

The spectre of Market Place Pedestrianisation has raised its head again. Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) is consulting on permanent traffic restrictions in the Market Place area of Wantage that could fundamentally change how customers access businesses throughout the town. While the initial focus is on the West End, these changes could set a precedent that affects the entire town centre. Changes to vehicle access could impact customer footfall across the town and changes to traffic flow may affect delivery access and business operations. This could be the first step in wider pedestrianisation plans with customers' shopping patterns and accessibility permanently altered. Don't expect them to listen to the residents though - it will be like the 20mph consultation where the Councillor minority view takes priority!

OCC) has commissioned a rail feasibility study into **Wantage and Grove Station**.

'SLC Rail' has been asked to put together the strategic outline business case for the project. It is expected to be published by the end of September 2025. https:// news.oxfordshire.gov.uk/wantage-andgrove-station/





THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



I wonder how many of you have watched the Great Pottery

Throwdown? My own experience of pottery was just one fairly disastrous session when I was a boy. But I do enjoy watching them wrestling with the clay, struggling to bring something beautiful out of quite a difficult material!

They not only form the clay – they also decorate it – so they are both sculptors and artists. And they work with intense love and devotion.

For those of us who believe, or are wondering whether to believe, in a divine Creator, a potter working with clay is an interesting analogy – and one used by several different writers in the Bible.

Of course it's far from being a literal picture. God doesn't have hands – and the universe is not made of clay.

It would actually take incredible intelligence to create a universe that actually functions. Modern physics shows us that the universe is an incredibly finely balanced mechanism, where if any one of the many "constants" – just one property of Physics - was just the tiniest bit different, the whole thing would either implode or fly apart.

And the study of biology indicates to us the Creator using the process of evolution to create the highly complex life forms that live on our planet.

And yet many of us believe that this Creator is far more than just a brilliant mathematician, or a biological genius. Somehow we see signs of a love and devotion that remind us of those potters labouring with their clay.

For those potters, sometimes things go very wrong, often with no fault of their own. Maybe a bowl collapses, or cracks appear, or a glaze comes out an unexpected colour. And they can't magic it away, but neither do they abandon it. Instead they work even harder to restore it and redeem it, perhaps changing the design to incorporate the problem into the overall pattern.

Our world seems badly cracked at present perhaps not surprising when the Creator has to work with the perversity of human beings! And it seems that like those potters, the Creator doesn't simply magic those cracks away. But neither does the Creator abandon it. Instead, like a devoted potter, the Creator continues to work with love and devotion to redeem and restore this beautiful but wounded world.

That's what I believe, and however bad things get, it gives me hope for the future. What about you? I wonder what you think?

Tackling anti-social behaviour this summer

Historically, we know that the summer months can sadly see an increase in crime and anti-social behaviour. School holidays, warmer weather, big sporting events, often leading to one or two more drinks than normal can all contribute!

So each year Thames Valley
Police put in place a plan to
deal with these challenges and keep us
all safe. July marks the start of a three
month operation to crack down on crime
and anti-social behaviour, with an emphasis on visible local policing.

This does not just involve the police working in isolation. We will also be working closely with our partners, including councils, schools, health services, business, transport and community organisations.

Policing, in collaboration with partners and local communities, will work to ensure preventative measures are being implemented to better achieve reductions in these crimes and focus on efforts to catch offenders.

Our local policing teams will also be organising days of action and operations to tackle issues such as illegal e-scooters, street crime, shoplifting, rural crime and other offences that affect communities most.

Many of these issues often affect our larger towns and cities, but they can have an impact on everyone. Whether it is residents from rural areas visiting their local



towns, the impact of rural crime, or simply the fear that anti-social behaviour can create.

The solution to some of these perennial problems is a strong community. One that does not tolerate disruptive behaviour, one that supports its young people and one where people are willing to take action. That may be as simple as reporting concerns.

If you see something that's not right in your community or witness a crime, please report it quickly so the police have the greatest chance to tackle the problem. In an emergency or if something is happening now, always call 999. To report something that has already happened call 101 or report online at that has already happened call 101 or report online at thames-valley.police.uk.

You can also use the police website to send a message to your local neighbourhood policing team and see who your dedicated local police officers are. Just pop in your postcode.





Open Letter to the Vale of White Horse District Council Planning Committee

Re: Surface Water Discharge from New Developments into Local Watercourses and Road Drainage Systems along the Letcombe and Childrey Brooks

Dear Members of the Planning Committee, We, the undersigned councils, flood groups, environmental organisations and concerned citizens, write to express our collective and growing concern regarding the continued approval of developments within the Vale of White Horse that permit surface water discharge into local watercourses and road drainage systems.

Evidence from Mott MacDonald, commissioned by the Environment Agency as long ago as 2007, confirmed that following any period of prolonged rainfall, even modest additional precipitation risks causing the Letcombe Brook to flood.

The pattern of rainfall in our area has changed significantly. We now experience more severe and frequent storms with data indicating that 26% occur within just five days of a preceding event. These evolving conditions were not anticipated in the design of current sustainable drainage systems (SuDS), rendering them increasingly unfit for purpose.

Catchment hydrological factors have further exacerbated the situation. Analysis of hydrological responses to rainfall onto the heavy clay soils of the northern facing slopes of the North Wessex Downs indicates a hydrological history at variance with that of a classical chalk aquifer with infiltration to the aquifer being outweighed by overland rainfall runoff into the valley's brooks.

In parallel, ongoing development across our communities — which have, in some cases, doubled in size since the year 2000

— has dramatically increased impermeable surfaces and introduced new discharges into already stressed watercourses.

The consequences are being felt on the ground. Communities along the Letcombe and Childrey Brooks and tributaries are experiencing repeated and severe flooding. With the Met Office forecasting a continued trend toward wetter conditions and more extreme storm events over the coming decades, this situation will only worsen unless decisive action is taken.

We therefore respectfully urge the Planning Committee to:

- 1. Place an immediate moratorium on approving developments that include surface water discharge into local watercourses or road drainage systems;
- 2. Require developers to implement alternative sustainable drainage solutions that do not increase flood risk downstream;

Commission and publish a comprehensive cumulative impact assessment of development on the hydrology of the Letcombe and Childrey Brook catchment areas.

We recognise the pressures of housing demand and development, but these must be balanced against the responsibility to protect existing communities, ecosystems, and infrastructure.

Continuing to approve developments under current drainage assumptions risks compounding a serious and avoidable threat to public safety and environmental integrity.

We would welcome the opportunity to discuss these concerns further and would be grateful for confirmation that this matter will be given the urgent consideration it warrants.
