can live life to the full with God.

In the New Testament St Paul sets out a description of what this approach of reducing certain behaviours while increasing others, looks like in our daily lives: Love others.

In everyday and practical ways we are encouraged to love others. But what does that look like? Love is a small word but it can have lots of different meanings, in different contexts and to different people. Paul describes love in this way:

"Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous, it does not brag, and it is not proud. Love is not rude, is not selfish, and does not get upset with others. Love does not count up wrongs that have been done. Love takes no pleasure in evil but rejoices over the truth. Love patiently accepts all things. It always trusts, always hopes, and always endures." 1 Corinthians 13:4-7"

This definition of love focuses on marking out what love is, by stating what love will do and also what it doesn't do. It sets boundaries for us in our attitudes and actions. Love is more than just passionate feelings that drive our behaviour.

Love is an act of will, to choose how we respond in real life situations, from an understanding that certain responses are required and some are excluded.

Much of the harm humans do to each other stems from a lack of love and concern for others. Without a desire to help and support others, where certain thoughts and behaviours are excluded, we can end up damaging those around us. We can even rank our love for certain people and principles, over any concern for the consequences of our actions on others.

A lot of harm has been done in the name of love that has disregarded the wellbeing of others.

Jesus' actions during the first Easter week are a reminder of the power that acting in love has on ourselves and on others. That as much as love is shown in what we will do, it is also shown in what we won't do. We can choose to show love to those we encounter this week by reducing; pride, jealousy, rudeness, selfishness, anger and by not holding grudges. While also behaving in ways that are marked by patience, kindness, celebration, hope and perseverance.

Dear Editor,

In drier months, I practice my anti-surveillance skills in the abundant fields that surround the village, avoiding chatty dog-walkers or ducking enemy joggers whose clear aim is to jostle me into Letcombe Brook. So while the mud persists. my daily exercise takes me anticlockwise round the village via Brookside and Mill Orchard, thence to the safer territory of Main Street and Snuggs Lane. directly into the sights of the enemy - a determined rude boy (with twin exhausts); maybe an electrically silent yet homicidal librarian; the more predictable lorry driver, or even worse, an Amazon Prime van running late. All of whom might say, "Pick another route, mate".

It will be a pity when those overhanging branches and ivy are cut back, there will be no fun in my dry weather circuit. *Geoffrey Bourne-Taylor*

# As you have probably heard, a 20mph speed

**limit** is soon to be applied to all roads within the Hanneys ...maybe including the built up section of the A338 itself, running

north from the junction by La Fontana. I believe local feelings are mixed on this...many folk are much in favour, seeing it as a step in the right direction towards better road safety.

Others however see it as an over-reaction ...it's not needed, they suggest, and anyway, how would it be enforced? A fair question. Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) recently issued a 'Statement of Reasons' - though I can no longer find it on their website - as to why they are introducing this measure county-wide I believe is their aim.

In it they claim that they want to make our 'built environments safer and more attractive places to walk and cycle'.

So far so good. They also suggest that a 20mph limit will encourage folk to look at *'alternative modes of transport for local travel.'* 

Hmmm? Not so sure about that. Are they suggesting that I might in future cycle or walk to, say, the Community shop, because once the new speed limit is introduced, I'd only be allowed to drive there at 20mph, instead of 30mph?

OCC's statement goes on to tell us that 'Streets are central to everyday life in Oxfordshire. (Who knew?!) They play a role in all transport journey's.... (Sorry, what's the difference between a 'transport journey', and a plain old 'journey'? And while I'm being picky, why the possessive apostrophe in 'journey's'?) ....and are places where people shop, work and spend time. Improving the experience of being on Oxfordshire's streets will therefore improve people's local areas and their everyday lives.



Improving streets to encourage active travel will also help to deliver further benefits for people in Oxfordshire.

A wide range of people choosing to walk, and cycle will help to

improve public health, reduce road noise, improve air quality and make local areas more relaxing.

Furthermore, 20mph speed limits will help reduce casualty rates and improve road safety.'

Ok, but there's also some less good news...for many the big issue is how the limit will be enforced, and elsewhere on their website, OCC tell us that they will not be providing speed cameras or road humps. However, 'officers will work with local bodies to establish the best methods for ensuring compliance.' they assure us. Quite who these local bodies here in Hanney would be, I know not.

A couple of complications have recently arisen...The Oxford Bus **Company** has objected to the blanket introduction - county-wide - of the limit. They recently said that .... "Buses need to make progress where they can in order to be a viable and attractive alternative to private cars and to attract patronage in order to help to achieve the council's stated objectives to remove one in four car journeys. Following this policy on speed limits will not achieve this." (Of course we no longer have any bus service in West Hanney anyway!) All rather confusing, and I know our splendid Parish Councillors are trying to sort it out the mess! And finally, the Police, as one would expect, have pointed out that they will no more be able to enforce the 20mph limit than they are currently able with the 30mph and any other speed limit! More to come on this one folks!

Having now read the book, I must say I found it a riveting, if rather depressing read.

Amongst much else, the author confirms that the current state of the NHS is not a recent development...it's been underfunded and badly run for many many years.

If you enjoy these kind of insights into what really goes on 'behind the scenes', this book is certainly worth investigating.

the full width of the road directly outside HQ - aka Mulberry House, Winter Lane - is a mere 4.4 metres!

**Talking of Winter Lane,** am I being unnecessarily picky by pointing out that it is 'Winter Lane', singular. Many residents, even old timers, call it 'Winters Lane', plural. Does it matter? 'Winters Rise' the new Lagan Homes development on the eastern edge of West Hanney is now officially named 'Meadow View'. I much prefer the latter and it will save confusion for our lovely posties!

Rumour has it that Winter Lane is due for a resurface soon, probably starting early June and taking approx. 5 days. More on that next month.

And a final point....I once heard that Winter Lane was so named since it was the only route into West Hanney that was accessible during the harsh winters of yesteryear. Anyone know any more on that? East Hanney Parish Council is refurbishing the Memorial Garden to Hanney's 'Man for All Seasons'...

# James Robins Holmes (1859-1938),

a fascinating character for long-term residents and newcomers alike, whose birthday was 17<sup>th</sup> March. A man of modern-seeming principles, he acted on them even when it brought physical harm and attacks from the legal authorities – and also villagers! Ninety pounds of stones/missiles

were hurled through the windows of his house *The Mulberries* following his public opposition to the 'madness' (his word) of British colonial conquest in the Boer War – an acquisition of territory comparable to Putin in Ukraine? The 300 strong mob included villagers with sons in the Army, who were possibly inflamed or 'bribed with beer by those above them' as Mrs Holmes (36 at the time) said in her testimony. Holmes apparently paid the fines of those convicted of the attack, sensibly mending fences.

He is most famed, though, for what he called 'the greatest honour of my life' which saw him prosecuted and fined for 'obscenity' - that of distributing 150,000 copies of his 1891 booklet *True Morality* and a price-list for 'hygienic requisites' contraceptives - which he supplied in small packages sent out from Hanney Post Office. Unlike richer folk, poor married couples in the countryside 'from Hanney to Hindustan' had hitherto no access to family planning knowledge, or to these recently affordable products. Holmes was a kind and considerate landlord to poor families in Hanney and would have seen poverty with his own eyes. Census data 1871/81



shows families with 8 to 12 children in Ebbs Lane. and one maternal death after a 10<sup>th</sup> child. IRH seems to have been operating from total moral conviction. It would be 30 years from his first publication before the first family planning clinic was opened in the UK by Marie Stopes in 1921. A lovely memory of his regular visits to Hanney Post Office to post mysterious little packages comes from someone who, as a little girl at the time, concluded that 'every day must be Christmas somewhere in the world.'

Another evebrow-raising activity was the creation of a village bathing place, a sizeable structure on the brook downstream from the Iron Bridge. Propriety forbade girls from using it but they could get a good view of the boys while peeping through the gaps in the screening. Nothing is now visible of this, with the exception of the nearby bench with a 'Latin' inscription starting: ORE STA-BIT. It's an amusing family puzzle to ask your kids to read this as English (which it is) rather than Latin (which it isn't). All details here come from the excellent history of IRH written by Frank Poller of this parish (1993) which can be perused on Hanney History Group's website Photos & Archive section. You will find many wonderful stories about his village activities, generous spirit and philanthropy: the net valuation of his property at death was nil. He wasn't the most famous person in Victorian social movements, but his concern for the rural poor and for this village make him a man to be celebrated.

(David Gahan lives in West Hanney and has an interest in Victorian social & scientific thinking.) This month's calendar photo is of the lovely house known as 'Varlins'. It's at the top end of East Hanney village green where Ebbs Lane, Ashfields Lane and Halls Lane meet in an offset crossroads.

It's late Victorian, built around 1890. I have no idea of when our photo was taken, but I'd guess around the time of the First World War.

The house has changed little since then...some newer railings on the low brick wall and the gate in the middle of the front wall removed, as has the ivy covering much of the frontage.

A new building, garage / barn type, has been built in the garden, with access to it via recently constructed entrance gates on the Ebbs Lane side of the property.

The middle photo depicts the house when almost all the front façade was ivy

all the front façade was ivy clad.

Both photos feature a cart. In the calendar picture a gent stands proudly on his, presumably posing for the photographer. (I have enlarged that section of the photo here on the right.) I'm assuming he was just passing, going about his business, when the photographer asked him to pose? His horse is clearly visible, standing still, and the wheels of the cart are not at all blurred. which would be expected were they to have be turning. The gent has a fine,

full beard and seems to be wearing dungarees and a cap. His left arm is resting on what looks like a large whicker basket, but I cannot make out the other contents of his cart...at a guess I would say stone roof tiles maybe?

Any ideas? Also, do you think he looks a bit like Lenin, or 'Vladimir Ilyich Ulyanov' to give him his full name, leader of the Russian Bolsheviks back in the early part of the 20th century. Little Lenny apparently visited London on many occasions, so maybe he popped down to East Hanney to preach his revolutionary theories from the back of his cart? If so, he's not exactly drawing a big crowd...clearly not much call for a Bolshevik revolution here in East Hanney back then.
