



The beginning of November is a time for **remembering** with All Saints Day, All Souls Day and Armistice Day.

On Armistice Day do you remember a specific person or people?
My twin brother (who was a submariner in the Falklands conflict) and I were named after our uncle, Squadron Leader Thomas Musgrove Nicholls. He was killed aged 22 on the 30th/31st March

1944 flying on a mission to Nuremberg. He was the pilot of a Lancaster III and with his crew - see photo - was shot down having previously completed nearly twenty successful missions.

Having been an army chaplain and with a son in The Kings Royal Hussars, there are several people I recall, both those currently serving as well as those who have sacrificed their lives and health. But if you do not have someone personal you remember, the situation in Ukraine and what is happening in Israel and the Gaza strip must surely spur us on to reflect on the sacrifices people make when the terror and destruction of war devastates us.

It certainly makes me grateful for the relative safety, security and freedom we enjoy in our country and renews my determination to pray for peace and the end to conflict.



As a Christian I trust in God's ultimate good purposes where love, loyalty, justice and prosperity will be perfected causing war, hatred and evil to cease but I also believe his promise that this will be completed only when the Lord Jesus returns.

Which leads into the season of Advent at the end of this month and start of December, when the church begins to focus on what the bible teaches about the last days and Christ's return as King of Glory.

It is more than a preparation for Christmas; it specifically encourages us to hope in a good ending even when we experience the sad loss of loved ones and the sacrifices many of them made.
Who will you remember with hope and love? Who will you give thanks for?

This pic appeared in our Sept. issue, and I've now printed the 'colourised' version. Not done by me I should add, and I'm not sure if I prefer it to the original, which of course was black and white. What do you reckon?

Whatever, I now have the names of the children in the pic, for which my thanks to Ann Fewins. They are, from left to right, Kate

Ferris, Alice Froud, Binkie Belcher, Freddie Carr - he's the small child at the front with

white sun-hat, Beth Belcher - possibly Binkie's elder sister? - and an unknown boy at back in the shadow of the huge Elm tree that stood on the green at the time. Finally, Annie Shepherd is the girl on the far right. She one of a very large family who

lived in Ebbs Lane. Ann also told me that the swing itself was erected in 1901and at the same time one was installed outside what is now Darden House in East Hanney, on the main road just before 'St James the Less' church which was still functioning back then of course.

Back to the kids...I wonder if Alice Froud had a brother called Charlie? He was a survivor of the First World War and lived on East Hanney village green in the last house on the right, a thatched cottage that's still there.

Along with many other survivors, Charlie is pictured in the Olde Hanney Room in the Village Hall...a very moving picture, well worth a look, especially given the time of year.

I often wonder why more folk don't come down to the village hall, aka Hanney War Memorial Hall, of a Tuesday morning. anytime between 10am to 11.30am for the regular 'Senior Citizens' Coffee Morning. What's to like.....a warm, friendly atmosphere: laughs and jokes, tea and coffee, biscuits, home-made cakes, a raffle. a chance to meet new folk and make new friends, masses of reminiscing.... "Here, do vou remember Fred, wonder what happened to him?"... type stuff, along with informal discussion on current local issues. What's not to like.... Well, it costs a whole £1.50p - that covers everything. Outrageous!

So to all mature Hanney folk - actually any ages are welcome - I say come along and give it a try! If it's not for you then don't come again. It's as simple as that.

The Senior Citizens, wonderfully managed by a committee led by Marcia Graham, also hold a regular monthly afternoon gathering, always the 4th Thursday of the month. On these occasions, there is to be had more of most of the above, along with a talk or various activities, and a delicious tea with that yummy fruit bread! Remember it? I used to love it as a kid! Loadsa butter, what a treat!

You may remember the recent mention in these pages regarding 'Winter' v 'Winters' Lane in West Hanney. Well, East Hanney also have their own plural v singular spot of argy bargy with Ashfields Lane and Ashfields Close.

I'm reliably informed that in the fairly recent past they were singular...Ashfielduntil street signs were erected with an S where there previously was none! If you can shed any light, do get in touch. My contact details bottom of page 2.

In the Sept issue I printed this snap of our 'keep fit' ladies back in the day. I didn't have every name, but now I do thanks to responses from helpful village folk!

The unknown lady standing far left was Mavis Wiffen. She lived in The Croft, West Hanney, and her husband Gerald was based at MG Abingdon in the competitions dept., preparing BL



works rally cars, including Minis for Paddy Hopkirk, top rally driver of the day. Many thanks to Ian Vickers for this info.

Third from the left was Joan Newman and second from right was Jean - sorry, no surname - from Grove. Next to her, far right, was Kay Philips, also from Grove. Kneeling far left was Glynis Bedwell, and I'm reliably informed that second from the right, the lady who I was told might have been Sandra Lay, indeed was her.

Meantime, back in the August issue I printed this rather strange little snap of our community shop before it was moved to its current location.

I can now reveal the names of the game folk who were up for a bit of silly posing as suggested, apparently, by the local newspaper photographer.

Standing rather shyly behind the doors are l - r: Pat Webb, Mr Shadbolt the Postmaster - maybe his first name was Val? - and Brian Longworth. Brian was a gent not known for his shyness...he must have struggled to remain in the background and do what the photographer told him!

Pat was a co-founder of the shop along with Audrey Vickars, and Brian and his wife Kay used to volunteer in the shop from when it first opened, until ill health prevented him from continuing, many years later.



Ann White is the lady kneeling with the basket... she's also in the 'keep fit' snap at the top of the page. This time she's been allowed to stand - she's 3rd from the right. Ann and her husband Ernie still live in East Hanney, and she told me at a recent coffee morning - see page 17 - that the contents of her basket were intended to show that for young mums - and dads and anyone else of course - with babies but no car, bulky goods such as toilet paper, washing powder etc. could be bought right here Hanney, as indeed they still can!

Is now a good time to give our lovely little shop, all staffed and run by volunteers, a plug, and urge you to use it? And if you fancy helping out yourself any time behind the counter, pop in and leave your contact details.

I do a couple of afternoons a month...always great fun and I've not yet been asked to pose for any daft photographs, squatting down on the floor or peering out from behind a half closed door!

This month's calendar pic is of Eddins Pond, aka Headings, which was at the western end of Church St., West Hanney, as the road swings to the right and joins Main St. (I'm assuming you've turned right as you left the Plough?) It's now a patch of grass with trees...see bottom pic.

I have found two other images of it from back in the day. It was probably the 1970s when it was filled in, but if you have a more specific year than that I'd love to hear from you. Also anything else you know about how it came to be filled in, and with what?

In a somewhat spooky coincidence, a recent meeting of West Hanney Parish Council discussed the possibility of reestablishing it, and have arranged for a formal study - which may have already happened as you read this - of the implications, cost etc. of reinstating it and a couple of others in the West Hanney parish. (See the WHPC's article on page 7.) John Spindloe is one of the gents I have coffee with every Tuesday morning - see page 17 - and he tells of how he fell into Eddins Pond in 1933! He was a four year old at the time, reaching down over the fence with a jam jar on a piece of string and a stick trying to catch newts! His Dad took him home and stood him in front of the fire to dry out!

Back in the day, Wally Smart the farmeror one of his farmhands - would bring his horses at the end of a day's ploughing up to the pond, lead them into it and wash them down as they stood there. Now that would have made a fantastic pic! Another photo-op would have been the aforementioned John and his pals, as

young boys, skating on the pond in the winter!

The thatched cottage in the background is Rose Cottage, and that gets a mention on page nine this month regarding the recent passing of its long time resident Sue Wright, who I'm sure would have had more tales to tell of Eddins Pond.




