The recent introduction of a 20mph speed limit has generated much comment, including from the Police,

who've said that they will be no more able to police the 20mph limit than they currently are the 30mph limit. If you exceed a speed limit and provided no community Speed-watch team is around to record your transgression, you will probably get away with it, though there's always the risk of a demented penguin flapping at you - see last month's issue.

This is very different from the situation that exists when parking rules are broken. These rules are 'policed' by private contractors with individual employees who I suspect get incentives for issuing tickets. The companies for whom they work will also be incentivized to do a thorough job of ensuring the rules are strictly adhered to. So, the message is clear....do not park on these yellow lines and assume that you'll probably get away with it! You probably won't!

Regarding parking when dropping off the little people at school, the solution is surprisingly simple... use the newly enlarged car-park just beyond our Community shop. OK, you may have to walk an extra 50 metres.

the Thames Water financial situation and the fact that the company is negotiating with the government about how to continue. Will it be new money from existing shareholders? Or new share-



holders? Or the government? Over the coming weeks we shall see what happens. It is not clear what this means for the reservoir proposal.

RAPID: The RAPID Gate 2 report came out but as we expected there was no commitment to a particular direction (Reservoir or water transfer). It is disappointing to see that RAPID have not answered GARD's criticisms of the water companies cost or carbon footprint estimates, nor have they insisted on an early evaluation of Reservoir safety.

### Updates....Water Resources

Southeast (WRSE), Thames Water, Affinity Water and Southern Water are all delaying their response to the consultations on their schemes from the end of Iune to the end of this month. This means that the picture will remain unclear until September at the earliest. The only news is that Thames Water (TW) are planning to submit an application to build a test 'model dam embankment' on Cow Common (halfway along the Steventon-Hanney Road) later this year. GARD have sent me a formal update see page 7, but don't mention the 'trial build'. That said, I heard that GARD are puzzled that it is to be rather small, only three metres high and not very long. By carrying out the proposed trial excavation and then a survey or two on the clay that they dig out, TW say that they can understand the local clay's qualities under compression. Given that the embankment

for the actual reservoir will be about four miles long and about ten times higher(!) there are doubts about how much it will actually tell them.

Meantime, if you thought - hoped? - that TW's current rather challenged financial situation - slight understatement there Mr Editor - would hinder their reservoir plans, we learned at recent East and West Hanney Parish Council meetings that TW have assured everyone that the reservoir is moving ahead as planned despite the little issue at the bank!

Finally, you may have missed this little snippet of good news.....Sarah Bentley has recently resigned as CEO of Thames Water and the acting CEO will be Cathryn Ross, a former CEO of the Regulator OFWAT. My understanding is that they're the organisation whose job is, amongst others, to ensure TW don't pump raw sewage into our brooks and streams. How did that go Ms. Ross?



# More 'Party in the Park' pics...



#### Dear Editor,

Hanney News used for cyclist-bashing again I see? I was slightly irked by your "well he got what he deserved" editorial tone highlighting an admittedly illadvised attempt by a cyclist to circumvent a closed road during the relaying of Winter Lane.

I will balance this with a staggering number of drivers who turned into the Steventon Road during the road repairs S experiment conducted in Steventon last week over two days, when clearly marked "Access Only" to return, irate judging from the queues and rubber they left behind, some minutes later. I would argue it's an unwelcome societal trait that rules or instructions only applying to others seems to have become the norm, rather than being solely the preserve of the lvcra louts?

However, I digress. Mr John Myatt's letter is factually incorrect in its assertion that cyclists are subject to speed limits. Standard road rules generally apply to all road users, but speed limits are not set for cyclists on public roads. Only motor vehicles are subject to speeding laws. While it might not be deemed safe or sensible by drivers, for horses or bicycles to be ridden faster than motor vehicles, in some situations this is not only possible but desirable and can remove a vulnerable road user from a potentially hazardous interaction. On a related matter, I will also point out that the adoption of 20mph village speed limits according to Oxfordshire County Council. to "make our built environments safer and more attractive places to walk and cycle" is ironically having a marked deleterious effect on officially sanctioned and regulated competitive cycle sport. I totally see the logic of restricting speeds around vulnerable points and times such as school drop-off and pick up, allowing access to facilities by the infirm or elderly

etc but in these times of declining public health in an increasingly obesogenic environment, it is sad to report that events have already been cancelled locally that once enabled those wishing to take ownership of their health could enjoy. Adoption of this blunt 20mph tool 24/7/365 already has had unintended consequences, isn't respected by a significant number of road users (yes, the same "that rule doesn't apply to them" brigade) and likely won't be policed by Thames Vallev Police

I'm an American named Peter Schmaltz, and from 1973-75 my family lived in the Penny Farthing house in East Hanney while my father was on a work assignment to England, I was 7-9 years old at that time and attended St. James primary school. While at first, I was a fish out of water (the only 'yank' attending at the time). I soon felt invited and included in the community They were happy years for me that I retain as some of my earliest memories. Over the 50 years since I've had the opportunity to visit the Hanneys twice, once 10 vears ago and then again, this past May (along with my wife Liz). On each occasion, I stumbled into delightful conversations with current residents while I strolled about the villages looking a bit out of place and lost (I gather American tourists taking photos is not a typical occurrence for Hanney). Ten years ago, the friendly local who spotted me and asked me my name happened to also be hand delivering your newsletter door to door. I explained I once lived in East Hanney and attended St James Primary in the 70s. Imagine my surprise when she replied, "I was your teacher, Mrs. Smith."

I often witter on here about our fab Community Shop, and you'll have already seen how well it's doing under the splendid stewardship of Clive Ward and Richard Oxley. Big ups to them! See our front cover and page5!

Mind, it's not good news everywhere...a community shop and post office that served Finstock, Wilcote, Fawler and Ramsden - an area in Oxfordshire about 20 miles north of here - has closed due to rising costs and lack of footfall.

The 'Woodpecker Community Shop' was, like ours, run by the local community, but and I quote... "Income has continued to decline, and our costs have risen to the point that we would now have to triple our daily revenue just to reach a breakeven point.

The reality is that the traditional village shop is fast becoming outdated, as people change the way they live their lives."

Thanks were offered not only to "those who have worked so hard over the years to maintain a shop in the village", **but also the regular customers "who made a point of buying something from us on a daily or weekly basis".** 

The village Post Office inside the shop also closed.

A Post Office spokeswoman said: "The Post Office is inside a community shop that has closed. We are facing a particularly challenging period, and the impact of rising costs, inflation and restrictions on our funding from government mean that while we will always look to reopen branches when they close, we cannot commit to doing so in every instance.

We are committed to maintaining our access criteria so that 99 per cent of the UK's population are within three miles of a Post Office and 90 per cent are within one mile and will continue to review this position and prioritise those areas with the highest need."

This is indeed sad news for the fine folk of Finstock and further afield, and the Post Office's official comment will only add to their concern.

I've heard previously that when village shops that contain a Post Office close, there is almost never a replacement PO put in place.

Of course our shop here in Hanney currently thrives, , and long may it continue so to do. But it only will if we continue to support it and our Post Office, so superbly run by Alicia, whose charm is only matched by her efficiency!

If you can set aside a few minutes to make a regular visit to the shop for a purchase - it doesn't have to be £50, just something for a few quid...that would be great.

And of course, as Clive says in his article on page 5, if you can spare some time to help, that too would also be much appreciated.

So, let's not get smug or complacent, and let's keep using this lovely asset and help guarantee its longer term future

In case you're thinking that doesn't look like the shop you know now, well, no it isn't, When the shop first opened it was in a large port-a-cabin standing separate from the hall. The short article below gives the story ....

It was a case of all hands to the tills when the twin villages of East and West Hanney lost their only two shops in less than a year.

Now the villagers-turnedshopkeepers have earned themselves a place in the finals of the Village Ventures competition by opening, stocking and running their

own community shop and post office.

No-one draws a wage, and some of their prices are even lower than the supermarkets, volunteers told judges Judy Poore, left and David Purves.

Fresh meat and vegetables sold in the shop come straight from local farms and gardens.

A worthy award indeed, but why did three staff - I assume they're staff? - hide behind the doors in a not very welcoming gesture, though they're smiley and look happy enough. And why does another lady... shop assistant or customer I know not....squat down in front of the judges clutching a wire basket containing a pack of Andrex toilet rolls, a box of Persil Automatic and a couple of tins of salmon? Whatever the reason for this lady's pose, if you know the story, pray tell?

Everyone, especially the judges, seem to find the whole thing most amusing!

### HANNEY COMMUNITY SHOP



### This month's calen-

dar pic is of Darden House situated on the north-east corner of Snuggs Lane and Main St. in East Hanney. I printed the pic in Hanney News back in 2019 and thanks to some very helpful input at that time from the then and still current - owners. the Swinfens, and Louise Green, Hanney historian extraordinaire. I was able to identify the folk who obviously posed for the photographer in front of their lovely home. The photo was taken circa 1902. The lady on the left is Bertha Carr, holding a small child. I assume her daughter? Next to her is probably her husband Fred, and in the gateway on the right is Pamela Herman, second wife of George Herman. Pamela is with Alice, one of George's daughters from his first marriage. His first wife was Ellen, whose parents kept the Plough in East Hanney - now La Fontana - in 1871. Ellen died in Feb 1883.

aged just 34, the day after their fifth child was baptised, so almost certainly as a result of childbirth.

George remarried and produced six more children with Pamela, who was the daughter of a cattle dealer in Lower Swell, a small village in Gloucestershire.

Their youngest child Albert was killed in WW1, and his name is on the memorial in St James church.



There exists another photo, taken by Henry Taunt in 1901...see lower pic. (I suspect Henry Taunt also took our calendar photo.) In it a gent stands in the gateway, probably George Herman, who ran a groceries and provisions business at 'Church Green House' as Darden House was then known, from about 1878 to the early part of the 20th Century. Why the reference to 'Church Green'? Read on...page 20 Well, there is a little green area outside their home and place of business - it's still there - and the property next to it, 'Midgy House', was yet to be built, so the adjacent property was indeed a church...'St James the Less', and still active back then. It had been built in 1856, designed by the famous church architect George Edmund Street , who at the time lived in Wantage.

Stylistically, he was a leading practitioner of the Victorian Gothic Revival style.

His modest but extremely



attractive little church remained an active place of worship until it was sold and become a private house in the 1970s.

Its first owner was Bob Harris, famous 'Whispering Bob' the bearded DJ dude and presenter of the Beeb's 'Old Grey Whistle Test' TV music show. Bob didn't live there that long, the current owners having bought the property in the mid 1980s.

I have an update on the subject of Winter Lane in West Hanney, often referred to as 'Winters' ...plural. Ok. I know, it's not life-changing stuff, but it's something I've wondered about since I first heard the name of the road in which I've lived since 2000, and which is now of course where Hanney News Global International's HO is sited! This from local historian and all round good egg, Paul Sayers... "When I moved in 30 years ago I referred to Winter Lane and was told very firmly 'I can tell you're not from round here. We calls it Winters Lane, always been Winters Lane. Wasn't till them blokes from the council came round and put up that daft sign that anybody called it Winter Lane." And, of course, he was right because it leads to Winters Tumulus (now ploughed out) referred to in an Abingdon Abbey charter of 956 AD."

Hmm...wonder who laid 'neath the Tumulus afore it was 'ploughed out'? Someone called Winter or Winters I assume?

Now, long term West Hanney resident and a great village character - one Vic Carter was actually born in Winter Lane (!) in 1945, and told me that his birth certificate states 'Winters Lane' as his place of birth. That said, local builder L J Barrett always insisted it was Winter singular, and used to get quite angry if anyone pluralized it. I heard - soon after we moved in back in 2000 - that it was so called because it was the only accessible route into Hanney back in the days of harsh winters. That sounded quite convincing to me. So, take your pick ...I'm sticking with the singular, if only for the sake of clarity, since the 'daft' sign at the bottom of the road put up by 'them blokes from the council' does indeed state Winter Lane. If you can shed some more light on this, please get in touch.


