

The change from the old diesels to electric, means the Council expect to save more than 20 tonnes of carbon dioxide a year.

The new vehicles also have a compressor function which means that despite being the same overall size as the old food waste trucks, they can now take more waste before it fills up – meaning fewer trips to the reprocessing facility to empty. Like many other EVs it is also quieter. Good news eh, fellow greenies?

This is essential work that will help reduce flooding within the village and there will be complimentary breakfast baps for those that need it.

If you're reading this after the 12th, then thanks to all who attended - it was a great job!

In November the PC met to set the budget for 2024/25. This directly effects the Council Tax we all pay, and everyone is concerned as to what will happen within the economy as costs are increasing everywhere you look. East Hanney now has more facilities than ever, two new playgrounds, a MUGA, a car park extension, new dog walking areas, a newly planted community orchard, a new wildflower meadow, several new benches and more waste bins. In this year to April 2025 we will install an outside fitness area and a bus shelter on the Wantage bound side of the A338. With all these new facilities and bearing in mind the uncertainties within the economy, the PC wanted to work within a budget that meant there would be no additional cost to the residents of East Hanney; this was achieved and there will be no additional cost to the residents of East Hanney for the year 2024/25.



The programme was first broadcast on 9th April 1947 as 'How does your garden grow?' The name was changed to 'Gardeners' Question Time' in 1951, going nationwide in 1957. It's a testament to its popularity that it still attracts a weekly audience of about two million listeners!

The HGC was founded in 1975, and this event will be a significant celebration marking our **50th Anniversary**.

This active and popular Hanney Club, with a membership of around 100, has come a long way since those early days.

It will be a ticketed event, available on a 'first-come-first-served' basis.

Tickets at £4 will include a glass of wine on arrival, and doors will be open to the audience from 5.00pm.

The first programme will be broadcast nationwide on Friday 31st Jan and Sunday 2nd Feb; the second recording on Friday 21st Feb and Sunday 23rd Feb...Friday's at 3pm, Sunday's at 2pm.

Each entry ticket will have space for attendees to write their question.

If selected, the ticket holder will be seated at the front to ask their question, which the panel never see in advance!

Concerns about e-scooters and local neighbourhood policing teams

Undoubtedly an issue that divides opinion, and whether it's Christmas presents or the January sales, e-scooters can be on a lot of people's lists. Undoubtedly for many they are a convenient way to get around, but e-scooters

and illegal e-bikes generate a great deal of concern and it remains illegal to use privately owned e-scooters anywhere on public land. Whilst it is an issue that can be more prevalent in our towns, it is an issue that many residents have a view on. I've called on both the previous and the current government to review the law around e-scooters, which are classed as motor vehicles and it is currently impossible to get insurance, meaning that currently only council-run schemes are legal and then only with a driving license.

Aside from the risk of injury and concerns about the fire risks from some batteries, the police are responding to an increased public concern. During November alone 80 e-scooters and e-bikes were seized. Sadly alongside those who want to use these vehicles to simply get around, criminals will also use them in an attempt to evade the police.

Efforts will continue to tackle this issue as we continue the focus on anti-social behaviour in the New Year.

There has also been more talk lately of having named local police officers across the country. Well I'm pleased to say that this has been the case for many years in Thames Valley. Every neighbourhood area in Thames Valley has a team of sergeants, police constables and police community support officers (PCSOs), and as we're dou-



bling the number of neighbourhood officers those teams are growing in size. You can find out who is on your local team, and how to contact them at www.thamesvalley.police.uk/area/yourarea

And a big well done to our local Community Speedwatch Volunteers in the Hanneys.

Road safety is one of the biggest concerns raised by residents, and whilst police enforcement of speeding, drink/drug driving and mobile phone use is on the up, volunteers help to reinforce the message about community concern locally.

Across the whole of Thames Valley there are more than 2,300 volunteers who give thousands of hours.

Community Speedwatch is about education not enforcement.

Almost 50,000 warning letters are sent each year, and whilst those who are caught three times or more will be getting a visit from the police, the good news is that the vast majority of people aren't found to be speeding again. Almost 95% of drivers who receive a warning letter are not found to be speeding again in the next 12 months.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



Having just celebrated the wonder of new life in the Nativity we now turn to face a year which promises to be challenging for us all.

2024 saw great changes - in government, in how our climate behaves, in the descent of much of the Middle East, including the Holy Land, into a quagmire of violence and suffering.

And something that can touch us all, of how our Parliament considers we should treat those who face death from terminal illness. It was a debate in which MPs on both sides spoke both with passion and reason. It crossed party, moral and religious lines. For some it was an issue of faith, of the sanctity of human life. For others how our human dignity should be respected and a person's freedom to choose acknowledged. And many balanced those issues but came to decide on the practical questions of how we can be certain of a sick person's real intention and whether there can be sufficient safeguards to prevent abuse.

Through the ages the church has had to grapple with how Christian love and compassion should inform how people behave. The treatment of the poor, the rich,

those considered insane, unmarried parents, capital punishment, pacifists and warriors, homosexuality, the divorced, those with gender dysphoria, even slavery, have all been the subject of debate within the church as well as without. Some remain so.

The decision of Parliament to legalise assisted dying has a long way to go before it is on the statute book. There will be much further debate both inside and outside Parliament on how to implement it to make it effective while minimising the risk of abuse.

It is right to have strongly held views and to articulate them. But in doing so we should all try to have compassion for, and understanding of, those who disagree with us whether because of their own experiences, faith, reason or moral judgment. This may be one of those rare occasions when we may do well to emulate the behaviour of our MPs rather than criticise them. And maybe find time to pray for them, and the members of the House of Lords, in their challenging task.

Dear Editor,

GARD Update PLEASE JOIN GARD!

GARD is going from strength to strength. Membership is growing as people respond to our publicity. The GARD & CPRE petition now has over 4700 signatures.

Not yet a member? Please join GARD. We need support for GARD to be stated as clearly and publicly as possible. Please join and be counted with us. You do not have to find time to assist; we welcome offers of help but that is a bonus for us.

Legal action is underway. **GARD** has now incorporated a separate not-for-profit company, SAFERWaterS (Sustainable Answers For Environmentally Resilient WATER Solutions), as agreed at October's EGM. This company will act for our communities where GARD, as an unincorporated pressure group, would face high risks or be legally unable to take part eg. Judicial Review or Development Consent Order (DCO).

GARD continues to lead the campaign and remains the membership base (only GARD members can become part of the new Company)

GARD continues to provide crucial scientific expertise and research into all matters relating to the proposed Mega Reservoir

Current legal actions: on 19th November CPRE and SAFERWaterS submitted a claim for a Judicial Review of the decision by Steve Reed (DEFRA Secretary of State) to allow the SESRO plans through to the next stage. In January we shall hear if the Judge agrees with the claim enough to hold a public hearing.

The final approval stage for a National Infrastructure project like SESRO is a **Development** Consent Order. If the Judicial Review fails, then SAFERWaterS would if necessary contest the DCO, representing the work of the un-incorporated GARD.

We're conducting site surveys and ground investigations in the local area, including near Steventon, East Hanney, Drayton, and Sutton Courtenay. You may see our surveyors conducting various investigations, such as winter bird surveys and traffic surveys.

We're also carrying out a clay compaction trial on land off Hanney Road, near East Hanney, to support our reservoir design plans. We have begun excavating the clay to build temporary embankments up to three metres high to test the clay. We're aiming to finish by February 2025, weather permitting.


