

Dear Friends

I am interested in strength of character; so I look forward to the Rugby World Cup which begins this month. I would like England to win but am more confident there will be some really entertaining games rather than England will be successful.

You may of course not want to continue reading after those two sentences; but one of the reasons I enjoy rugby is that it is a game for people with different skills and physiques and it helps build character. England Rugby have 5 core values: Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline and Sportsmanship whereas the Welsh Rugby Union have 6: Courage, Honour, Integrity, Excellence, Family and Success. It is also back to school this month and our church school at St James have 3 core values: they are Courage, Community and Kindness - the reason I find them easy to remember is because my old headteacher had the initials CCK.

What we value in life impacts on our character and that in turn affects how we relate and what sort of community we shape. A satisfying life and a peaceful environment are important to our wellbeing but even more so is our ability to respond well to all the challenges we face.

As a Christian minister who likes sport, have to remind myself that there is no mention of sport in the Old Testament and in the ancient world of the Israelites their physical activities were work, dancing and fighting. Competitive sport only begins to be referred to when the Jewish culture mixes with the Greeks and the Romans. However, the bible has a lot to say about God helping us develop strength of character.

The list of important values in the bible is rather long but Jesus does say we should seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness and St Paul charges Timothy to pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness. 1 Tim 6: 11.

I wonder what values you would want to embody and what characteristics you would want your family to display. As a new school year begins with all the changes and challenges that brings what qualities of character would you and your family hope to develop?

May the love and strength of Jesus be your support in all your work and leisure. God bless.

"Should you want to visit the Post Office in Grove, the launderette or even the tattoo parlour, you'd be forgiven for missing the unassuming unit on the corner which is the Cornerstone Café.

However it's worth visiting. This is the oldest community café in the area. Unusually in 1995 four churches got together to set up a café to serve the expanding communities in the area.

They found a retail unit in the Grovelands shopping centre off Newlands Drive, equipped it and set up a charitable trust to run it. 28 years on its still going.

However the proof of the café is in the tasting! When you visit, there's good parking right outside; there's fully disabled access and good facilities. And there's a fun children's corner. Unique to Cornerstone is "the marble jar" - this is stocked by contri-



butions from customers, with the purpose of provided free meals for those who can't afford one themselves. Obviously this is increasingly needed as people feel the pressures of the cost of living crisis.

The pick of the menu? Many people would say the selection

of home-made cakes, teas and coffee. Others go for the meals, soups and salads all prepared on the premises by the skilled cooks, while others simply like the friendly atmosphere created by the manager, her staff and the volunteers who provide the service.

Of course being a community café, it's not only about eating. It hosts a variety of other activities, from a stroke recovery group, an activity morning for pre-school children with their carers, a craft afternoon, different games groups, open to anyone, plus free wi-fi. Moreover tucked behind the eating area is the bookshop specialising in Bibles, cards, fair-trade goods, and gifts. You'll find a warm welcome when you visit.

Please keep off it during those times and ensure that doggies don't stray onto it. The weed-killer is strong stuff and not kind to Rover!

Dear Editor

Having just read his letter in the August issue I am sorry to disillusion Philip Ward and any others who think that cyclists do not have to obey speed limits; it is my understanding they do. The Road Traffic Act 1988 Section 36 sub-section 1 states:

"Where a traffic sign, being a sign has been lawfully placed on or near a road, a person driving or propelling a vehicle who fails to comply with the indication given by the sign is guilty of an offence."

NOTE: - A bicycle is, of course, a vehicle being propelled.

This is encapsulated very clearly in the latest edition of the Highway Code under "Rules for Cyclists (59 to 82)".

Rule 69 states: "You **MUST** obey all traffic signs and traffic light signals."

NOTES— The "MUST" in upper case is not by me; it is in the Highway Code.

Speed limit signs are some of the many official "Traffic Signs" illustrated in the Highway Code.

I also see that Mr Ward says that the introduction of 20mph zones has already caused some cycling events to be cancelled. I wonder why? Could it be because the organisers realise that unless the riders slow down in such zones they would be exceeding the speed limit by much more than they ever could in a 30mph zone. So much so that it was unlikely to be ignored. In such cases the riders may be charged with committing an offence which they, the organisers, could also be charged with inciting. Just a thought.

In conclusion, Mr Ward's letter confirms my belief that many (most) cyclists do not know the highway code. They really ought to read and abide by it, especially those using the roads for group outings or as a race training track; it isn't. Unfortunately, I have to say, the same lack knowledge also applies to many car drivers. Its rules are

For reference, the lower pic is of a maypole, also on East Hanney's village green, on the other side of the road.


The calendar pic is part of the Henry Taunt collection and was almost certainly taken in 1908, or 1905.

In fact, I believe this apparatus is banned in many areas." Indeed it now is ... 'Elf and Safety' saw to that!






