Thank you everyone who turned out at short notice and helped plant the trees on Kings Leases; an impressive 400 trees were planted in 2 hours.

In November we plan on having another 'Community tree planting day', and we are considering having tree dedications which will be free. Each tree will have a name plaque for the family that planted it. Even more ambitiously we are considering a tree for every home in East Hanney - it'll be your tree for generations and totally free.

Oxford County Council is being pushed yet again to get the new bus shelter installed on the A338, for those who need to get to Wantage.

We have ordered 30 oak posts; these will be installed to protect the grass verges from those who believe they are for parking cars and vans. If you can suggest any area that needs protecting, contact the Clerk as it may not be on our list.

Plans are being put in place to improve the footpath along the brook from the Iron Bridge to the first stile. "Why stop there?' you may ask when the full length of the path needs improving. Quite right it does but the Parish does not own that land.

We met on 5th March to consider a number of planning applications; updates from the Community Speedwatch group; future flood resilience; maintenance and improvement of our open, green community spaces; the use of a grant for public art and the implications of the proposed ending of two -tier council arrangements in Oxfordshire. Proposals for replacement trees are still being developed following excellent suggestions from Hanney Gardening Club's GQT recording and the recent bee-friendly talk. As usual, papers can be found on the Parish Council web-site (details as above). On Tuesday 11th March the Planning Inspectorate heard the appeal against the refusal of planning permission for Manor Solar Farm in the Parish of West Hanney. close to Denchworth. Seven residents from Denchworth and West Hanney attended the hearing including the Chairman of Denchworth Meeting and the Chairman of WHPC.

The hearing lasted all day and considered the 4 main reasons for refusal of planning permission:

harm to the landscape character, historic features, and tranquility of the area, including the wider setting of the North Wessex Downs National Landscape.

effects to the setting of nearby listed buildings and the Denchworth Conservation Area.

The adequacy of information to ensure preservation and enhancement of the ecology and biodiversity of the site, especially safeguarding the priority species of skylarks breeding and foraging there. Implications for traffic and road safety during the construction and operational phases of the farm.

WHPC was particularly concerned that shortly before the appeal hearing the Highway Authority had changed its view on the suitability of the route south of Lyford for construction traffic (including 16.5m articulated HGV lorries) and had agreed a route through West Hanney using Winter Lane and Main Street and crossing Botney Bridge. WHPC wrote to the Director of Highways and Operations strongly objecting to this route on the grounds that it was unsuitable for HGVs and posed a significant risk to highway safety for all road users, including pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders. At the hearing, the Highway Authority announced that they had decided the route through West Hanney was also unsuitable for construction traffic. Hasty discussions outside the appeal hearing ensued and the route via the Lyford Industrial Estate once again become the agreed route for all construction traffic, with revised mitigation measures. A site visit was conducted by the Planning

A site visit was conducted by the Planning Inspector the following day, including walking the restricted byway from West Hanney and Denchworth. The outcome of this appeal hearing should be published in early April.

Could you be their next victim?

Whilst many crimes are falling, such as burglary down by a third since before the pandemic - sadly we are all more at risk



online. We can all feel the benefits of living our lives in a more connected way, but with the convenience that technology brings, there are also risks, but a huge amount of cyber crime and fraud is preventable.

Scams can take place online, on the phone or in person. Here are some of the ways fraudsters may try and target you and the signs to spot to help you protect yourself:

MAIL SCAMS Common types of postal scams include fake lotteries and prize draws, offers of investments and inheritance windfalls. What to look out for: irresistible offers that are too good to be true; unfamiliar branding; not using your name; bad spelling and grammar.

TELEPHONE SCAMS Common telephone scams include investments, pension or computer support scams. The person calling often sounds professional and may pretend to be from a trusted organisation such as your bank, the police or a company you recognise. What to look out for: callers asking you to share personal or financial information or a passcode or pin; callers asking for remote access to your computer; callers trying to rush or pressure you into making decisions.

gitimate business people selling goods or services that are faulty, overpriced, poor quality or non-existent. What to look out for: being asked for money upfront before providing any goods or service; No ID or proof of who they are; telling you they're doing work for neighbours to try and gain your trust.

EMAIL, TEXT AND WEBSITE SCAMS In what is known as Phishing, an email or text may appear to be from your bank or other company in order to trick you into revealing personal details . You may be asked to click on a link which takes you to a fake website where you will be prompted to enter your details. What to look out for: spelling or grammar mistakes in emails or texts; they may not use your name; an unusual email address which may be similar but doesn't match the company email; strong encouragement to click on a link.

Remember, anyone can be a scam victim.

If you spot a scam, always report it. You can also look out for other people who may be vulnerable to scams by joining friendsagainstscams.org.uk to help raise awareness throughout your community. For more information visit stopthinkfraud.campaign.gov.uk.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



"You will hear of wars and rumours of wars". Those words from St Matthew's Gospel have resonated down the centuries. They echo so strongly today.

In our local community we have welcomed many who have fled the horrors of the conflict in Ukraine. It is a country I know as I visited Kyiv several times on business in the year before Covid. I found its people welcoming but it is a hard place. An ancient country with its capital a centre of culture and learning when Moscow was still a swamp.

It is predominately Orthodox but with strong communities of Catholics and Protestants. In the heart of Kyiv is the Great Choral Synagogue and Jewish people play an important part in business and politics e.g. the President himself, Volodymyr Zelensky.

I made many friends there. One was a lady whose late father was the Ukrainian commander of a Russian nuclear missile silo, and whose Russian mother had become a Ukrainian nationalist.

My friend spoke Russian and Ukrainian (as do most Ukrainians) and was married to a lawyer in Moscow to whom she flew back at weekends.

By 2019 Ukraine had been at war with Russia for 5 years but we in the West hardly noticed. I rarely if ever witnessed animosity between the Russian emigres or the native Ukrainians.

But it was not an harmonious society. There was corruption and, as one English expat high up in the state energy corporation said to me, it still worked on the Soviet model of inefficiency.

And now for 3 years it has suffered from the barbaric onslaught of its neighbour and most recently betrayal by its most important ally.

It is difficult sometimes to understand or discern God's will amidst such suffering. But that does not stop us praying daily for our Ukrainian brothers and sisters. At every Eucharist at St James we have a candle lit on the altar to keep them in our minds.

It's not always obvious when your dog has restrictions, but most people see the difference after massage.

GARD's view of a 'smaller' reservoir on the SESRO site

Introduction and Context

Some people ask: "what is GARD's view of a smaller reservoir on the SESRO site, would GARD still oppose this?"

We need to give the context:

Thames Water are not 'offering' a smaller reservoir, indeed, post-consultation, they even increased reservoir size, to 150 billion litres from the 100 billion-litre size rejected at the 2010 Public Inquiry; and there is no sense in which one can 'negotiate' with Thames Water about a smaller size reservoir. Unless there is a Public Inquiry, the Development Consent Order (DCO) hearings in 2027 will not consider any options oth er than the huge SESRO.

The only way to bring discussion of a smaller reservoir into play, is to strongly support GARD and CPRE's call for a Public Inquiry.

Is any size reservoir necessary?

GARD's analysis shows that, even on Thames Water's exaggerated population and housing growth figures, *there is no water deficit* before the mid-2050s. After that, a much smaller reservoir, or preferably, a water transfer from the River Severn, might be needed to supply London and Hertfordshire. GARD would prefer the more adaptable, cheaper, quicker delivered, more drought-resilient water transfer.

The Environment Agency's figures, on the government website, show the need for water **declining** to 2050. Why? Well, the government has finally forced the water companies to commit to lower levels of leakage, and personal use (via efficiency measures and metering). **No reservoir of any size is needed.**

A smaller reservoir?

Thames could have promoted a smaller reservoir (up to 50 billion litres, one third of SESRO) after the 2010 Inquiry Inspector concluded that there *might be a case for one, but that Thames had not proved it.*

In pursuing higher profits from a larger reservoir (via higher customer bills) Thames Water ignored the Inspector's conclusion, promoting instead the huge SESRO. A reservoir much smaller than SESRO would be far preferrable, because it would: not seal the flood plains, which are crucial to Hanney flood relief; be sited further from the villages, be largely contained below ground, with low bund walls (like Farmoor) which would not dominate the landscape, and be very much safer in the case of any Dam Breach; not have the very large effect on groundwater levels; lead to much less loss of good farmland and biodiversity/wildlife; cost much less on customer's bills; be much less disruptive and polluting in the construction phase.

If a Public Inquiry recommended a Reservoir smaller than 50 billion litres, GARD would accept the decision, but continue campaigning on issues of ensuring minimum impact and maximum safety of the design up to DCO approval.

Major Power Outage in West Hanney, 28 Feb to 1 March

Over the period from 6pm on 28th February until noon on the 1st March some 50% of West Hanney properties were without electricity due to a major outage.

The temperature was dropping quickly and unless the power was restored quickly, many people faced an evening and night in freezing conditions.

In addition to heating, cooking meals was out of the question for many, with the blackout having occurred prior to the evening meal. The first port of call would normally be The Plough pub, but it was also affected by the lack of power.

For many residents this could have been an unmitigated disaster. However, help was at hand via the public spirited people and organisations within the Hanneys who immediately sprang into action akin to a well oiled machine.

There were properties unaffected by the power cut and many of their occupiers sought out neighbours who required help, and generously provided it.

The power cut continued throughout the night and at 6.30 am the Emergency Team Leader invoked the village 'Emergency Plan'.

A 'rest centre' was set up in the Hanney War Memorial Hall which provided warmth and hot refreshments. Volunteers were mobilised and door to door checks were made in affected areas to ensure all residents were safe and sound, and to inform them that the village hall was open.

Power was eventually restored about noon and the volunteers were stood down.

During a large power cut, communication is very difficult and old fashioned 'face to face' by those walking the streets checking on residents and explaining what was going on regarding the power outage proved very beneficial. Lesson to be learned - boots on the ground are essential.

There is much jovial rivalry between East and West Hanney but when it comes to the crunch, we are as one and all pull together.

We are most fortunate to live in the Hanneys, surrounded by people and organisations who strive to maintain the quality of live we all aspire to.

The unselfishness displayed by people who care about others was at polar opposites to the self-entitlement and 'me, me, me' attitudes, unfortunately, so often displayed in today's society.

I have not mentioned individuals who organised, nor the foot soldiers who gave their time for fear of missing someone out. However, most villagers know who they are and they may be rightly proud of their involvement and achievements in what could have developed into a serious situation


