"Many of you may be aware of the national emergency alert test on the 23<sup>rd of</sup> April, sending a siren-like alert to all smart phones which will allow government, in future, to send urgent messages warning the public of life-threatening events such as flooding. (See website: https:// www.gov.uk/alerts)

What you may not be aware of is that the Hanneys has its very own '**Community Emergency Plan'** made up of volunteers which has been activated a number of times over the years, most recently for the flooding threat at the end of March and of course throughout the whole of the Covid epidemic when a small team coordinated the needs of residents with the fantastic volunteers who put themselves forward to help other residents.

There is a now a real need to increase our volunteer base with individuals who would be willing to give up time to meet up once a year for no more than a couple of hours for familiarisation with our emergency equipment, potential hazards and vulnerable areas our villages. As a volunteer you could be asked during an emergency to undertake a role as a lifter and shifter, co-ordinator, administrator, minder of vulnerable people or refreshment provider etc. There will be a role for everyone no matter your physical ability. The Community Emergency Plan is supported by both Parish Councils and Oxfordshire County Council, and is not activated lightly. When it is activated, it will not at any time put volunteers at risk. *If you are interested in volunteering your* services to support our lovely villages in a time of need by being an active member of the Hanneys Community Emergency Plan, please contact me, David distubbington@icloud.com"

May I just add that this very worthy group of community-minded folk is different to the **Flood Group**, (see article on page 16 and their contact details on page 30) which is a working party that meets once a month, whereas the emergency group only comes together in time of dire need. That said, several folk are involved with both groups, and big ups to them all!

of the Flood Group ensured that property damage was kept to a minimum.

It does drive home the point that the gullies and waterways that border our homes need to be clear of debris and especially garden waste.

Those of us that border a water course have a duty to keep it clear. If you are unsure if you are one of those, please contact either the Flood Group or the Parish Clerk and they'll let you know.

So the long awaited car park extension and MUGA, weather permitting, should be completed in early June. Once again apologies for the short term inconvenience especially to the allotment holders. The 'litter-pick' was well supported - a thank you to Paul Aram for organising and all those who attended. The general consensus was that there was less litter within the villages this year (see photo on page 14) but it's still a disappointment that those who buy food and drink feel that the correct place for disposal is the road; just



take it home please. The 20mph zones were approved recently at a meeting held by the County Council, including a stretch of the A338 from La Fontana north to the

village boundary. Thanks go to Dickon Green and especially to Sally Povolotsky our District Councillor, for her representation and drum beating at that meeting.

The final layout of the parking restrictions outside the school has also been approved; all being well they should be in place for the September term.

The second cricket net was also given the go ahead so that will be in place for the summer.

The Neighbourhood Plan has now gone for a District Council-led consultation; this is a huge document headed by David Kirk that will play an important role in the future of the Parish. (See panel below)

Preparations for the Coronation celebrations are well under way. Rosie Reed's plans and those of her opposite number from West Hanney and the Church will be revealed soon.

#### Dear Friends

I am looking forward to celebrating the Coronation and, though I am still getting used to praying for our sovereign lord King Charles rather than our sovereign lady Queen Elizabeth, I do sincerely pray that God will endue him with wisdom and that his role may be a uniting focus for our countries of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. In these challenging times we do need to co-operate constructively together for everyone's good. A crown is round to be able to be placed fittingly on the head, and not only does it symbolise leadership its circular base also illustrates unity. The same weekend our parishes will be holding a Confirmation service led by Bishop Gavin Bishop of Dorchester, laying hands on the candidates' heads and

praying that their faith may be made strong as they commit to following Jesus. Looking back on a previous confirmation service I noticed that we sang the hymn *Crown him with many crowns* written originally by Matthew Bridges (d 1851). That phrase indicates Jesus claim to be King of all.

There are 70 references to a crown in the Bible (and over 2200 to king!) mainly pointing ultimately to Jesus Christ the King of kings but also encouraging Jesus followers that they will receive crowns which symbolise the positive qualities of joy, righteousness, glory and (*as James 1 : 12 says*) life.

**More on JR Holmes...** in the last couple of issues we've looked at this fascinating local gent from the past, and here's a brief version of the story of how we come to have the charming 'Holmes Memorial Garden' in our midst.

In his fascinating book about Holmes, entitled 'Holmes of Hanney', local historian Frank Poller refers to it as the 'Shrubbery Garden', and tells how, shortly after JR's death in 1938, his widow Alice wrote to the Parish Council stating her late husband's wish was that it should be left to the village in perpetuity, recalling that he had loved and cared for this garden. The clause in the will reads 'I Give and Devise All that piece of land or shrubbery near the Post Office East Hanney aforesaid unto the East Hannev Parish Council to be used or preserved by them as a beauty spot for the benefit and enjoyment of the inhabitants of the Parish of East Hanney aforesaid in perpetuity'.

The inscription on the memorial plaque reads - "This garden was given to East Hanney by James Robins Holmes whose ashes were placed here 21st March 1938" Going back before JR's time, I'm reliably informed that the garden had always been just that, i.e. a garden that has never had any structures built upon it. I've also learned that the whole island site - marked with a red outline in the 1899 map below that contains Cross Tree House, the Old Bakery and Dorley House as well as



Holmes' Memorial Garden was originally one plot until the late Victorian times. Cross Tree House was the original property with a farmyard, brewhouse and a smithy. Holmes' garden was the original garden to the house. The blacksmith's shop comprised of a number of small sheds that would have been the buildings referred to by Frank Poller in his book as being pulled down in about 1901. They were located on Cross Tree House's current driveway and explains why the fence is stepped in that corner.

Various deeds and mortgages dating from 1850 to 1901 all handwritten on vellum parchment exist, and the oldest is an affidavit by Mr Charles Cox dated 1850 explaining that he inherited the land from his father, William Cox, who had bought the land some 45 years earlier from James Breakspear. Following Charles' death in 1901, his widow, sold the land to JR Holmes for £105



This month's calendar photo, taken in the early 1930s probably, is a view along Church St. West Hanney, looking eastwards. with the castellated tower of St James Church just visible on the right, the Plough on the left. This side of the pub is the thatched 'West Cottage' which no longer exists. It featured in the Feb 2022 issue of Hanney News and the 2022 calendar. (Copies of both still available.) The lower photo shows the front of it with a gent stood proudly in the garden. He is Percy Belcher, born on 28th April 1920. or it maybe his younger brother Alfie. They, along with sister Rita, had grown up in the cottage. Rita was the young lady at the gate in the Feb 2022 photo, with a dog, which may have been Alfie's, named Sheila. Unusual name for a dog? Their dad, born on 31st Dec 1887, also a Percy, lived there with his wife, their mum Alice. Percy Junior married Betty in St James Church in 1950, and after his parents, Percy Senior and Alice, had moved to Grove, Percy and wife



Betty moved in to the cottage. They had two daughters, Janet and Ann. The latter still lives in West Hanney and has been very helpful with my amateur research efforts, for which my grateful thanks.

The four houses on the right of the calendar pic, were built by local builders J.P. Barretts, and 'pebble dashed' - a highly skilled job - by a travelling Gypsy gentleman.

One of my Tuesday coffee morning chums lived in the first one, i.e. the one nearest the church, furthest from camera.

Another coffee drinking pal, Frank Bunce was actually born in the second one in 1937, and lived there until he got married in about 1960 and moved to East Hanney, where he still lives! A Mrs Booker lived in the third, and a Ted Booth in the fourth. The impressive tree in the middle of the pic, still exists in the front garden of Priors Court.

The Plough has a very interesting history...even relatively recent times offer up some fascinating tales. What are now the toilets used to be a small barn and in it were hung the recently slaughtered pigs that villagers owned.

A very large gent called Mr Haines - maybe Jack? - would come over from Denchworth with his bolt gun and a large sharp knife. Duly despatched, the piggies were then taken over the road to what is now the car park where they were placed above a roaring bon-fire that would burn off the bristles. The entrails would be removed, with nothing wast-ed...the intestines were cleaned up to be cooked and eaten. Occasionally the local lads would take the bladder, inflate it and voila!...a football! The pigs carcasses would be rubbed with salt, to act as a preservative, and hung in the barn. No need to pop down to Sainsburys for your bacon! Good job really, since it didn't exist back then, and you probably wouldn't have had a car either.

Simpler times no doubt, but I'll tell you what...I bet the meat tasted good!
