In the last two months we have suffered more flooding from ever decreasing amounts of rainfall. Widespread property damage was only avoided because of the tireless work of the volunteers of the Hanney Flood Group.

When most of the village were keeping out of the rain they were out barricading, sandbagging, and clearing to push the water through the village as quick as possible, so a huge thank you is due to those volunteers who kept us all safe

The PC has joined a newly formed flood resilience group whose membership contains scientists, climatologists, hydrologists, environmentalists, Parish, District and County Councillors, all looking at the potential impact of climate change, development, waterway maintenance and of course the possibility of a reservoir for the next 30 years, to our community. Now we need to record the effects of the most recent flooding events, and their impact on everyday life; a picture of a car stranded in our streets is one thing but what is the story behind it? Were they trying to get to hospital or a GP, returning from hospital, trying to get an appointment, was schooling or employment impacted?

There is a human story and cost to every flood event and the powers that be need to know how our community is disrupted virtually every time we have rain. Please send anything you have, anonymously if you prefer, to Wendy our Clerk so we can begin to catalogue the personal impacts of flooding.

Many residents have property that borders either the brook or the ditches. It is for the safety and security of everyone that these are maintained and cleared of obstructions and it is that property owner's legal responsibility to do so, so please do.

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is a national initiative where active members of local communities join with the support of the Police to monitor speeds of vehicles using approved speed detection devices. Their aim being to help and support their communities by influencing driver behaviour – by reducing speeds and improving road safety for all road users including pedestrians, cyclists, horse riders and especially school children on their way to and from school.

CSW is all about education, not enforcement, letters are sent by Thames Valley Police (TVP) to registered keepers of vehicles that have been monitored driving over the speed limit, and are simply advised to slow down and stick to the speed limits. The West Hanney CSW Group now has 9 volunteers who have completed the online and practical training and are authorised by TVP to operate from three locations in West Hanney. The Parish Council has purchased an approved speed gun that has a longer range that the previous tripodmounted speed device. A recent session on Winter Lane recorded 34 vehicles, of which 24 (70%) were travelling faster than 24mph and 5 (15%) were travelling faster than 30mph. The registered owners of the vehicles

travelling at 25mph or over will have received a letter from TVP. 4 of these vehicles had number plates that did not match their DVLA record and these vehicles were also brought to the attention of TVP. Paul Sayers, our Community Woodland group main

man has been carrying out the annual check and clean out of the nest boxes which the group installed in the woodland some time back.

There are currently around 45 boxes, of which 34 contained the remains of bird nests or nesting material. 6 were being used by wood mice, including one where Paul disturbed 4 mice when he removed the front.



He told me that *"in view* of the current wet ground conditions it would have been unkind to evict the mice". Of the remaining boxes, one contained a disused wasp's nest, and the others were either not used

or in a state of serious disrepair. As ever, big thanks to Paul and his team for their hard work, from all of us who enjoy the woodland, a great community asset. I'm sure also thanks to him from the little mice still living in the nest box!

'This survey is intended to be conducted by volunteers from within our village community. We need about 5 or 6 volunteers prepared to give quite a bit of time over two months - perhaps as much as a day a week but probably only an hour or two at a time. Volunteers would also be involved in devising the format of the survey and collating results. It will not work without them!

A purpose will be to highlight the most important issues on which people agree. This could provide East Hanney Parish Council with a powerful mandate to speak on behalf of residents to higher authorities.

This exercise is deliberately face to face rather than online, or via form filling. It could be fun to be part of it! But it will not easily happen without volunteers happy to give their time. - case to the Vale of White Horse District Planners that no further developments should be allowed in Hanney, if for no other reason than they add to the flooding problem.

Put very simply, open areas of land absorb water...developments don't! The rainwater they prevent from being absorbed into the ground - roofs, roads, driveways, pavements etc. - has to go



somewhere else, and unless and until our whole drainage system all the way from down in Wantage, through Grove and the Hanneys and on up towards Frilford is drastically improved, any new developments are only going to make things worse. Thames Water have finally admitted that the reservoir would cause a 1 metre rise in groundwater levels without serious mitigation! After 25 years of denying any effect, they still have no evidence of how to address this.

Parts of Hanney and Steventon would be under water for large parts of the year, even without heavy rain!

At the time of writing (13th February) the Secretary of State for DEFRA has not made any decision on the reservoir plans or on GARD's call for a Public Inquiry, support for which has grown to

Both the County Council and the Vale of White Horse have passed unanimous council motions re-affirming opposition to the Reservoir, asking for talks and plans to be suspended.

Layla Moran MP called for a Westminster debate on Thames Water's terrible record regarding sewage and spoke against reservoir proposals.

There is still time for you and our MPs to influence the decision.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

In the dim and distant past when I was taking O' levels, as they were called then, I took an O' level in 'House Craft'. It covered everything one might need to know for looking after the home. The teacher, I can't remember her name now, was a fanatic about cleanliness, and we students used to roll our eyes as she went on and on about it.

We have to bear in mind this was the time before such things as branded odour busters or easy to use antibacterial sprays – good old bleach was about the only thing you could buy. But despite her being a figure of fun to us, in retrospect I realise now that she knew a thing or two. She was a great advocate of the cleansing and antibacterial properties of sunlight and fresh air. She would wax lyrical about clothes drying on the washing line on a sunny day and the importance of throwing open the curtains to drench the room in as much sun light as possible to get rid of the germs.

She also endorsed the 'Spring Clean', something that seems to have gone out of fashion – certainly in my house.

When you read this we will still be in the season of Lent, the season in the Christian Church's calendar leading up to the Cross

of Good Friday and Jesus' glorious resurrection on Easter Day. The word Lent has Old English and Germanic origins; lencten 'spring' and 'lengthening' of days. 
